Margaret Stockton and Ann Blackwell from Tri-County Community
Action made their presentation to the Court. They informed the Court
that their grant money had been cut and that in order to continue the
program the County would be required to put \$21,481.00 into their
budget next year. Ms. Stockton also informed the Court that TriCounty is considering cutting the nutrition program back to 4 days a
week. After a lengthy discussion with questions from the Commissioners
and concerned citizens Judge Smith asked the Court if they wanted him
to look into the feasibility of applying for grant monies to run the
program locally. Commissioner McDaniel made a motion to allow Judge
Smith to check with DETCOG to find out what he can and to take up this
matter at the next meeting. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion.
Motion carried.

Commissioner McDaniel made a motion to pay the bills except the MHMR pledge with a second from Commissioner Smith. Motion carried.

Commissioner Cox made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second from Commissioner Smith. Motion carried.  $^{\prime}$
