Monday, February 11, 1991, the Sabine County Commissioners Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Richard Smith. Brother Clarence Howell led the opening prayer.

Commissioner Chester Cox made the motion to approve written reports. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried.

Commissioner McDaniel reported to the Court his motor grader for Precinct 1 was vandalized Friday night near Indian Mounds. Approximately \$4,000.00 or \$5,000.00 damage was done. Hydrolic lines were broken, and all tires were flat, along with other things. Two boys from Lufkin were picked up Saturday morning. He would like to see if he can collect restitution for this.

Commissioner Lynn Smith told the Court he owes \$39,500.00 plus interest on a 1984 Mack dump truck. This payment is not due until October, but he does not have the money to pay. Motion was made by commissioner Cox and seconded by Commissioner Conn, to advertise for bids to sell 1984 Mack dump truck. Motion carried. Court reserves the right to reject bids. Bid opening will be March 11, at 9:00 A. M.

Commissioners will collect unused county equipment inside chain link fence at Precinct 1 barn. They will collect these items to hold an auction.

An agenda item for meeting February 25 is approve members for the child Welfare Board.

Only one bid was received for Bank Depository. This was from First State bank. Motion was made by Commissioner Conn to accept this bid. Commissioner McDaniel seconded, and all voted for.

Judge Allen sturrock and other MHMR members were present to present a Resolution of Appreciation honoring the late Judge Royce Smith who served as Judge since January 1, 1979. This resolution was presented to his son, Glynn and brother Harold, who were also in attendance.

After a 10 minute recess, Tax Assessor/Collector, Diane Husband was present with her deputy, Johnny Davis. Mrs. Husband addressed the Court by saying Johnny wants all these problems put behind him. He does not feel this is personally against him. He did not authorise anyone to represent him.

Recording of gravel hauling off Temple land was discussed. No action was taken.

Solid Waste was again discussed. The Commissioners received a letter that they should bring dumps into compliance by April 1. They will have to be covered at least one a month.

Bob Bass, representing Jim Allison and Associates was present. He discussed the re-districting process. We should submit redistricting plans to the Justice Department no later than October 1st. Commissioner McDaniel had questions concerning combining J.P. Precincts; also about forming a Minority voting precinct. Allison and associates will work up 3 proposals for us for a fee of \$7,500.00. We must let them know by March 1. \$3,000.00 will be due almost immediately; the remaining \$4,500.00 can be made in 2 payments. No action taken.

Commissioner Cox made the motion to pay bills. Commissioner Conn seconded, and all voted for .

Motion was made by Commissioner Cox that meeting adjourn. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried.

The Sabine County Sheriff's Department serves the citizens of Sabine County on a continuing basis 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The entire department consists of Sheriff Greer and ten (10) employees as follows:

State Jail Commission requires a jailer on duty 24 hours a day. In addition, the state requires that when a female is in custody, a female jailer be on duty at all times. The transporting of female prisoners requires the presence of friendly female personnel.

Since there are 168 hours in a week, or 21 eight(8) hour shifts, Sabine County is required to have 5 certified jailers to cover the 168 hours. Due to the cooperation from the State Jail Commission, we are allowed to use combination Jailer/Dispatchers on slower shifts based on past

history of the area and what is considered to be slack periods. Should the jail commission decide to strictly enforce standards, the County would be forced to hire 4 lore employees to handle the 168 hour per week load required of dispatchers and jailers.

Sabine County Sheriff's Department is currently doing the job with the the above mentioned personnel, using one Deputy to jail and dispatch one shift on Monday evenings.

Sheriff Greer and four (4) Deputies are responsible for nearly 400 square miles, 4,000 Niles of roads, a population of approximately 10,000 with seasonal increases in population and traffic and nearly 16,000 automobiles registered in Sabine County.

Specific Duties Performed by Sheriff and four (4) Deputies include butare not limited to the following:

- Responsible for enforcement of all local, state and federal laws within the confines of Sabine County, Texas.
- Transport of prisoners from other law enforcement agencies to Sabine County. From Sabine County to Texas Department of Corrections. From Sabine County to MPTR treatment facilities as far away as Austin or San Antonio.
- 3. Provide service to the community in the form of escorting funerals, to unlocking private vehicles.

