Meeting was called to order by Judge Richard Smith.


2, Justice and Voting precincts were discussed. No action was taken, but this will be an agenda item Sept. 9th.


Commissioner Chester Cox made the motion to adopt tax rate of .35¢. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded, and motion carried, with all voting for.



REPORT TO THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF SABINE COUNTY
ON
THE PROPOSED "COUNTY BARN"

THE "COUNTY BARN" - Mr. Wiley Wright and I inspected the proposed site of a County barn on Friday, August 16, 1991. Throughout this report I shall refer to this site as the "Barn". This building is 150 feet long and 120 feet wide. Its main support system is made of Hansen tubular trusses on 15 foot centers. Three of these have been removed and as a result a large portion of the roof has collapsed and the front support wall is severely deformed. The construction method used here was one involving the above mentioned trusses tied to steel I beams in the front and back walls. No steel supports are to be found in the side walls. The truss span is fifty feet with standard 5 inch tubular steel supports.

The roof has suffered severe damage caused by water build up and leaks. Examination of the side wall nearest the office area showed that water had built up to several feet and then caused the roof to collapse allowing water to leak into the office space. Also, many of the roof joists showed water damage and deterioration. The whole roof system must be replaced. The truss design provides for a slight roof slope, but this feature coupled with the high walls surrounding the roof edge allowed water to build up in areas when the roof drains became plugged. Apparently the roof was fastened to the side wall with a wooden purlin and the load of the water shattered this wooden beam and allowed the roof to fall in.

All electricity has been removed including the breakers, circuit boxes and control switches. A complete wiring job will be required. Also, there was a suspended ceiling about 10 feet from the concrete floor. It is completely gone. It looks as though it was destroyed by water. There is no insulation or duct work for heating. The air conditioner unit located in the office space looks inoperable as do most of the plumbing fixtures. All lighting fixtures, receptacles, switches, and junction boxes will have to be replaced.

Considerable work will have to be done on the area surrounding the "Barn". Several attached buildings will have to be demolished or renovated. They cannot be left as they are for safety and health reasons. The large sliding doors that provide access to the main building will probably have to be replaced.

COST ESTIMATE FOR "BARN" RENOVATION - It is somewhat difficult to provide an accurate estimate for such work. These figures are rough guesses based on experience gained in the oil field and construction industry:

1. New roof including joists	\$25,000
2. Truss repair and replacement	10,000
3. New electrical system	5,000
4. Heating and ducting	5,000
5. Inside renovation including ceiling	15,000
6. Vehicle lift	3,000
7. General cleanup	3,000
8. Office renovation	5,000
TOTAL	\$71,000

CONCLUSIONS - The "Barn" has an excellent concrete slab foundation, lots of room for all the County vehicles and is located at a central site. It will be expensive to repair this facility so that it can perform the function of a maintenance and service shop. It will still have a flat roof which is bound to cause trouble regardless of the material used or the care the roofers take in installing proper flashing and drains. In my opinion, this building is not of quality construction and in the long term would cost the County money in high maintenance and operating expenses.

AN ALTERNATE PLAN - Since the "Barn" site is centrally located and has an excellent concrete slab, a alternate plan would be to:

1. Remove all existing buildings	\$10,000
2. General cleanup	3,000
3. New steel frame building 30 ft by 80 ft @ \$20/ft includes all utilities, HVAC, office space	48,000
4. Vehicle hoist	3,000
TOTAL	\$64,000

This cost is high, but the building will be new and should have a serviceable life of 40 years. It can be located directly on the present slab and should be large enough to handle all the required functions of a County barn. It can be erected in a few weeks and will have office and storage space plus air conditioning, heating and all utilities.

Another idea is to have a similar type steel building, but have only a 30 ft by 20 ft area inclosed for vehicle repair and office space and have a large open area - 30 ft by 60 ft for vehicle maintenance and storage. All of the area would be under the same roof but the open area would not be heated or air conditioned. The cost estimate for this concept is:

1. Remove all existing buildings	\$10,000
2. General clean up	3,000
3. Steel building enclosed 30 ft by 20 ft @ \$20/ft	12,000

4. Open steel building	12,600
30 ft by 60 ft @ \$7/ft	
5. Vehicle hoist	3,000
TOTAL	\$40,600

This system has all the advantages of the first steel building idea except that the enclosed working area is smaller. The building is new and of quality construction as before.

