Preamble, third paragraph: Delete text beginning with --- "Forest Development ---" on the second line through the word --- dependent" on the seventh line and insert --- "Forest Development roads within and near the National Forests and other lands adminis-tered by the Forest Service in locations and according to specifications which will permit maximum economy in harvesting timber from lands tributary to such roads and at the same time meet the requirements for protection, development, and manage-ment thereof, and for utilization of the other resources thereof."

All other provisions of the agreement referred to remain as stated.