Deputies are required to be certified Texas Peace Officers, a requirement of which is a minimum of 400 training hours and one (1) year experience. There are three levels of certification available to a Texas Peace Officer, (1) Basic (2) Intermediate (3) Advanced Sheriff Greer and his Deputies have 89 years combined law enforcement experience.

From March through September of each year, one Deputy is under contract with the Corps. of Engineers to work Mill Creek Park at Sam Rayburn Lake. This Deputy is repsonsible for being at Mill CreekPark Thursday through Sunday, ten (10) hours each day. Sabine County General Fund is compensated at the rate of \$15.22 per hour for each hour this Deputy spends in Mill Creek Park. Sabine County General Fund is also compensated by the U.S. Forest Service at the rate of \$10.85 per hour for patrols made by other Deputies of Red Hill Lake, Indian Mound, Lakeview, and willow Oak Parks on Toledo Bend Lake. Total Payments to Sabine County General Fund from the Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Forest Service for these patrols by the Sheriff's Deputies is \$20,763.40. This contract with the Corp. of Engineers reduces the manpower at the Sheriff's Department by one (1) unit from March through September, even though this officer can and does respond to emergencies if needed.

Deputies with this Department are required to answer all calls from the public for assistance no matter when they receive them. In other words, they are ultimately on duty 24 hours per day, as they are subject to answer a call at any time.

Deputies are required to work 42 hours per week. Due to the nature of this work, starting and stopping times cannot be written in stone. Calls for assistance from the public served by law enforcement cannot be predicted as to the nature of the call, nor the time assistance will be needed. The Sheriff's Department strives to provide the maximum number of officers available to handle calls at peak time, as our schedules will reflect.

Sabine County is also responsible for serving Civil Process in the county. The £40.00 Service Fee on all civil papers is turned in to the General Fund.

It has been rumored that the Commissioners Court is considering hiring one more deputy in an attempt to lower overtime worked by Sabine County Deputies.

The Deputies employed by the Sabine County Sheriff's Department are the lowest paid full time certified peace officers in the county. By paying them a maximum of 50 hours overtime per month, their pay scale comes in line with other officers working the county.

One additional deputy would cost Sabine County \$1,810.06 per month not including uniforms or any required schools attended by the new officer.

The only way to guarantee that there would not be any overtime associated with any law enforcement entity would be to have sufficient officers for around the clock 24 hour duty. The addition of one deputy to the Sabine County Sheriff's Department would not eliminate nor drastically reduce the necessity of overtime within the Sheriff's Department due to the very nature and uncertainty of when officers will be needed. The work-load at the Sheriff's Department is being handled by the Sheriff and his staff, albeit with overtime, which does guarantee the deputies at least a living wage.

Sheriff Greer is giving an open invitation to any member or all of the Commissioner's Court to come and inspect the operation of the Sheriff's Department. Any or all of the department is open to your inspection from actually riding with one of the deputies to seeing how fines are collected and documented. This would give you hands on working knowledge of how this department operates.

According to a December 1990 U.S. News and World Report Magazine, the average cost most Americans pay for police services is \$114.00 per year. The average cost for services provided by the Sabine County Sheriff's Department is \$38.52 per person. This figure is based on the entire Sheriff's Department budget and doesn't include any deductions for the \$20,000.00 plus dollars paid to the county for patrol services by the Corps. of Engineers and U.S. Forest SErvice nor any of the fines or service fees collected by the Department. Without these deductions, the Department is operating at approximately 1/3 the cost of the National Average per capita.

Another matter that needs to be addressed by the Court is public misconception of 911. The public needs to be made aware of the fact that in January, 1992, when they dial 911, that they are not getting what they see on T.V. on Tuesday nights. The only current requirement by the State is 40 hours of T.E.C.L.E.O.S.E. approved Telecommunications School — which all cur disptachers currently have. The public needs to be aware that the 911 number is merely a convenience to reach all emergency services, that in Sabine County, at least in the preliminary states, an E.M.T. will not be answering the phone, and response times to calls for help will not change dramatically. Until the public is willing to pay the bill for additional services, the services will remain basically the same. In Sabine County, the Sheriff's Department assumes any changes in operation will require a state mandate.

In conclusion, while the Sabine County Sheriff's Department may appear to be a liability from a pure bookkeeping standpoint, it provides badly needed service and protection to the citizens of Sabine County, and at a cost of 1/3 the National Average. Poclie Services were never meant to

be a paying proposition but a liability in a bookkeeping sense with many hidden assets.