USE OF THE YELLOWPINE FACILITY - The present facility at Yellowpine, here after called YP, provides an immediate solution to the County barn problem. This place has an enclosed area for vehicle repair and four maintenance bays under roof. It has a vehicle hoist that needs repair. It also needs cleaning up and certain renovations. The parking area outside the shop needs more hard surfacing so that heavy vehicles may be moved about and not get stuck in the mud. Its major disadvantage is that it is not centrally located. It is six miles from the proposed "Barn". A new fence should be built for security reasons. The estimate to make the YP facility into a County barn is:

1. Renovation and clean up	\$3,000
2. New hard stand area	2,000
3. New fence	1,000
TOTAL	\$6,000

This place may not be convenient to all areas of the County, but it is economically attractive. The extra cost of going an addition six miles to the YP location over going to the County "Barn" site would cost about:

1. Twelve miles round trip	\$ 12.00
@ \$1.00/mile	
2. Drive time - 1 hour	10.00
@ \$10.00/hour	
TOTAL	\$ 22.00

This means that the use of the YP site would cost the County \$22.00 more every time a vehicle had to go for service. The cost of renovating the YP location is so small that this travel cost would be more than offset by the high price of renovating or rebuilding at the "Barn".

Please note that all I have said in this report is based on my own estimates. I have not contacted any contractors who could perform such work or construction. If the Court so desires, I will be happy to under take a more detailed study with the help of the Citizens' Review Committee.

SABINE COUNTY
PERSONNEL POLICY MANUAL

This policy manual represents the work of many elected officials of the County and the County Review Committee. It has been written based on a manual developed for a similar size County located in the panhandle region of Texas. It was modified to meet the special needs of Sabine County.

The work began in May, and now a draft of the manual is ready for review and approval by the Commissioners' Court. Several features of this document need to be kept in mind while it is being reviewed:

1. A Personnel Committee is created which has oversight of all personnel matters and makes all decisions not normally handled by supervisors, in this case, the elected officials.
2. The concept of this manual is based on mutual trust between the elected officials and the County employees.
3. The operation of such a policy will depend on the development of several forms that must be used in many areas of employee relations. Some of these are:
 - a. Application for employment
 - b. No fault separation forms
 - c. Disciplinary action forms
 - d. Job description forms
 - e. Time sheets
 - f. Accident report forms
 - g. Vacation summary
 - h. Sick leave use summary
 - i. Time off without pay summary
 - j. Job evaluation and promotion forms
 - k. Physical examination forms

Other types of forms may be needed as the program is put into place. Many of the forms listed above may be purchased from office supply houses. The one here in Hemphill will be glad to assist the County in proper selection.

4. A performance review of every employee is required at least one a year. This is an important item and should not be taken lightly.
5. Any one working for the County and holding down another job must have the approval of his County supervisor.

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6. The use of overtime is limited, and the granting of compensatory time is prohibited. Those employees having such time when this document is approved must submit a plan for using their compensatory time in a two year period.

Remember, this is a draft of a personnel policy. It reflects the thinking of lots of people, but it is still the responsibility of the Commissioners' Court to set down the plan as they see fit.

Another item that must be mentioned is the development and maintenance of a personnel file on every employee. All of his records and all forms pertaining to his job must be kept in an orderly fashion in this file.

Finally, this manual was typed using a software package called PFS WRITE. It has been installed on the County Treasurer's computer and all the manual is contained on a floppy disc that can be corrected and edited by utilizing that machine.

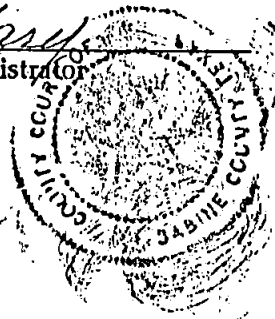



INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR STREET CONSTRUCTION,
REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE BETWEEN SABINE COUNTY
AND BROOKELAND ISD

THE STATE OF TEXAS)
COUNTY OF SABINE)

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between SABINE, TEXAS, hereinafter called "County", acting herein by and through its County Judge and County Commissioners, pursuant to a resolution duly passed by the Commissioners' Court of said County, and Brookeland Independent School District, hereinafter called BISD, a body corporate and politic, organized and existing under the General Laws of the State of Texas, acting herein by and through its Board, thereunto duly authorized;

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, said County and BISD, pursuant to the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Article 4413 32c), Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended have determined that it would be to the best

interest of such County and BISD and to the inhabitants thereof that provisions be made for the repair of parking lots, and other driveways of BISD by Sabine County:

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BISD AND SABINE COUNTY AGREE that County may perform work for BISD consisting of the repair, and maintenance of parking lots, or other like facilities owned by BISD, provided however, all such work shall be performed in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

021

1. BISD, acting by and through its governing body, herein request Sabine County to perform any project within the scope of this Agreement. The request shall be in writing and directed to the Commissioners' Court. The request shall be made on the prescribed form attached hereto as Exhibit A. Prior to action on the request, the Commissioners Court may require BISD to provide any information it shall deem necessary to evaluate such request, including plans and specifications for the proposed project.

