On this the 8th day of October, 1984, the Honorable Commissioners Court met in Regular Session with the following members present, to-wit:

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge. The monthly bills were examined and made ready for payment. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to approve payment. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr. to accept the Schedule B Project Agreement with Forest Service, concerning the Robert Earl Smith Road No. 12, beginning at FM 2928 and continuing southeast approximately 1.80 miles. Motion carried. Marked "Exhibit A" and attached to minutes of this date.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to divide the Ad Valorem tax money according to the following percentages: General County 37%, Jury 2%, R & B 15%, Officers Salary Fund 25%, retirement on Jail Bond 21%. Motion carried.

Lateral Road money was received in the amount of \$15,787.37. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr. to divide equally between the four commissioner precincts. Motion carried.

Money received from the Bureau of Land Management in the amount of \$10,971.00 was reported to the court. Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, to divide 5 ways equally between the four commissioners precincts and General County. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr., seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison that letters of notification be written to the ones who had bid on paving the Jail Property to inform them that the decision was postponed until funds were available to do the work. Motion carried.

In reviewing the financial report motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to transfer the remaining balances in each Revenue Sharing account for Commissioners Precincts to Road & Bridge accounts. Motion carried.

Reports from Treasurer, Clerk and Tax Assessor-Collector was examined. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith to accept these reports. Motion carried.

L. A. Brooks and James Reynolds appeared before the court concerning Townships in Milam. The property between the K. C. Cordray Store and Sexton Masonic Lodge had been in question. Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr., seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison that the property be measured between the buildings at the shortest distance and half go to each side. Motion carried.

Walter Diggles, Regional Planning of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments met with the court. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith that Mr. Diggles make a study of Self-evaluation and transition plan in regards to accessibility to county buildings owned or used to hold elections in and also in regard to employment of handicapped. Motion carried.



Mr. Diggles also brought Commissioners Court a report of Progress in formulating the Sabine County Planning Committee to proceed with the capacity grant awarded the county by the Texas Department of Community affairs.

There being no further business, the court adjourned.

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SCHEDULE B  
PROJECT AGREEMENT

Forest Development Road Cooperative Agreement  
Sabine County, Texas

Whereas, Sabine County, Texas, hereinafter called "Cooperator", and the Forest Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, hereinafter called "Forest Service", on the 27th day of September, 1976, entered into a Forest Development Road Cooperative Agreement, hereinafter called "Agreement", providing for cooperative planning, survey, design, construction, reconstruction, improvements, maintenance and use of certain Forest Development Roads in Sabine County, and

Whereas, said agreement provides for supplementing it by a project agreement when improvements of a road are to be financed in whole or in part from funds or resources provided by the party not having jurisdiction, and

Whereas, the parties thereto now agree that the road hereinafter described is such an improvement project,

1. Identification of Road

Road No. 12, R.E. Smith Road, as identified in the Forest Development Road Cooperative Agreement Schedule A. Beginning at FM 2928 and continuing southeast approximately 1.80 miles. (See attached vicinity map and Schedule A. Road is encircled in red.)

2. The Cooperator Agrees to:

Furnish all labor, equipment and materials necessary to prepare the above identified road to receive approximately 2841 tons of crushed aggregate. Construct two approach spurs at milepost 1.55 and 1.75 right, clean existing culverts, replace the damaged concrete pipe at milepost 1.15 with an 18"  $\emptyset$  x 26' cmp, reshape the road bed, wing and lead-off ditches and spread, shape and compact aggregate after it has been tailgate spread on the road and spurs by the Forest Service. To complete this project within 30 calendar days after notification by the Forest Service to begin the project.

3. The Forest Service Agrees to:

Provide all construction engineering necessary to complete the project. To purchase and furnish the Cooperator with an 18"  $\emptyset$  x 26' cmp and tailgate spread approximately 2841 tons of crushed aggregate. To have all merchantable timber removed where approach spurs are to be constructed. To provide the Cooperator with a copy of the drawings.


