

Monday, September 12, 1988, the Honorable Commissioners' Court met in regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith, with Brother Clarence Howell leading the opening prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. This motion was made by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee, to approve minutes. All voted for.

After the inspection of monthly bills, Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to approve payment. Motion carried.

Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, to approve monthly reports. Motion carried. Reports presented were from: J. P. # 1, 3, 4, and 5. Also County Clerk and District Clerk.

Bill Vermeulen from Brookeland, was in attendance concerning the closing of a road leading to his property in Prct. 2. Although this is a County Road, a fence has been put across it. Commissioner McGee stated the Commissioners Court has voted to have the road re-opened, and action will be taken to do this.

Sharon Farringer, Virginia Whiteman, and Julie Goodall were on the agenda concerning roads in Prct. 2, but were not present.

Geneva Hignite and residents of Sam Rayburn Estates were in attendance concerning their roads in Prct. 2. This group presented information they are preparing in the attempt to get the County Line Road accepted as a Farm to Market Road.


Judge Smith explained Proposition 1, which is the "Good Roads Amendment" to be voted on in November. He asked the Court to vote "For" on this amendment.

The division of Tax, County Sales Tax, and Commissioner's monies was discussed, but since Commissioner Ellison was not present, Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to table this division until our next meeting, September 26th. Motion carried.



Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to make the final payment of \$1,118.89 on the cost of the bridge replacement project at Six Mile Creek in Prct. 2. The payment will be made to State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, and will be paid out of the Right of Way fund. All voted for.

Commissioner Smith made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
