Judge Smith signed a proclamation presented by Mothers Against Drunk Drivers designating September 2, 1989 to be "Drive for Life Day", and urged all citizens to drive sober as they join the National Campaign to prevent drunk driving fatilities.

Commissioner McGee made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, to pay accounts and salaries. Motion carried.

After some discussion on the Tax rate, Commissioner McDaniel made the motion to set the rate at .26¢. Commissioner McGee seconded the motion, and all voted for. "See attached Resolution."

Mrs. Whitehead was in attendence asking that the road leading to her house be accepted as a county maintained road. Commissioner McGee made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, that this road, known as the Dallas Whitehead Road be extended approximately one mile, and be accepted as a county road. Motion carried.

Questions were asked concerning the chances of the road in El Camino becoming a Farm to Market Road. Commissioner McDaniel answered he has not had an answer from the State, and it has the final say.

In the selection of an engineering firm for 1988 Texas community Development Program Grant, there were two proposals submitted. They were from Everett Griffith, Jr.& Associates and Goodwin - Laster, Inc.

After a 10 minute recess, Commissioner McDaniel made a motion, which was seconded by Commissioner McGee, to accept Everett Griffith & Associates' proposal for Engineering Services on Dayton Godwin Road. Motion carried. This road is located in Prct. 1.

Only one bid each was submitted for the pruchase of two dump trucks, one for prct. 1, and one for prct. 3. They were from David Cook Trucks and Equipment in Florien, Louisiana. These bids were \$39,250.00 each for 1985 Mack dumps. Commissioner McDaniel made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to accept these bids, and to make time warrants for 1 year for these amounts. All voted for. Mr. Cook said he can deliver by September 15.

Judge Smith presented the Court with a resolution stating the Commissioners Court of Sabine County and the District Clerk and County Clerk of Sabine County agrees to permit the First Judicial District Probation Department to collect fines, court costs, restitution and attorneys' fees on behalf of the County of

Sabine. Motion was made by Commissioner McGee and seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, to approve this resolution. Motion carried.

Commissioner McDaniel made the motion that the County's Grant Contract be amended to remove local cash funds for the Engineering and Administration Categories and be replaced by T D O C Contract funds. Commissioner McGee sec. the motion, and motion carried.

Commissioner McGee made a motion seconded by Commissioner Conn to advertise for bids for an independent County Audit for 1987-1988. Bids will be opened 9:00 A. M. September 11. Motion carried.

Commissioner McGee also made a motion to advertise for bids for air conditioning improvement for the county Judge's office. Commissioner McDaniel seconded the motion, and all voted for. These bids will also be opened Sept. 11.

On-site sewage facility was again discussed. Commissioner McDaniel made the motion, seconded by Commissioner McGee, to table this until our next meeting. Motion carried.

The fee due to N-Group Securities, Inc., any other fees as may be mutually agreed and all expenses for which N-Group Securities, Inc. is entitled to reimbursement, shall become due and payable concurrently with the delivery of the Debt Instruments to the purchaser. To The Honorable Judge of Said Court:

As requested by Commissioner Conn, I have reviewed the proposed contract with N-Group Securities, Inc. and have made a preliminary review of future obligations Sabine County would be undertaking. Because of the short time constraints imposed by the Court's schedule, proper consideration of a proposal of this type is not possible.

I have obtained from N-Group a draft of an OFFERING STATEMENT that will be used in connection with the issuance of bonds for a similar facility in La Salle County, Texas. N-Group has explained that this statement is representative of what is proposed in this contract. A review of the statement indicates that obligations undertaken by the County in this project are quite extensive and complicated, and should be undertaken only after thorough review of the various contracts the County would have to enter into and the additional staff and procedures the County would have to provide to perform under those contracts.

It is unclear from the wording of the contract exactly what is intended. If this contract is only to be an expression of the interest of the County to further explore the possibilities of such a project in this County, then the wording should be changed to clearly state this. It is also advisable that any costs to the County under Paragraph 6 (which incidentally, obviously omits one or more type) be better defined.

However, if this contract is a commitment by our County to "the design construction, certification, financing and management" of a 500 bed prison in Sabine County, then executing this contract without proper documentation, research and analysis of what obligations we assume, as illustrated in N-Group OFFERING STATEMENT, is neither responsible nor prudent. Furthermore, the Court cannot enter into such a project without the prior consent of the Sabine County Sheriff.

Should you desire, I will speak with Mr. Brent Bailey, N-Group's attorney, concerning re-wording the contract to more accurately reflect your intent. I understand N-Group will consider minor revisions to this proposed agreement. I will await to hear from the Court before proceeding further. In the meantime, if you have any questions, please advise.

If the Commissioner who sponsored the adoption of this contract has any documentation or other facts concerning the project at all, I will be pleased to review them.

