

Monday, February 12, 1990, the Honorable Commissioners Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith, with Brother Clarence Howell leading the opening prayer.

After the reading of the minutes of the last meeting, Commissioner Billy McGee made the motion to approve minutes. Commissioner Chester Cox seconded, and motion carried.

Written reports were presented for approval. Commissioner Cox made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to approve reports. See attached exhibit. Motion carried.

Vollie Grace and Pastor Kemper, residents of the County, met with the Court with a request for the City of Hemphill and Sabine County to bring its election system in compliance with the United States Constitution and the 1965 Voting Rights Acts by establishing single-member districts consistent with the ethnic composition of the City or County. "See attached exhibit."

They were also requesting redistricting with a precinct of minority majority so they may have better representation in County government. The Commissioners answered that none of them had been through redistricting so they did not know how this can be done, but will see what they can find out. Certificates of completion for Career Track Seminars for Tax Collector, Diane Husband and Deputy Rhonda Williams were presented for approval. Also J. P. Thomas Hamilton presented his certificate from Texas Justice Court Training Center. Commissioner Billy McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Carlin McDaniel, to approve these certificates as a matter of record. Motion carried.


J. C. Click's name had been drawn for the Grievance Committee, but is unable to serve. Merlee Haywood's name was drawn to serve in his place. Commissioner McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, to accept this name. Motion carried. She will be notified of this in writing by the County Clerk.



The Quarterly report was presented for approval. Commissioner McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, to approve report. Motion carried.


Ricky Chumley, a resident of Precinct 3, met with the Court concerning his roads. Commissioner Conn said he would talk with him after the meeting.


Commissioner McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Conn, that meeting adjourn. All voted for.



SUBCHAPTER C. BRIDGES

Powers of the commissioners court

Sec. 2.201. The commissioners courts have authority to cause all necessary bridges to be built and kept in repair in their respective counties and to make necessary appropriations of money of the counties for that purpose.

Toll bridges

Sec. 2.202. (a) If it is inexpedient for the road force to build bridges over large creeks or watercourses, the commissioners court may contract with a proper person to build a toll bridge. The court shall determine the toll to be levied on all persons, cattle, horses, vehicles, and the like passing over the bridge. The tolls may be granted to the contractor for a number of years, not to exceed 10 years, that the court considers proper. The builder and his successors shall keep the bridge in constant repair during the term of the contract. A builder or successor who defaults on this duty forfeits all right and claim to the tolls.

(b) Before granting a license to any person to build a toll bridge, the commissioners court shall take bond in the sum of \$1,000, with good and sufficient sureties, conditioned that the contractor shall build the bridge and keep it in constant repair for the term of years agreed on. If any person sustains damages in consequence of the owner or keeper of any toll bridge not having complied with the conditions of his bond, the person may bring an action of debt on the bond against the owner or keeper of the toll bridge and recover judgment for the damages so sustained. The suit must be brought in the county in which the license was granted.

(c) If county bonds are issued to build bridges, the commissioners court may assess and collect tolls on the bridges sufficient to pay the interest on the bonds and, if thought proper, sufficient to pay the interest and create a sinking fund with which to pay the principal at maturity, all of which shall be done under rules that the court prescribes.

Boundary bridge

Sec. 2.203. If any stream constitutes in whole or in part the boundary line between two or more counties or if two or more counties are jointly interested in the construction of a bridge, whether over a stream or elsewhere, the counties may jointly erect bridges on equitable terms that the commissioners court of each county may agree on.

(2) The commissioners court shall hold a public hearing before issuing any traffic regulation under this Act. The court shall give advance notice of the proposed regulation by publishing notice of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. The notice must be published not later than the seventh day or earlier than the 30th day before the day of the hearing.

