The court reviewed the current bills and made them ready for payment. Motion by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to pay bills. Motion carried.

Glenda Hiers from Alexanders & Rogers auditing firm met with the court concerning the work that has been done during the audit on the Tax Office records in the closing out of Marie White's term and also the Grand Jury investigation.

Motion by Commissioners Billy Joe McGee, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith to pay the amount of \$5,021.50 which was for the special work done during the investigation. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr., seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to pay the amount of \$4,072.50 to Alexander & Rogers for work done in Tax Office during December 27-28 concerning close out at year end. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr. seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to hire Alexander & Rogers to audit for the Community Development Block Grant. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Chester D. Cox, Sr., seconded by Commissioner Billy Joe McGee to hire Alexander & Rogers, Public Accountants to audit for the Planning Grant. Motion carried.

Walter Diggles met with the court and gave a report concerning the need for grants and the priorities of places most in need.

A committee made up of Sabine County citizens known as the Citizen Advisory Council rode the ~~of~~ <sup>areas</sup> of Sabine County searching the needs and the Council of Governments listened to these needs and prepared the Map of target areas of which the report was given to the court.

There being no further business, the court adjourned.
