Monday, July 11, 1988, the Honorable Commissioners' Court met in regular session at 8:30 A. M. with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce C. Smith, with Brother Clarence Howell leading the opening prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting were read by County Clerk, Nadine Gary. Motion was made by Commissioner Cox, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to approve minutes. All voted for.

Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Ellison, to approve payment of accounts and salaries. Motion carried.

Monthly reports were inspected. Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to approve reports. Motion carried.

A County policy for sickleave, vacation, and termination was presented for the Court's approval. After some discussion, it was decided some items will be deleted, and another item added. The item to be added is "The Commissioners Court reserves the right to amend or change any of the policies - sickleave, vacation, and termination - after proper posting as an agenda item at a regular Commissioners Court meeting or a properly called meeting." Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, that after these corrections are made, the policy will be re-typed to be approved at our next meeting. Motion carried.

Judge Smith informed the Court Janie Winslow had resigned her job in the County Tax office. Mrs. Husband had recommended Shonda Retherford to replace her. Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, they approve her recommendation. Motion carried.

Mrs. Mary Williams met with the Court concerning a short road across Temple land which goes to an old house on her property. Even tho this road was built by the County, and is County maintained, it has not been accepted by the County, but is a public right of way. This road is near Pineland in Prct. 2, and Commissioner McGee said he is not sure of the legality of accepting the road at this time, but will keep the road open so they will have access to their property.

Ted Dumas with Western Louisiana Video, met with the Court concerning Cable T. V. in Hemphill. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to grant a franchise to Western Louisiana Video as presented today, pursuant to review agreement of legal council of the County Attorney and legal council of Western Louisiana Video. Motion carried.

Attorney James Allen Payne addressed the Court representing Johnson and Swanson, a Dallas firm, which is representing a Kirbyville organization which is attempting to have bonds issued for the purchase of a nursing home in Pineland. Attorney Payne stated there will be no financial obligation by the County, only that the City, County, and Hospital District involved must approve this before the bonds can be issued. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, that the Court grant permission to Kirbyville Health Facilities Development Corporation upon legal council by County Attorney after his inspection of the project. All voted for. This must be approved on or before July 19. "Exhibit attached."

Florence Rhodes with Tri County Community Action explained work this group did in Sabine County this past year. She also discussed the USDA Commodity distribution in Sabine County.

Precinct Judges for the General Election in November were approved.

Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Ellison, to approve list presented. Motion carried. See attached list. Payment rate will be approved at our next meeting.

Texas Highway Department signs to be posted on off-system bridges have been received, and each Commissioner stated his has been installed. Commissioner Billy McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith, to authorize County Judge Royce Smith to write a letter to the Texas Highway Department that all signs have been installed. Motion carried.

Judge Smith informed the Court there will be a Texas Highway Department state wide meeting in Austin Wednesday to discuss the program for next year. Judge Smith and all Commissioners except Commissioner Ellison plan to attend.

There being no further business, Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Smith, that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.


