Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith, with Brother Clarence Howell leading the opening prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Commissioner Chester Cox made the motion; Commissioner Jimmy Conn seconded, and motion carried.

County bills were inspected for payment. Commissioner McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, to approve payment of accounts and salaries. Motion carried.

Mr. Lee Martin, with G M Water Corporation, met with the Court concerning the laying of water lines on County Road to Youpon Ridge in Precinct 2. Commissioner Billy McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Carlin McDaniel, to approve the laying of G M Water lines to this subdivision. Motion carried.

Rhonda Williams from the County Tax office presented the Court with a resolution she asked them to approve. The 71st Texas Legislature in its regular session, enacted a proposed constitutional amendment that was submitted to the voters, and approved on November 7, 1989, for the purpose of exempting certain tangible personal property from ad valorem taxation. "See attached exhibit." Commissioner McDaniel made the motion that we adopt this resolution. Commissioner Cox seconded the motion, and all voted for.

Mrs. Williams also asked if the County would give turkeys to County employees again this Christmas. Commissioner Cox made a motion, which was seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, to give County employees a \$10.00 gift certificate to be used at Brookeshires in Hemphill or Big Chief in Pineland. This will go toward the purchase of a turkey or ham. Motion carried.

The Sheriff department was on the agenda, but reported they were not ready, and asked to be on the agenda for our next meeting, December 11th.

Widening of right of way on Springhill Road was discussed. Commissioner McDaniel explained this section of road is on his property, and he is giving (4) four feet on one side of the road to County Right of way to widen road. He wanted this shown as a matter of record, since he used County equipment to do the work. Commissioner Cox and Commissioner Conn said this really helped the road.

Jim McDermett and Susan Rushing, with M H M R, presented a 15 year plaque to the Commissioners Court. They explained to the Court how some of their work is done.

W. C. "Sparkey" Sparks, with the Probation Department, presented a Cooperative Agreement for Community Service Work Program between the Community Service Program of the First Judicial District Probation Department and Sabine County Commissioners' Court. After some discussion, Commissioner Billy McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Chester Cox, to approve this resolution. Motion carried. See attached exhibit.

Judge Smith explained the septic tank law which was passed. Sabine County passed a resolution for the Water Quality Board June 26, 1989. Judge Smith said after talking with someone in Tyler, he was told the Texas Department of Health has taken over the responsibility, so we will need a new resolution. Also anyone interested will need to go to school by March 1, 1990. No action was taken on this.

Commissioner McGee made a motion meeting adjourn. Commissioner Cox seconded the motion, and motion carried.

The Community Service Program of the First Judicial District Probation Department hereby enters into a cooperative agreement with

SABINE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT

The objective held in common by both parties to this agreement is to provide community services to the citizens of the First Judicial District, and to carry out the requirements of the Courts of Jasper, Newton, Sabine, and San Augustine Countles, that specify that probationers participate in community service work in their community without compensation.

AREAS OF COOPERATION

THE PROBATION DEPARTMENT

The probation department assumes the responsibilty of screening probationers for appropriate placement within a Community Service Work Organization. It also assumes the duty of referring probationers who possess the skills and abilities most beneficial to the Community Service Organization.

The probation department agrees to monitor a probationer's performance on a regular basis. It further agrees to be available for consultation and/or problem solving between the Community Service Organization, and the probationer, upon request.

The probation department agrees to supply the Community Service Organization with all appropriate forms needed for documentation.

The probation department agrees to act as the liason between all Courts and the Community Service Organization.

THE COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATION

The Community Service Organization should be a non-profit organization or governmental entity who services are provided to the general public and are designed to enhance social welfare, physical or mental stability, environmental quality, or general well being of the community.

The Community Service Organization agrees to provide work assignment that are reasonable, and that will benefit the general community or a specific part of the community.

The Community Service Organization agrees to provide supervision of the probationers assigned to the organization giving adequate direction for work assignments and accountability of worker job performance.

The Community Service Organization agrees to provide all equipment or supplies necessary for a probationer to finish the work assignment. Also the organization agrees to allow for water breaks and lunch breaks in accordance with good labor practices.

The Community Service Organization agrees to report any problems with a probationer to the Community Service Coordinator.

THE PROBATIONER

The probationer will be expected to be on time and to perform all assigned jobs. The probationer must dress properly and obey all rules and regulations of the organization. If a probationer is unable to report for work he/she must contact the supervisor of the job. The probationer must keep an ongoing record of the work hours, checking it against the organizations time sheet.

