Raymond E., Jones and Joe E. Gilley appeared before the Court concerning the Fire Tower road, as it was listed on the Agenda. In In order for Mr. Jones to get a loan to build a house this road would need to be recognized as a County Road. Mr. Jones agreed to pay a surveyor to survey out the road going across Mr. Gilley's property to the government property line and Mr. Gilley agreed to give the right of way. Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy J. McGee to accept the Easement not to exceed 20 ft. commonly known as Gilley's Point, upon delivery to and being approved by County Attorney Earl Lord. If approved by Mr. Lord then it will be a County R oad.

Sherry Goenewain, Extension Homemaker appeared before the court. She told of her activities in the County a list of which is marked "Exhibit A" and attached to minutes of this date.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee to approve all authorized bills, Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester Cox, seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee that if County Attorney Earl Lord recommends it to go ahead and sign the release to relieve the state from any liability in regard to the improvement on Highway 21 in 1964 and 1965 wherein a guaranteed title was not obtained.

Motion by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison, seconded by Commissioner Chester Cox to give County Judge authority to ac check on the three Time Warrants due and make necessary arraangements to pay. Motion carried:

Motion by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison, seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee to appoint Commissioner R. E. Smith County Judge Pro Tem. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Eldridge Ellison to divide the R & B Special in the amount of \$3,739.92 percentage wise between the four Commissioner Precincts and also the Revenus Sharing in the amount of \$8,295.55 as follows: \$2,000.00 to each Commissioner Precinct and \$295.55 to the Administrative Fund. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester Cox, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith to let Donna Dupre' and Linda Brooks conintue working until all the back log of mail in the Tax Office is caught up with. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to transfer \$1,000.00 to each Commissioner Precinct from Right Of Way fund. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the Court adjourned.
