Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith. Brother Clarence Howell led the opening prayer.

After the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting, Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to approve minutes. Motion carried. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to approve the minutes of special meeting March 29. Motion carried. Commissioner Cox then made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to approve the minutes for the special meeting for April 3rd. Motion carried.

Listed bills were inspected, and made ready for for payment. Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to approve payment. Motion carried.

Monthly reports of the fees collected in March were inspected. Besides the regular monthly reports, the interest collected from First State Bank was reported as follows: Tax Assessor/Collector - \$481.05, County Clerk - \$140.56, District Clerk - \$78.26, and County treasurer - \$4,309.51, making a total of \$5009.38 earned during March. Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, to approve reports. Motion carried.

Commississioner McGee then made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, to advertise for bids for a building over the radio base station on Highway 87 north of Red Hill Lake Road. Bids will be opened at our regular meeting April 24. Motion carried.

Emergency 9-1-1 was again discussed. The Commissioners then voted to adopt a resolution approving the study and support of the 9-1-1 emergency telephone system. Commissioner Cox made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to pass this resolution, but definite rates will be set at a later date. Motion carried.

Deep East Texas M/H/m/R officers met with the Court explaining their duties and services available to Sabine County citizens. Those present were Jim McDermott, executive director, Sandy Skelton, alcohol and drug abuse, Susan Rushing, mental retardation, and Nancy Fuller and Allen Sturrock, board of trustee members.

Court recessed 15 minutes, and re-convened at 9:50 A. M.

Commissioner Billy McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner James Conn, that each office transfer interest money earned from First State Bank to County Treasurer to keep in an interest account. Motion carried.

Open bids for exterminator for termite control will again be an agenda item April 24, along with State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

Motion was made by Commissioner James Conn, seconded by Commissioner Chester Cox, to approve a line item transfer of \$1,575.00 from Maintenance fund to the land fill fund in Precinct 3. All voted for.

Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, to give Judge Smith authority to sign Implementation of HB 1875 in exploring the posssibility of the Sabine River Authority providing services by contracting with the county to oversee the inspection and installation of septic systems. They will hear their proposal at a later date.

Adoption of County private sewage facility orders will be an agenda item April 24th. Commissioner Cox, Commissioner Conn, and Commissioner McDaniel agreed to check with San Jacinto County concerning their sanitary land fills.

Motion was made by Commissioner McGee, seconded by Commissioner McDaniel,
