Monday, March 11, 1991, the Honorable Commissioners' Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Meeting was called to order by Judge Richard Smith. Brother Clarence Howell led the opening prayer.

Motion was made by Commissioner Cox, seconded by Commissioner Conn, to approve monthly reports. Motion carried.

A petition from the Black Churches of the County was presented by Rev. Ellis Kemper, asking for equal representation in government in Hemphill and surrounding towns. Also present representing the Black communities were Vollie Grace, Rev. Will Smith, and Pierce Edwards. "See attached petition." No action was taken.

Names presented for the re-districting advisory committee are: Prct. # 1 Jack Lane - Vollie Grace

Prct. # 2 Lee Hunt - James Duke

Prct. # 3 Quincy Wright - Melvin Wilson

Prct. # 4 Earl Morris - Lonnie B. Davis

Judge Smith had only one at-large name to submit at this time; this being Rev. Ellis Kemper. Motion was made by Commissioner Chester Cox and seconded by Commissioner Jimmy Conn, to accept names submitted. Motion carried.

Only one bid was received to buy the 1984 dump truck from Prct. 2. This was from David Cook Truck & Equipment, and for \$17,000.00. Commissioner Conn made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Smith, to reject this bid. Motion carried.

Commissioner cox made the motion to table agenda item listed "Use of County equipment by the City" until March 25. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried.

Arthur Ellison, V. A. Service Officer, was present, and offered to accept a 10% reduction in salary, with no health insurance benefits. He also stated having veterans in the County is justification enough to have this office open. The law now mandates training by the Texas Veterans Commission. He asked the County to pay his expenses to the Spring Conference, and wants to know if they do or do not support the office. Judge Smith and Commissioner Conn asked to go on record as supporting the office. Motion was made by Commissioner McDaniel to cut the Veterans' Service Officer's salary/per month and eleminate Health Insurance. Commissioner Cox seconded, and motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Cox and seconded by Commissioner Conn to pay expenses to the Veterans Service Officers' Spring Conference. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Conn to authorize Tommy Garner, with Sabine Communications, to conduct range tests on tower at Milam, check out equipment, and present proposal at our next meeting March 25th. Commissioner Cox seconded, and motion carried. Sabine communications will be an agenda item then.

Commissioner cox made the motion to waive agenda, and allow Maggie Hauser to speak. Commissioner Conn seconded, and motion carried. Mrs. Hauser said Paula Farley will conduct a Solid Waste meeting in the Harborlight Meeting room April 2nd, at 7:00 P. M. Commissioner Carlin McDaniel asked that Judge Owens from Tyler County, also Chairman of Solid Waste Task Forse, be asked to the meeting. Mrs. Hauser said she will contact him.

Sheriff department radio system was discussed. Sheriff Greer informed the Court there are new radios in the 4 deputies' cars. He has no working radio in his. Constables Paul Clark and Jeff Cox have radios in their cars.

Commissioner Lynn Smith made the motion to pay accounts and salaries, with the exception of renewing the membership of the Sam's card, and the reimbursement of Notary bond for Clarice Clark, J. P. # 5. Commissioner McDaniel seconded, and motion carried.

Commissioner Cox made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Conn to authorize Judge Smith to review group application for Storm water run-off permit, and to spend up to \$500.00. will come out of Solid Waste Fund. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Chester Cox, seconded by Commissioner Lynn Smith, to waive the agenda to allow Norman Shannon to speak concerning the county Review Committee. He asked each member of the Court to look at and consider recommendations they present. If they spend time working on these recommendations, at least consider them.

Judge Smith asked to be more involved in what is done in meetings.

Commissioner Conn made the motion meeting adjourn. Commissioner Smith seconded, and motion carried.

THE ALLIANCE OF MINORITY CHURCHES

An appeal to the citizens of Hemphill, Texas and Sabine County to correct the unrighteous act of denying representation of minority citizens.

Thank God for being American citizens that love and support this great United States of America. It is because of our love for God and country we appeal to the citizens of Hemphill, who like we want to see a growing and better city. We can nolonger sit back and not address the problem of an all white government, whether it is the Commissioners of Court, the School Board, police department, the hospital board, the postal service, and etc. It is wrong to not have Black representation.

We, like you, are christian people and tax payers. We support the various businesses and organizations of the City of Hemphill. Like you, we want a better tomorrow for our children and a better today for all people. However, being the minority and with the impossibility of being elected to the various facets of government in our city, we appeal to our many christian brothers and sisters to take a stand and challenge those who are within our government to provide seats for minorities, Blacks in particular, on these various boards which is your christian as well as civic duty.

We pray for God's blessings on our nation, our president, and other national leaders that He would bring peace in the Middle East Crisis, and also that He would bring all of our soldiers, both men and women, home safely with the smallest possible casualties and that He would comfort the families and loved ones of our brave military men and women. However, once again are there not just as many Blacks, if not more, suffering the same agony. If blood is spilled on foriegn soil, will not Black Americans blood be shed also? De we as black Americans not hurt as do all Americans? Our appeal to all the citizens of Hemphill is that it is unrighteous before God and our nation to be denied equal representation in the City of Hemphill, Texas.

I close this letter with the 14th Amendment, Section I of the Constitution Of the United States of America proposed June 13, 1866 and ratified July 9, 1868 which states:

All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the state wherein they reside. No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

Also the Gettysburg Address by President Abraham Lincoln is a very fitting address to quote. It says:

Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty,

and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate—we can not consecrate—we can not hallow—this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us—that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom—that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.

Proverbs 11:8-10 states, "The righteous is delivered out of trouble, and the wicked cometh in his stead. An hypocrite with his mouth destroyeth his neighbor; but through knowledge shall the just be delivered. When it goeth well with the righteous, the city rejoiceth; and when the wicked perish, there is shouting."

In conclusion an all white government is a slap in the face of the men and women who have given their lives for this great nation and a mockery to our God. The black citizens of the city of Hemphill and surrounding towns appeal to you to make a difference in this our home and city of Hemphill.