BY MOTION OFFERED BY COMMISSIONER And and seconded by COMMISSIONER And the following ordinance was unanimously adopted:

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING ILLINI CABLEVISION, INC., 595 SAN ANTONIO AVE, MANY, LOUISIANA, A NON-EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO USE AND OCCUPY THE STREETS, ALLEYS, HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES, AVENUES, LANES, ROADS, PUBLIC GROUNDS AND OTHER WAYS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE COUNTY OF SABINE, STATE OF TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ERECTING, CONSTRUCTING, OWNING, LEASING OR OTHERWISE ACQUIRING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING TELEVISION LINES, EITHER ON POLES OWNED OR LEASED FROM EXISTING PUBLIC UTILITIES WITH THEIR CONSENT OR ON POLES TO BE ERECTED OR THROUGH CABLES TO BE LAID UNDER GROUND, FOR RECEIVING AND DISTRIBUTING TELEVISION IMPULSES OR SIGNALS TO HOMES, COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS AND ALL OTHER CONSUMERS FOR A PERIOD OF FIFTEEN (15) YEARS FROM AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREIN, WITH AN OPTION TO RENEWAL FOR FIFTEEN (15) YEARS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the commissioners and county of SABINE, SABINE COUNTY state of TEXAS:

SECTION 1.

The County of Sabine, hereinafter referred to as the County, hereby grants to ILLINI CABLEVISION, INC., hereinafter called the Grantee, and to his successor and assigns, the right and authority to install, maintain and operate a transmitting and distribution system for television, radio and other audio-visual electrical signal distribution in, over, on and under the streets, alleys and public highways of the County, and to erect poles, with or without cross arms, and to stretch wires and cables on, across and under all streets; maintain and use the same for the purpose of constructing and operating a transmitting distribution system for television, radio and other audio-visual signal distribution.

SECTION 2.

All poles, cables, wires, antennas, conduits or appurtenances shall be constructed and erected in a workmanlike manner. The County shall not be held liable for any disturbance of grantee's installation resulting from the altering, repairing or installation of streets or sewer or water installations. Grantee shall, at its own expense, move or relocate any of grantee's installations, at the request of the County, whenever or wherever grantee's installations are found by the County to interfere with the County's streets, street grade, sewer or water installations, or any proposed changes thereof, or extensions thereto.

SECTION 3.

All the construction of the grantee, including installation, shall conform to the National Electric Safety Code, the statutes of the State of Texas, all ordinances of the County.

SECTION 4.

Grantee shall lay all cables, wires and lines both on the public and private properties of the County at its own expense, but grantee shall have the privilege of charging its customers both a connection fee to bring the service to their properties and a monthly fee for their continued use of the

SECTION 5.

The Grantee shall indemnify and save the County harmless from any and all liability, damage or expense from accident or damage, either to itself or to persons or property of others, which may occur by reason of grantee's activities in the cable television business. For this purpose and prior to commencing construction of any kind, the grantee shall have in full force and effect and thereafter so maintain the same at all times, and file evidence thereof with the County Clerk, a good and sufficient policy of insurance with liability limits of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000) Dollars for property damage. One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars for personal injury to each person, and Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) Dollars for each accident. The said policy shall protect the County from and against any and all claims, actions, suits, liability, expense or damage of any kind or description which may accrue to or be suffered by the County or by anyone by reason of the construction, maintenance or operation of grantee's facilities.

SECTION 6.

Grantee shall pay the County two (2) per cent of the basic subscriber revenue received by grantee for cable television service provided to subscribers within the limits of the County, excluding Municipalities. Said payments shall be made quarterly; on or before the first day of the first, fourth, seventh and tenth months of each year. This tax shall be credited against any business and occupation tax or franchise tax or other County tax required to be paid by grantee. The legislative body of the County shall have the right to inspect the records of grantee at any reasonable time for the purpose of ascertaining accurately what the actual gross receipts of grantee may have been for cable television service for past years and/or for the present year. years and/or for the present year.

SECTION 7.

The grantee agrees to maintain a maintenance service which shall be promptly available to subscribers upon telephone request.

SECTION 8.

The County reserves the general right to see that the system of the grantee is constructed and maintained in a safe condition. If the County at any time finds that an unsafe condition does exist, it may order the grantee to make necessary repairs forthwith, and if the grantee shall fail to forthwith make the necessary repairs, the County may make them or have them made, and collect all cost and expense thereof from grantee.

SECTION 9.

The rights and privileges of the permit shall continue for a period of fifteen (15) years from the effective date of this franchise. Grantee shall have the option to request renewal of this franchise for an additional period not to exceed fifteen (15) years. Should grantee desire to exercise this option, it shall so notify the County in writing, not less than three (3) months prior to expiration of this franchise. Upon exercise of this option by grantee, the County shall conduct a full, open, and public renewal proceeding upon prior notice and opportunity of all interested parties to be heard. Futhermore if the County denies renewal, grantee shall be afforded a period of six (6) months following denial within which to sell, transfer, or convey this cable television system to a qualified purchaser at fair market value.

SECTION 10.

That wherever in this ordinance Illini Cablevision, Inc. or grantee is named or referred to, it shall be deemed to include his successors, transferees, representatives and assigns, and all rights, privileges and obligations herein conferred and imposed shall bind and insure to the benefit of such successors, transferees, representatives and assigns and the said Illini Cablevision, Inc. is herewith given authority to transfer this franchise or its respective rights thereto.

SECTION 11

If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or illegal, the invalidity or illegality thereof shall not affect the validity or legality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.
