

Monday, May 24, 1993, the Sabine County Commissioners Court met in a regular session at 8:30 A. M., with the following members present:

Judge Hyden called meeting to order; Brother Clarence Howell led opening prayer.

Minutes of the last four meetings were read. Motion made by Commissioner Lynn Smith to approve minutes after correction of April 26. Commissioner Chester Cox seconded, and motion carried. Motion by Commissioner Cox to give Judge Hyden authority to correct minutes of 4/26 by drawing a line through the word "principal", and change to "interest". Both he and County Clerk, Nadine Gary, will initial this change. Commissioner Clark seconded, and motion carried.

Motion was made by Commissioner Keith Clark, seconded by Commissioner Lynn Smith, to accept the following as regular business: Policy/procedures manuel, Surplus equipment, and letter from Temple, providing gravel. Motion carried.

First 5 items of policy manuel presented to Court. No changes required at this time.

Motion made by Commissioner Smith to approve quarterly report. Commissioner Clark seconded, and all voted for.

Commissioner Clark made motion, seconded by Commissioner Cox, to approve Treasurer's line item transfer. Motion carried, with all voting for. "See exhibit."

#4 - Audit report - Richard Rudel gave report, and recommendedations; Among these were - personnel files should be required, W-4 forms updated yearly, and all offices should use pre-numbered receipts.

Motion made by Commissioner Chester Cox to approve audit as presented. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded, and motion carried.

#7 - Roger Dahl, Red cross representative recommended the merger of our local Red Cross with Angelina County. John Starr, Jr. Sabine county Co-ordinator, agrees with this. Judge Hyden recommended we merge with Angelina County. No action taken. Commissioner Clark made motion to table until our meeting, June 14th. Commissioner Smith seconded, and motion carried.

Warr's Harborlight Subdivision: Motion made by Commissioner Keith Clark to accept road in subdivision as county maintained road. Commissioner Chester Cox seconded. This road is not 40' wide. After discussion, Commissioner Clark made motion to table until court can measure from center line. Commissioner Cox seconded. This will be an agenda item at our meeting June 14th.

#3 - J. C. White Road - Agenda item 6/14.

#5 - Workers' Comp Insurance - Motion made by Judge Hyden that County accept Deep East Texas Self Insurance Fund for insuing year. Commissioner clark seconded, and all voted for.

# 6 - Solid Waste - Judge Hyden gave update on this. He has talked with Mr. Hancock and Texas Water Commissioner. No action taken, but will be an agenda item June 14th.

# 8 - Motion made by Commissioner Lynn Smith, seconded by Commissioner Kenneth White to go out for bids for used track hoe with a rotary head for grinding glocanite rock. Motion carried, with all voting for.


Dump truck - Precinct 3 - No action taken.







On this, the Seventh day of June, 1993, IT IS ORDERED that:

Sabine County Pre-Trial Release shall be extended to arrestee's for misdemeanor offenses which have been filed in the County Court of Sabine County. This program will consist of arrestee's being released on PR bond and notice to report to the PTR office Prior to the time of arraignment, which should be a minimum of three working days or Arraignment shall be held by the County Judge on the first and third Monday at 1:30 P.M.

The arrestee will not be eligible for PTR if:

1. Improper identification or lack of sufficient information;
2. Prior record with multiple prior offenses or violent offenses;
3. Nature of offense is violent and violence is likely to reoccur;
4. Unlikely to appear in court (no out-of-state nor persons arrested for bond forfeiture, resisting, evading);
5. Prior bond forfeitures, if officer has knowledge of prior bond forfeitures for arrested subject.

Bonds for Sabine County Court cases will be set by the magistrate at the time of reading of rights. For arrestee's who are determined to be ineligible for PTR bond, the bind will be surety bind in the amount set or \$500.00 cash. PTR will be used unless it is determined that arrestee is not eligible under the above guidelines. The Sheriff may accept property bonds when there are two (2) sufficient surety signers acceptable to the Sheriff.


Persons released on PTR should be told that:

Memorandum

Effective June 7, 1993, Sabine County, will through an order signed by the County Judge, implement a Pre-Trial Release Bond Program. A copy of the order is attached for your review.

The program is applicable to all Class "A" and "B" misdemeanors. Bonds shall be set at a minimum of \$3,000.00. A larger Bond may be set at the Magistrates discretion.

This program is applicable to all residents of The State of Texas who may be subject to a bond in Sabine County. Again, discretion is left to the appropriate magistrate to exercise proper judgement.

Lisa Sepulvado has been appointed Director, PTR Personal Bond Office.

If implemented and utilized properly, this program should affectively reduce jail prisoner days, thereby reducing cost, provide additional revenues to the County and reduce the arrestee's cost for bond.

We request that absolutely no budget cuts be made in our local County Sherriifs Department Budget. We support the Law Enforcement policies of this County, and, we believe that a substantial increase should be given to and for local Law Enforcement.

While our permanent residents only number approximately 6500 registered voters each weekend finds a substantial increase in the number of County Tax Paying part-time residents, which swells the numbers most probably to triple the daily regular residents.
