Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith, with Brother Clarence Howell leading the opening prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Ellison, to approve the minutes. All voted in favor.

Monthly bills were inspected for payment. Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by commissioner McGee, to approve payment of bills. Motion carried.

Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison, to approve monthly reports from the County Clerk, District Clerk, J. P. Offices, Tax Collector, and County Treasurer. All voted for.

Commissioner Cox presented a written request from Mrs. J. H. Wells asking the County to accept the roads in Wells' Shady Forest Subdivision as County roads. Motion was made by Commissioner Cox, seconded by Commissioner Ellison, to accept these roads. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Ellison, to divide interest money earned on U. S. Forest money. The interest was earned while the money was in the State Treasury. Motion carried. See attached exhibit.

Tax Collector, Diane Husband, met with the Court requesting a computer System for the Tax Office. Although the computer has been budgeted the past three years, she had not found a system suitable for our county. With this new computer, her office could cut loose from the Secretary of States' on-line system. This new system would handle current and delinquent taxes and voters' registration. After three years the system would belong to the county; then we would only pay for maintenance. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to advertise for bids which will be opened at our next meeting March 28, at 9:00 A. M. Motion carried. Exhibit attached, showing bid specifications.

Also Mrs. Husband informed the Court she had hired Tracy Henson as temporary help in her office.

Election affidavits were also discussed, and Mrs. Husband informed the Court that anyone not on the voters list, and does not have a white card, is not registered to vote. If they insist on casting their vote, they can vote with a callenge affidavit, but they will be prosecuted.

There are 5,662 registered voters in Sabine County. Prct. # 1 has 1753 voters, # 2 has 1764, # 3 - 967, and # 4 has 1178 voters.

County Clerk, Nadine Gary, asked the Court for permission to transfer \$3,000.00 from one line item to another in her budget to pay part time help in her office. Although this can be done, and the money is in the budget, she was allowed to transfer only \$600.00. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to transfer \$600.00 from Business Records to Part Time Help. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner McGee, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to advertise for bids for gasoline, oil and diesel fuel for County owned equipment. Bids to be opened March 28, 1988, at 9:00 A. M. Motion carried.

Commissioner McGee also told Mrs. Gary her girls could work overtime when necessary to keep up with their work.

Judge Smith informed the Court the County Treasurer has received the first check from State Comptroller for County sales tax. This check was for \$5,496.58.

Clarice Clark met with the Court representing the Sheriff's department, concerning the purchase of a new teletype for the department. This purchase must be made within a year due to the state's changing from the old system now used by the Sheriff's department. After some discussion, the Court agreed to advertise for bids on the purchase or lease of this equipment for the Sheriff's department. Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to advertise for bids, which will be opened March 28, 1988. All voted in favor.

There being no further business, Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, that meeting adjourn. Motion Carried.