(b)(1) The commissioners court may determine and fix the maximum, reasonable, and prudent speed at any road or highway intersection, railroad grade crossing, curve, or hill or on any other part of a county road slower than the maximum fixed by law for public highways. The court shall take into consideration the width and condition of the surface of the road and other circumstances on the affected portion of the road as well as the usual traffic on the road. If the commissioners court of any county determines and fixes the maximum rate of speed at any point on any county road at a slower rate than the maximum fixed by law for public highways and declares the maximum, reasonable, and prudent speed limit by proper order of the court entered on its minutes, the limit becomes effective and operative at that point on the road when appropriate signs giving notice of the speed limit are erected under order of the court for that portion of the road.

(2) The commissioners court may establish load limits for any road or bridge and may authorize the county traffic officer, if one or more officers have been appointed, or any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable, or deputy constable to weigh vehicles for the purpose of ascertaining whether a vehicle is loaded in excess of the prescribed limit.

(c) The commissioners court may adopt regulations consistent with this section for establishment of a system of traffic control devices within restricted traffic zones established on county roads and on any other property owned by the county and located in its jurisdiction. The system shall conform to the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation manual and specifications. The court may under an order entered on its minutes place, erect, install, and maintain within traffic zones on county roads and on any other property owned by it traffic signal lights, stop signs, and no parking signs as it considers necessary for public safety.

(d) The commissioners court, with respect to roads and any other property owned by the county and located in its jurisdiction, may place signs prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles within a restricted traffic zone on any road or on any property owned by the county if in the opinion of the commissioners court the stopping, standing, or parking is dangerous to those using the road or the other property owned by the county or if the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles will unduly interfere with the free movement of traffic or with the necessary control or use of property owned by the county. The signs shall be erected under an order of the court, and it is unlawful for any person to stop, stand, or park any vehicle in violation of the restrictions stated on the signs.

(e) Any person who shall deface, injure, knock down, or remove any sign or traffic control device erected under an order of the commissioners court as provided by this section commits a misdemeanor.

(f) Any person operating a motor vehicle in violation of any order of the commissioners court entered under this section or otherwise violating this section commits a misdemeanor and shall on conviction be punished by a fine not exceeding \$50 for the first offense, by a fine not exceeding \$200 for the second offense, and by a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 60 days, or both for each subsequent offense.

(g) The county commissioner of any precinct, the county road superintendent of any county, or the road supervisor whose road is affected may forbid the use of highways or parts of highways, if from wet weather or recent construction or repairs they cannot be safely used without probable serious damages to the highway or if the bridge or culverts on the highway are unsafe, under the following rules: the officer shall post notices on the highway stating the maximum load permitted and the time the use is prohibited, and the notices shall be posted on the highway in places that will enable the drivers to make detours to avoid the restricted highway or portions of it.

(h) If the owner or operator of any vehicle feels himself aggrieved by an action taken under this subsection, he may complain in writing to the county judge of the county, setting forth the nature of his grievance; if the complaint is filed, the judge shall set the

Regulation of roadside vendors in populous counties

Sec. 2.3015. (a) To promote the public safety, the commissioners court of a county with a population of more than 1.4 million, according to the most recent federal census, by order may regulate:

(1) the extent to which a vendor of food or merchandise of any kind may:

(A) sell the items on a public highway or road in the unincorporated area of the county or in the right of way of the highway or road; and

(B) erect, maintain, or place a structure on the highway or road or in the right of way; and

(2) the extent to which a person may solicit funds on a public highway or road in the unincorporated area of the county or in the right of way of the highway or road.

(b) As part of the regulations, the commissioners court may:

(1) require a vendor or a person soliciting funds to obtain a permit to sell the food or merchandise or to solicit the funds;

(2) charge a reasonable fee for the permit; and

(3) provide for the removal of any structure that is on a public highway or road or in a right of way of a public highway or road in violation of the regulations.

(c) If a regulation adopted under this section conflicts with a statute or a state agency rule, the statute or rule prevails to the extent of the conflict.

(d) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally or knowingly violates a regulation adopted under this section or obstructs or threatens to obstruct the removal of a structure that is on a public highway or road or in the right of way of a public highway or road in violation of a regulation adopted under this section. Each day a violation continues constitutes a separate offense. An offense under this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor.

