

Monday, June 25, 1990, the Honorable Commissioners' Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith; Brother Clarence Howell led the opening prayer.

Minutes of the last meetings were read and approved. Commissioner Billy McGee made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Jimmy Conn, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting June 11. Motion carried. Commissioner McDaniel then made the motion which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, to approve minutes of the called meeting of June 14th. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Chester Cox, and seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee to approve payment of accounts and salaries. Motion carried.

Lawton Crain presented a request to the Court asking the County to pay \$540.00 as matching funds for Military time for State and County retirement. After some discussion, motion was made by Commissioner McGee to pay this matching fee. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried.

Mr. A. G. Mott and Carl Blair were present and gave a 911 Committee report of their trip to Memphis, Tennessee. They stated it was a very informative meeting. See attached report. Motion was made by Commissioner Chester Cox, and seconded by Commissioner Carlin McDaniel, to accept this report and that it be entered as a matter of record. Motion carried.

Thomas Hamilton, Justice of the Peace, Precinct 1, met with the Court requesting that his salary be adjusted for the remainder of this year only. He asked that for the months of June, August, and October only, the county pay him \$100.00 per month, plus continue to pay his insurance. Commissioner McGee made a motion to approve this request upon recommendation of our acting county attorney. Commissioner McDaniel seconded the motion, and motion carried.

County Clerk, Nadine Gary informed the Court that Jim Nethery, Chief Appraiser of the Sabine County Appraisal District, requested a letter giving Business Records Corporation permission to copy Sabine county's deed records they have on microfilm and stored under their care. The copied microfilm will be used by the County Appraisal District. Motion was made by Commissioner Chester Cox and seconded by Commissioner Billy McGee that we write this letter giving permission to copy the microfilm. Motion carried.

Since no action has been taken concerning the Citizen Review Committee, Commissioner McDaniel asked that it be dropped from the agenda.

Only one bid was received for the 1991 Police Package vehicle for the Sheriff department. This was from Hemphill Motor Company for \$13,678.00. Delivery date will be after October 1st. Motion was made by Commissioner McGee to accept this bid. Commissioner Conn seconded motion. Commissioner McGee and Commissioner Conn

voted for, with Commissioners McDaniel and Cox voting against. Judge Smith broke the tie by voting for, and motion carried.

The Court again reviewed the bids for County Group Health Insurance. Commissioner McGee explained that even tho he has no connection with Toledo Insurance Agency, he would not vote, because of public opinion. Other bids received were from Guardian Life Insurance Company and Sunday and Associates.

Commissioner McGee left at 10:15.

After some discussion, Commissioner McDaniel made the motion to accept the bid from Guardian Life Insurance Company. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried.

Tax collector Diane Husband, informed the Court her office is now handling boat motor and boat title registrations. All monies collected has to be used for Salary fund for tax office employees.

Mrs Husband also asked that her budget be amended by adding \$399.00 to line item for office supplies to cover expense for a typewriter she purchased for her office. This was a carry over from the 1989 budget. Commissioner McGee made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner McDaniel to approve this request. Motion carried.

Judge Smith asked that budget requests be in by July 15th, and that weekly meetings be set for each week in July, beginning the second week in July.

Commissioner Cox made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner McDaniel, that the county form a County Salary Review Committee. Motion carried. There will be a called meeting Friday, June 29th, at 8:30 to appoint this committee and set guidelines for members.

There being no further business, Commissioner McDaniel made the motion that meeting adjourn. Commissioner Cox seconded, and motion carried.

Dear Judge Smith,

As indicated by the attached letter, Jordan Jones Administrators and Security Life of America have issued a final renewal rate for the above referenced plan. These rates reflect a 28% increase over last plan year's initial rates, and will be reviewed again in six months. The total increase (cash flow) from last plan year's initial rates was around 22%.

Though no employer likes rate increases, especially when the "experience" appears favorable, several factors need to be considered when evaluating this renewal.

First, the experience of the group this year from an underwriting standpoint is "immature." Though we have experience from July 1, 1989 through May 15, 1990, with the claims lag and other underwriting factors, only the last four months are "credible." Even if we had access to the run-off experience from the prior carrier, and the prior plan year's experience, the fact remains that a 50 life case is not and should not be totally experience rated.

Second, you are a governmental entity with 40% of the group age 50 or older, and you have only a nominal dependent participation. These elements restrict the negotiation process with the current carrier and because this is a first year case the available markets are limited.

With all these factors in mind, it is our recommendation that Sabine County accept this renewal.

It has been our pleasure to work with you on this coverage and we look forward to working with you again this year.
