Commissioner McGee agreed to do what he could to improve them.

Mr. John Hollingsworth with Farmers Insurance Group appeared before the court. He went over the list of Equipment with each Commissioner and also the type of insurance for each piece of equipment, to get a new listing for his records.

Mr. Jim Nethery met with the court about Appraisal District Costs. The county's pro rata share will be 27% this year. Letter of explanation marked "Exhibit A" and attached to minutes of this date.

Mr. Isaac Hawkins met with the court. He spoke about the possibility of the county using the Yellowpine Work Center on completion of the new work center. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to authorize Judge Smith to sign the Application of Usage Permit of Yellowpine Work Center. Motion carried. This being the date that was designated and was advertised in the county paper for input of Revenue Sharing spendingthe Judge called for any request. There was no request in writing or orally.

R. W. Anders, Justice of the Peace, Pct. #2 requested \$10.00 fee for inquest according to Art. 1053. This needed to be checked into and court requested it be placed on Agenda for July 11th.

Kyle Walker, County Veteran Service Officer appeared and showed a report of the help given Veterans of this county. He was commended for his work.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to divide the R. & B. Tax in the amount of \$8,473.29 and R. & B. Special in the amount of \$6,836.49 percentage wise between the four commissioner precincts. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to appoint Mrs. John Morgan Jones to Sabine County Historical Commission. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr., seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee that Commissioner Precinct No. 4 issue a Time Warrant in the amount of \$6800.00 for a Motor Grader more fully described in Resolution marked "Exhibit C" and attached to minutes of this date.

Jack Goodson with Electronic Sales & Service Company, Inc. of Longview met with the court about the Telephone System for the new jail. The costs for three lines with five phones would be \$3,769.00. Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to get this company to install these phones. Motion carried. Exhibit D"

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to re-imburse Judge Smith for his expense to the County Judge and Commissioners Conference at Lufkin. Motion carried.

Dear Mr. Smith:

Enclosed is a copy of the Appraisal District proposed budget for 1984. There is a 4.4% increase in the budget over last year's and one reason is the \$2,000 added for mapping expenses. As you probably know, we use a 1944 map of the county which is out-dated.

Please note that the county's pro-rata share of, the appraisal district cost increased from 17% in 1983 to 27% in 1984. The cost for each taxing district is based on a formula using the total taxes collectible by all jurisdictions and getting the percentage that each jurisdiction collects of the total.

The operations of the appraisal district are running smoother this year than last year and we should have the tax statements out by October 1st.

We have not completed the re-appraisal of the Hemphill I.S.D. yet so many of the values will change for 1984 and 1985.

The industrial, utility and mineral values for 1983 are lower than the 1982 values, but the new Temple-Eastex plant in Pineland added over 6 million dollars to the county values.