Detour roads

Sec. 2.302. The commissioners court has the the responsibility to select and maintain detour roads and to post all necessary signs when county roads not part of the state system of highways are under construction as provided by Chapter 25, Acts of the 41st Legislature, Regular Session, 1929 (Article 6674a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes).

Sec. 2.303. (a) The commissioners court of each county, acting in conjunction with the sheriff, may employ not more than five regular deputies, nor more than two additional deputies for special emergencies to aid the regular deputies, to be known as county traffic officers. 1. Construction and application

Under § 79 of art. 6701d, and § 2 of this article, operators of such vehicles are required to drive carefully and even stop in an effort to avoid striking pedestrian, regardless of whether pedestrian or motorist has the right of way. *Loving v. Meacham* (Civ.App.1955) 278 S.W.2d 466, reversed on other grounds 155 T. 279, 285 S.W.2d 936.

Section 2 of this article imposing a greater duty of precaution upon operator of motor vehicle to avoid injury to a pedestrian observed crossing street at intersection guided by a "seeing eye" dog does not reduce the responsibility of careful procedure of the pedestrian. *Id.*

Blind or partially blind people are not accorded any greater rights or privileges than are accorded normal people in regard to crossing city streets. *Id.*

Art. 6701f. Speed signs

It shall be the duty of the State Highway Department and said Department is hereby directed to erect and maintain on the highways and roads of Texas appropriate signs showing the maximum lawful speed for commercial motor vehicles, truck tractors, trailers and semi-trailers (trucks) and motor vehicles engaged in the business of transporting passengers for compensation or hire (buses).

Authorization; notice and hearing on regulations

Section 1. (a) The Commissioners Court of any county in this State may regulate and restrict traffic on county roads and on other county-owned land under its jurisdiction.

(b) The Commissioners Court shall hold a public hearing before issuing any traffic regulation pursuant to this Act, and shall give advance notice of the regulation or regulations to be considered at the hearing by causing notice of the hearing to be published not less than seven days nor more than thirty days prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.

Rate of speed; load limits

Sec. 2. (a) The Commissioners Court may determine and fix the maximum, reasonable and prudent speed at any road or highway intersection, railroad grade crossing, curve or hill, or upon any other part of a county road less than the maximum fixed by law for public highways, taking into consideration the width and condition of the surface of the road and other circumstances on the affected portion of the road, as well as the usual traffic thereon. Whenever the Commissioners Court of any county shall determine and fix the rate of speed at any such point upon any county road at a less rate of speed than the maximum fixed by law for public highways and shall declare the maximum, reasonable and prudent speed limit thereat by proper order of the court entered on its minutes, such rate of speed shall become effective and operative at said point on said highways when appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected at such intersection or portion of the road under order of the court.

(b) The Commissioners Court may establish load limits for any road or bridge, and may authorize the county traffic officer, if one or more such officers have been appointed, or any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable, or deputy constable, to weigh vehicles for the purpose of ascertaining whether a vehicle is loaded in excess of the prescribed limit.

Traffic control devices

Sec. 3. The Commissioners Court of any county may adopt rules and regulations consistent with this Act for the establishment of a system of traffic control devices within restricted traffic zones established on county roads and on any other property owned by such county, under its jurisdiction, and such system shall conform to the State Highway Department's¹ manual and specifications. The Court may pursuant to an order entered on its minutes, place, erect, install and maintain upon county roads and on any other property owned by it, within traffic zones, such traffic signal lights, stop signs, and no parking signs, as it may deem necessary for the public safety.

