John Hollingsworth met with the court to answer some questions concerning insurance about the law suit against the county. He was asked to check on Error & Omissions Insurance and meet back with the court on March 22, 1982.

Motion by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison and seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith to appoint Arthur (Doc) Ellison as Election Judge for City of Bronsnn Local Option Election. Motion carried.

It was brought to the attention of the court that Evelyn Kelley Election Judge for Sexton, could not held the Election on April 3rd. Motion by Commissioner Jimmy Vickers and seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr. to appoint Mrs. D. B. Polley, Jr. as Election Judge for the Bingo Election on April 3, 1982. All voted in favor of the motion.

In the December 28th 1981 meeting of the Commissioner Court, it was agreed, at the option of the Sheriff's Office that the county pay for the cars and maintenance for sheriff's department. Judge Smith reported that Deputy Bill Horton had ordered a car and that Deputy Billy Don Sparks wanted the one he is now driving paid for.






Accounts were allowed and made payable.


There being not further business, the court adjourned.