The probationer understands that there in no compensation, or customery benefits of employment while participating in the Community Service Program, although a probationer should assume that while performing a job he/she is an employee of the organization.

CLARIFICATION OF LIABILITY

The First Judicial District Probation Department carries medical insurance coverage up to \$25,000.00. The probationer will sign a waiver of liability releasing the probation department, and the community service organization, from legal or medical claims arising from community service performed. The insurance policy is available for review.

TERMINATION

This agreement will become effective on the date executed, and may be terminated on a thirty day written notice. This agreement may be modified with the mutual consent of both parties.

RESOLUTION BY COMMISSIONER'S COURT NOVEMBER 27, 1989

WHEREAS, the 71st Texas Legislature in its regular session, enacted a proposed constitutional amendment that was submitted to the voters and approved on November 7, 1989, for the purpose of exempting certain tangible personal property from ad valorem taxation; and,

WHEREAS, the exempt personal property unless otherwise taxed on a local option basis, is defined in the amendment and includes, but is not limited to, goods, wares, ores, and merchandise, other than oil, gas, and othe rpetroleum products, acquired in or imported into this State for assembling, storing, manufacturing, processing, or fabricating purposes and transported outside of the State within 175 days; and,

WHEREAS, said constitutional amendment, as adopted by the voters, requires that offical actions by counties, common or independent school districts, junior college districts, and municipalities, including home-rule cities, must be taken within certain time periods in order to tax this otherwise exempt personal property; and,

WHEREAS, any official action to tax such otherwise exempt property in the future must be taken before April 1, 1990, and must be taken before January 1, 1990, in order to tax such property for Tax Year 1990; now,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the SABINE COUNTY TAX OFFICE shall tax all tangible personal property as defined in said proposed amendment adding Section 1-j to Article VIII of the Texas Constitution and in Section 11.251, Texas Tax Code, in Tax Year 1990 and each year thereafter.

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RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING AND SUPPORTING THE PRINCIPLE OF FAIR AND OPEN HOUSING AS SET FORTH IN TITLE VIII OF

THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1968

WHEREAS, adequate housing is a necessary ingredient to the maintenance of the standard of living in this country; and

WHEREAS, it is important that every human being have access to adequate housing of his choice; and

WHEREAS, it is beneficial to the social and economic welfare of the entire country that every person have access to adequate housing; and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioner's Court recognizes the problems facing the citizens of SABINE COUNTY in obtaining access to adequate housing; and

WHEREAS, the law of the land is that no citizen can be denied access to housing of his choice because of race, color, religion, or national origin; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S OF SABINE COUNTY

THAT this County Commissioner's Court endorse and support the principle of fair and open housing; as set forth in Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, and the right of every person to have access to adequate housing of his own choice without regard to race, color, religion, or national origin; and

THAT this County Commissioner's Court encourages all citizens to respect and support the law of the land in regard to the right of every person to have access to adequate housing of his own choice; and

THAT this County Commissioner's Court encourages all citizens to undertake voluntary actions to foster racial harmony, including individual and group decisions to promote fair and open housing individual commitment to avoid discrimination in all sale, all rental of property; and

THAT the County Commissioner's Court will cooperate with the LHA, LPA and nonprofit and limited dividend developers to provide low and moderate income housing within the County, and such development will have the full cooperation of the County Administration in determining locations and sites that meet HUD Criteria to the end that such housing will not be limited to any given area of the County and will be available to all citizens without regard to race, creed, color, religion or national origin.

THAT the County will assist in promoting an affirmative action and advertising programs so that all housing will be made available to all citizens. Any board or group dealing with housing and appointed or licensed by the County will be directed to carry out the provisions of the Fair Housing Act of 1968.

THAT the County will inform the LHA, Realtors and other agencies, and to the greatest extent possible mortgage lenders and general public of the existence and implications of its adopted open housing resolution.

THAT the County develop policies that will help make a selection of land and/or sites available so that housing costs will remain at a reasonable level, particularly for low and moderate income families.

THAT the County will encourage local newspapers and owners of housing to comply with HUD Advertising Guidelines.

THAT the County will maintain cooperation with fair housing groups, human relations bodies and other social, civic and religious groups interested in facilitating open communities.

THAT the County will assist in the development of educational programs on equal housing opportunity, informing the real estate industry of their responsibilities under Federal law, encouraging minority citizens to exercise their rights under law, providing general human relations education and stating the Judge's commitment to fostering fair housing and defending the civil rights of all citizens.