Stopping, standing or parking

Sec. 4. The Commissioners Court of any county with respect to roads and any other property owned by the county, under its jurisdiction, may place signs prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on any road or on any property owned by the county within a restricted traffic zone where in the opinion of the Commissioners Court such stopping, standing or parking is danger-

porate limits of any incorporated city, town or village, including Home Rule Cities. Such authority shall be exclusive with respect to any such project, and the authorities prescribed in Sections 167 and 169 shall not apply upon any part of any such turnpike project; provided, however, that should any turnpike constructed by the Texas Turnpike Authority ever become a part of the designated State Highway System, the State Highway Commission¹ shall then have the sole authority to alter maximum prima facie speed limits thereon as prescribed in Section 167. The Texas Turnpike Authority shall not have the authority to alter the basic rule established in paragraph (a) of Section 166 nor to establish a speed limit higher than seventy (70) miles per hour.

(c) The Texas Turnpike Authority shall, in conducting the engineering and traffic investigations specified in paragraph (a) of Section 168, following the "Procedure for Establishing Speed Zones" prepared by the Texas Highway Department² which is in use on the effective date of this Act and as same may be subsequently revised for reasons of technological advancements in traffic operation, design and construction of highways and motor vehicles, as well as the safety of the motoring public.

Authority of County Commissioners Court and governing bodies of incorporated cities, towns and villages to alter maximum prima facie speed limits.

Sec. 169. (a) The County Commissioners Court of any county with respect to county highways or roads outside the limits of the right-of-way of any officially designated or marked highway, road or street of the State Highway System and outside the limits of any incorporated city, town or village shall have the same authority by order of the County Commissioners Court entered upon its records to alter maximum prima facie speed limits upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation as that delegated to the State Highway Commission¹ with respect to any officially designated or marked highway, road or street of the State Highway System; provided that under no circumstances shall any County Commissioners Court have the authority to modify or alter the basic rule established in paragraph (a) of Section 166 nor to establish a speed limit higher than sixty (60) miles per hour.

(b) The governing body of an incorporated city, town or village with respect to any highway, street or part of a highway or street, including those marked as a route of a highway of the State Highway System, within its corporate limits, shall have the same authority by

(2) That the shortage was caused by war, national emergency or other circumstances; and

(3) That a reduction of speed limits will serve to foster conservation purposes and safety; or

(4) The failure to alter state speed limits will prevent the state from receiving revenue for highway purposes from the federal government.

(c) Unless a specific speed limit is required by federal law or directive under threat of loss of federal highway funds then the State Highway Commission may not set maximum prima facie speed limits under this section of all vehicles below sixty (60) miles per hour.

(d) Before the commission may enter an order establishing a maximum prima facie speed limit, it must hold a public hearing preceded by the publication in at least three newspapers of general circulation in the state of a notice of the date, time, and place of the hearing and of the action proposed to be taken. The notice must be published at least 12 days before the date of the hearing. At the hearing, all interested persons may present oral or written testimony regarding the proposed order.

(e) When the commission enters an order under this section, it shall file the order in the office of the governor. The governor shall then undertake an independent finding of fact and determine the existence of the facts in Subdivisions (1), (2), (3) or (4) of Subsection (b) of this section. Before the eighth day after the order is filed in his office, the governor shall conclude his finding of fact, issue a proclamation stating whether the necessary facts exist to support the issuance of the commission's order, and file copies of the order and his proclamation in the office of the secretary of state.

(f) If the governor's proclamation states that the facts necessary to support the issuance of the commission's order exist, the order takes effect according to Subsection (g) of this section. Otherwise, the order has no effect.

(g) In an order issued under this section, the commission may specify the date on which the order takes effect, but that date may not be sooner than the eighth day after the order is filed with the governor. If the order contains no effective date, it takes effect on the 21st day after it is filed with the governor. Unless the order by its own terms expires earlier, it remains in effect until a subsequent order adopted by the procedure prescribed by this section amends or repeals it, except that any order adopted under this section expires when this section expires. The procedure for repealing an order is

(d) The governing body of an incorporated city, town, or village in which a public or private institution of elementary or secondary education is located shall hold upon request a public hearing at least once each calendar year to consider maximum prima facie speed limits on streets and highways, including highways in the State Highway System, near the institution. If a county road outside the State Highway System is located within 500 feet of a public or private institution of elementary or secondary education that is not within the limits of an incorporated city, town, or village, the county commissioners court shall hold upon request a public hearing at least once each calendar year to consider the maximum prima facie speed limit on the road near the institution. A municipal governing body or commissioners court may hold upon request one public hearing for all public and private institutions of elementary or secondary education within its jurisdiction.

