- Sabine County will furnish all required right of way clear of obstructions and free of cost to the State and acquisition procedures will be in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws governing the acquisition policies for acquiring real property.
- 2. Sabine County will provide for the adjustment of utilities, the construction of continuous curb and gutter, curb inlets, storm sewers, etc., all as may be necessary for a complete project with the exception of pavement and its support.

At such time as the County shall accept the provisions of this Order, the Engineer-Director is directed to proceed with the engineering development, Relocation Assistance at an estimated cost of \$400, and construction of the project in the most feasible and economical manner at an estimated cost of \$191,500, as authorized in the 1983-1984 Texas Farm to Market Road Program, and to assume the road for State maintenance upon completion of the construction.

This Order is subject to acceptance by the County and if not accepted within 90 days of the date hereof, the action herein contained shall be automatically cancelled.
