Monday, May 14, 1990, the Honorable commissioners Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

County Treasurer, Ollie Faye Sparks, presented a budget amendment for the 1989-1990 budget. Motion was made by Commissioner Billy McGee to approve amendment as presented, plus add \$866.25 to the General Fund for purchase of a fax machine. Commissioner Jimmy Conn seconded the motion, and motion carried.

A. G. Mott presented the 911 report to the Court. Commissioner Cox made the motion to accept this report as presented. Commissioner McGee seconded, and motion carried. Exhibit attached.

Judge Smith presented a report from the Texas Veterans Commission showing the amount of monetary benefits paid to the veterans residing in our county by the Department of Veterans Affairs for 1989. Commissioner McGee made the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, to accept this report. Motion carried.

County Health Insurance was discussed. Commissioner Billy McGee made a motion to advertise for bids for insurance renewal, giving option of 1, 2, or 3 years. Bid opening to be June 11. Commissioner McDaniel seconded the motion, and motion carried.

Commissioner Chester Cox made the motion to approve Quarterly report. Commissioner Carlin McDaniel secnoded, and motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Cox to appoint Judge Royce Smith as board member to Deep East Texas Council of Government, effective July 1, 1990. Commissioner McDaniel seconded, and motion carried.

Motion carried.

Jack Lane was present, and presented the draft of a procedure to be followed by individuals who plan to have septic tanks installed. Commissioner McDaniel made a motion to adopt procedure for onsite sewage system facilities in sabine county, and a special fund of \$500.00 be set up for file cabinate, computer software, and office supplies. Motion was seconded by Commissioner McGee, and motion carried.

Also Tax Collector, Diane Husband, consented to have her office work with Mr. Lane in handling permitting and collecting fees. This will go into effect June 1.

Judge Smith informed the court that Kevin Dutton is graduating from Texas Zec Law School, and is interested in being County Attorney to replace Herbert Fortson who resigned in April. District Attorney Charles Mitchell said he can work under him as acting County Attorney until he takes his State bar exam in August or September. No action was taken, but this will be an agenda item for June 11th.

Court house custodian problems were discussed. David Burdette had been gone and presented a letter to the court requesting his job back. The court agreed to put him on probation for 6 months. If, during this time he does not do his job, or fails to show up for workwithout reason, his job will be terminated.

Motion was made by Commissioner McGee and seconded by Commissioner Conn, that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.





PROCEDURES FOR PERMITTING ON-SITE SEWERAGE FACILITIES IN SABINE COUNTY

Sabine County has been approved by the Texas Department of Health as an Authorized Agent, to implement rules, issue permits, inspect and collect fees for the on-site sewerage facilities (OSSF) in this county. Therefore for sanitary and health purposes all future OSSF in Sabine County should comply to the CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS for ON-SITE SEWERAGE FACILITIES as published by the TEXAS DEPARTMENT of HEALTH. Henceforth the OSSF in Sabine County will meet all aspects of design, construction, installion, operation and maintenance as set forth in this publication.

WHO MUST OBTAIN PERMITS:

Facility owners who wish to construct, install, repair, enlarge, operate and maintain an OSSF on ten (10) acres or less in this county must obtain a permit. A permit is required for ten (10) acres or more, but some requirements pertaining to design and installers may be excluded.

Facility owners with in two thousand (2000) feet of Toledo Bend Resivor should make application to the Sabine River Authority of Texas RT.# 1, Box 270 Burkeville, Tx. 75932

PROCEEDURES:

Obtain an application form from the Sabine County Tax Submit completed form with a sketch prepared by a registard professonal engineer or registered sanitarian (either having office. demonstrated expertise in on-site sewage design), percolation test data and proper fees.

Application will be reviewed and if approved, a permit for construction will be issued (valid for 1 year from issue date).

Engage a registered installer (unless owner is doing installation on owner's property). Owner and installer should exchange permit and

registration numbers.

Notify Sabine County Notify Sabine County \underline{Tax} office five (5) days prior to requested inspection date (before final cover).

After satisfactory completion of an on-site inspection a notice for use will be issued.
