

Monday, JULY 16, 1990, the Honorable Commissioners Court met in a called session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Commissioner McGee was not present, due to the illness of his mother.

Meeting was called to order by Judge Royce Smith. Brother Tracy Lane led the opening prayer.

County Extension Agent, John Toner, was present, and presented certificates of Continuing Education for County Clerk, Nadine Gary and District Clerk, Tanya Walker from V. G. Young Institute of County Government. These certificates were presented to the Court as a matter of record.

Group Health Insurance was again discussed. Judge Smith informed the Court that since only three employees were covering their dependents, the company will not accept dependent coverage. 75% must cover dependents to have this coverage.

The following names were submitted for the Citizens Review Committee: Precinct # 1 - Edith McCauley and Margie Edgar Smith
Precinct # 3 - Wesley Pate and Wendell Eddings
Precinct # 4 - Charles O. Williams and Norman Shannon
Commissioner Cox made a motion to appoint the six names submitted. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried. Since Commissioner McGee was not present, his names were not submitted, and neither were the three at large names. To appoint the other five names will be an agenda item at our meeting July 23rd.

Although David Fuller was not on the agenda, he was present, and asked to address the Court. Motion was made by Commissioner Conn to waive his not being on the agenda. This was seconded by Commissioner Cox, and motion carried. Mr. Fuller told the Court Commissioner Conn's maintainer knocked his pasture fence down when they were dragging his road. Commissioner Conn said this was not right, that Mr Fuller just wanted the County to build him a new fence. No action was taken, but Commissioners McDaniel and Cox agreed to meet with the two of them and make a decision about the fence.

Also Mr. Fuller had questions about closing the garbage dumps. This was discussed, and it was explained to him this was a State law, and they could completely close them. They keep them open certain days to help the people.

Judge Smith left at 9:15. He had County Court. In the absence of Commissioner McGee, Commissioner McDaniel was acting Judge pro-tem.


Salaries were discussed in the budget session. County Treasurer, Ollie Faye Sparks, reported that to raise the Treasurer, Tax Collector, County Clerk and District clerk to the salary of the Commissioners would mean an additional \$1,572.00 each per year. To raise the County Attorney salary to their level would mean an additional \$10,992.00 per year. A 3% raise for County employees would be \$30.00 per month



for Chief deputies in the Court house and \$28.00 per month for other Court house employees. This 3% raise would effect Constables, Justices of the Peace, and all County employees.


Thomas Hamilton, J. P. # 1, asked to transfer \$600.00 from Elected Official fund to Office Supply in his budget. No action was taken.




Commissioner Conn made the motion which was seconded by Commissioner Cox, that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

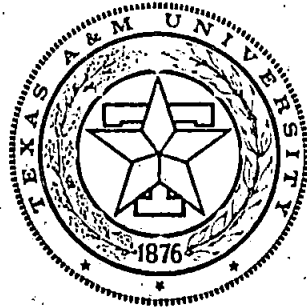

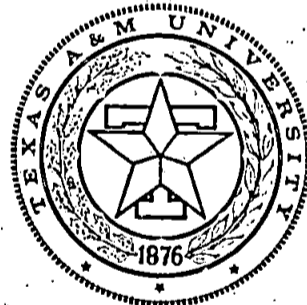

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF SABINE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT FUND; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY JUDGE TO ACT AS THE COUNTY'S EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IN ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE COUNTY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners Court of the County of Sabine desires to develop a viable urban community, including decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low/moderate income; and

WHEREAS, certain conditions exist which represent a threat to the public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interests of the County of Sabine to apply for funding under the 1990 Texas Community Development Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF SABINE, TEXAS:

1. That a Texas Community Development Program application for the Community Development Fund is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the County with the Texas Department of Commerce.
2. That the County's application be placed in competition for funding under the Community Development Fund.
3. That the application be for \$ 235,938.00 of grant funds to carry out Road Paving Improvements.
4. That the County Commissioners Court directs and designates the County Judge as the County's Chief Executive Officer and Authorized Representative to act in all matters in connection with this application and the County's participation in the Texas Community Development Program.
5. That it further be stated that the County of Sabine is committing \$ 15,507.00 from its Road & Bridge Fund as a cash contribution toward the project activities of this Street Paving Improvements Project and \$ 32,493.00 in kind services.