2. Before Sabine County may begin work on the project the Commissioners' court shall give specific written approval to such project in a document separate from this Agreement, which written consent shall describe the type of project to be undertaken and the location thereof. Such consent shall be made on the prescribed form attached hereto as Exhibit B. At Sabine County's sole discretion, such consent may be conditioned Upon BISD's prior approval of the project cost. Should such consent be so conditioned, Sabine County shall furnish BISD a written estimate of the cost of performing such work. No action shall be taken until such estimate is approved by BISD.

3. BISD, in consideration of the full and true performance of such work by Sabine County hereby agrees and binds itself to pay the Sabine County all costs actually incurred by Sabine County in performance of the work, including but not limited to the costs of all labor, material, and equipment used by Sabine County.

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4. Upon completion, Sabine County shall provide BISD a statement of \$500 for this work performed. BISD shall remit to Sabine County payment of such costs within thirty (30) days fo receipt of the aforementioned statement.

5. BISD hereby represents that funds are available from the budget for the current fiscal year for payment for work anticipated to be performed hereunder.

6. This Agreement shall be effective on and from its date of execution for a term of one (1) year after the date hereof. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by either party upon 30 days written notice given by certified mail, receipt requested.

7. The work done by Sabine County pursuant to this Agreement shall be executed, performed and completed in good, substantial and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of BISD.

8. BISD shall specify in writing any complaint as to the quality of workmanship performed by Sabine County.

9. Nothing herein is intended to require Sabine County to provide any right of way. It is understood and agreed that the providing of rights of way, engineering work, and plans, designs, and specifications shall be at the expense of BISD.

10. Sabine County shall have the right and authority, upon reasonable notice to the proper BISD official, to block streets and roadways, park equipment on rights of way, and to do all things reasonably necessary to perform such construction, maintenance or repairs.

11. Sabine County shall not be liable for any delay which may be caused by reason or account of unavoidable accident or other circumstances beyond its control. It is further understood and agreed that Sabine County shall perform such work only after and subject to fulfilling commitments and priorities on other Sabine County projects. Sabine County, upon completion of such work, shall clear away all tools, machinery, debris, and any materials or things which may be lying about the worksite, and shall do everything necessary to finish all the work in a complete and workmanlike manner, both in appearance and in fact.

12. Sabine County shall be liable for accidents and damages which may occur during such time and which may arise from the performance of any work by Sabine County under this Agreement (only to the extent provided by law.) Sabine County, during the progress of such work, shall adequately protect the work, adjacent property, and the public.

13. BISD hereby agrees to indemnify and hold Sabine County harmless for all damages, liabilities for which may be imposed by law upon BISD for acts of omission or commission by BISD during the term and performance of this contract.

I respectfully request that this governing body reconsider the Sheriff's Department Budget for the upcoming fiscal year for the following reasons:

- (1) 911 is scheduled to commence in January, 1992 and the Department will be expected to do a better job - which will not be possible with less help.
- (2) The Department brings in enough revenue in six months to pay the salary for our 4th deputy for a full year by patrolling designated U.S. Forest Service and Corps. of Engineer parks.
- (3) The Department will have problems carrying out these contracts with the Forest Service and Corps of Engineers. Calls for assistance from the public will have to take 1st priority.
- (4) It is both my personal and professional opinion that this is not the time to cut law enforcement. We need to be considering more protection for the people of Sabine County rather than cutting the County's existing protection.

I strongly urge this body to set the Sheriff's Department budget at \$350,000.00 rather than the \$322,392.00 you have proposed. I will re-align the figures to fit \$350,000 and save the 4th deputy which I believe this department needs.

Instead of your proposed cut of \$76,628.00 on the budget I submitted, I request that you make a cut of \$49,020.00 which would make the Sheriff's Department budget \$350,000.00.

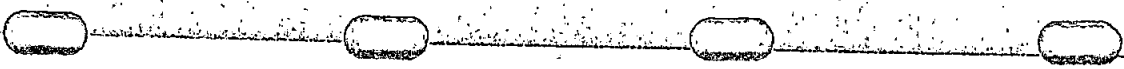