(f) The provisions of this Act applicable to the drivers of vehicles upon the highways shall apply to the drivers of all vehicles owned or operated by the United States, this State or any county, city, town, district, or any other political subdivision of the State, subject to such specific exceptions as are set forth in this Act with reference to authorized emergency vehicles.

**Traffic laws apply to persons riding animals or
driving animal-drawn vehicles**

Sec. 25. Every person riding an animal or driving any animal-drawn vehicle upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by this Act, except those provisions of this Act which by their very nature can have no application.

Provisions of Act uniform throughout state

Sec. 26. The provisions of this Act shall be applicable and uniform throughout this state and in all political subdivisions and municipalities therein and no local authority shall enact or enforce any ordinance, rule, or regulation in conflict with the provisions of this Act unless expressly authorized herein. Local authorities may, however, adopt additional traffic regulations which are not in conflict with the provisions of this Act.

Powers of local authorities

Sec. 27. (a) The provisions of this Act shall not be deemed to prevent local authorities with respect to streets and highways under their jurisdiction and within the reasonable exercise of the police power from—

1. Regulating the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles;
2. Regulating traffic by means of police officers or traffic-control devices;
3. Regulating or prohibiting processions or assemblages on the highways;
4. Designating particular highways as one-way highways and requiring that all vehicles thereon be moved in one specific direction;
5. Regulating the speed of vehicles in public parks;
6. Designating any highway as a through highway and requiring that all vehicles stop or yield before entering or crossing the same, or

designating any intersection as a stop intersection or a yield intersection and requiring all vehicles to stop or yield at one or more entrances to such intersection;

7. Regulating the operation of bicycles and requiring the registration and licensing of same, including the requirement of a registration fee;

8. Regulating or prohibiting the turning of vehicles or specified types of vehicles at intersections;

9. Altering the speed limits as authorized herein;

10. Adopting such other traffic regulations as are specifically authorized by this Act.

(b) No local authority shall erect or maintain any stop sign or yield sign or traffic-control device at any location so as to require the traffic on any State highway, including Farm-to-Market or Ranch-to-Market roads, to stop or yield before entering or crossing any intersecting highway unless such signs or devices are erected and maintained by virtue of an agreement entered into between such local authority and the State Highway Department¹ under the provisions of Senate Bill No. 415, Acts of the 46th Legislature, Regular Session.²

(c) No ordinance or regulation enacted under Subsection (4), (5), (6), or (9) of Subsection (a) of this section shall be effective until signs giving notice of such local traffic regulations are posted upon or at the entrances to the highway or part thereof affected as may be most appropriate.

*This Act not to interfere with rights of owners of
real estate property with reference thereto*

Sec. 28. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prevent the owner of real property used by the public for purposes of vehicular travel by permission of the owner and not as matter of right from prohibiting such use, or from requiring other or different or additional conditions than those specified in this Act, or otherwise regulating such use as may seem best to such owner.

ARTICLE III—TRAFFIC SIGNS, SIGNALS, AND MARKINGS

State Highway Commission to adopt sign manual

Sec. 29. The State Highway Commission¹ shall adopt a manual and specifications for a uniform system of traffic-control devices consistent with the provisions of this Act for use upon highways within this state. Such uniform system shall correlate with and so far as



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

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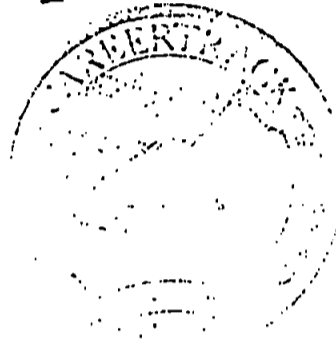