"Exhibit A"

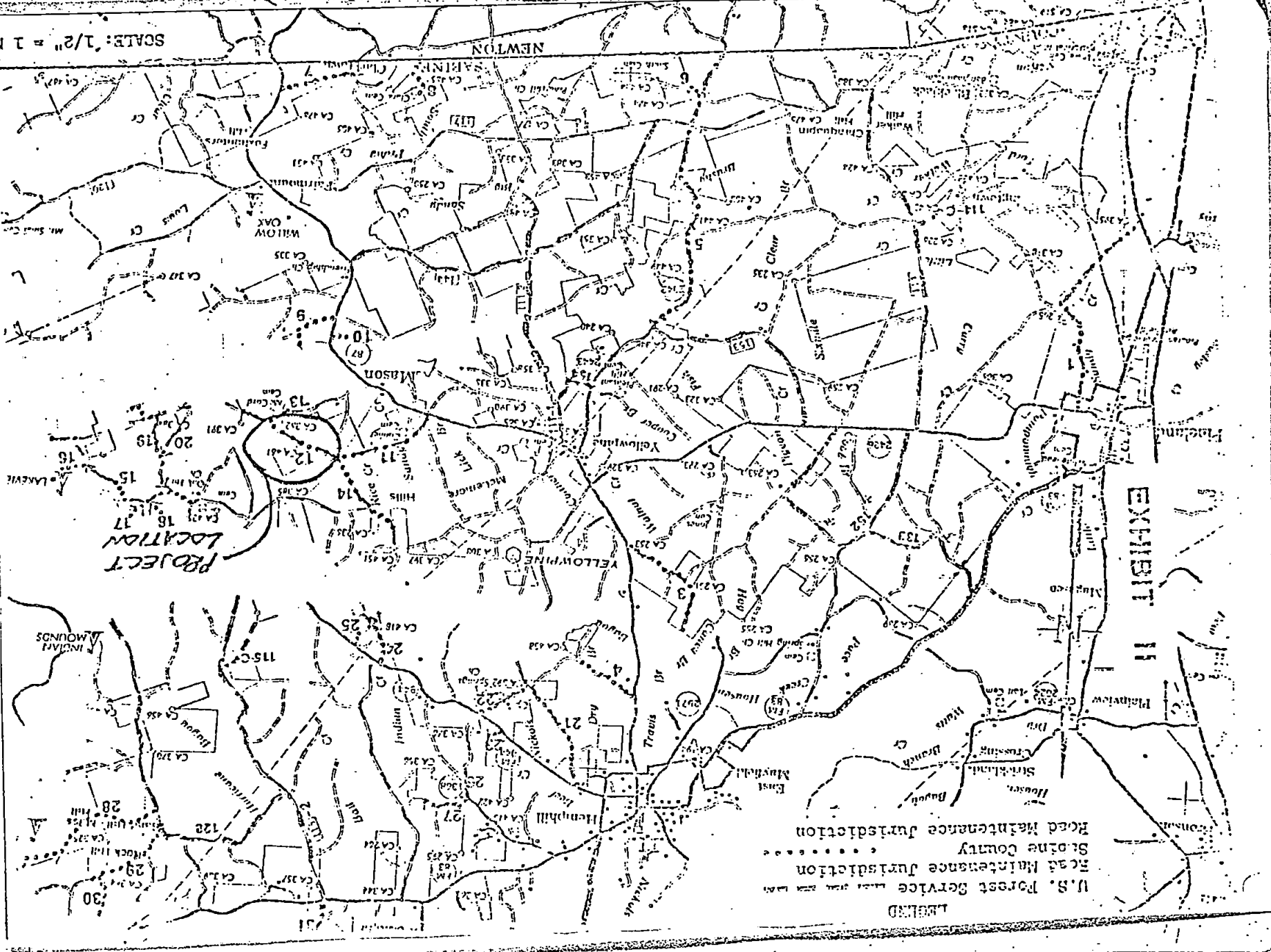
