Agenda item #5 Judge Hyden made a motion to appoint Dr. Grover Winslow as County Health Officer for a 2 year period. Commissioner Cox second. All voted for.

Agenda item #7 Judge Hyden made the motion to accept the preliminary drawings of the Courthouse Annex. Commissioner Clark second. All voted for.

Agenda item #6 Mr. Isaac Hawkins and Mr. Larry Trekell, with the Forest Service, met with the Court to discuss the permitting system the County is implementing. There was not any action taken.

Agenda item #3 County Vehicles Judge Hyden made a motion to continue operating just as they are. Commissioner Clark second. All voted for. This is to be on the next August 9th agenda for further discussion.

Agenda item #2 Sheriff Bradberry made the recommendation of Jim Campbell as Peace Officer for Solid Waste and Heavy Equipment Permitting. He stated that Jim is qualified. If the person is to be commissioned by the Sheriff's department, the sheriff would like to have the final approval. There are two other qualified people working at the Sheriff's Department, Jamie Williams and Wendell Thomas. These two men are not interested in part time work. Commissioner Clark made a motion to go with the Sheriff's recommendation of Jim Campbell. Commissioner Cox second. All voted for.

Commissioner Cox made a motion to adjourn. Judge Hyden state "Court Adjourned".

Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

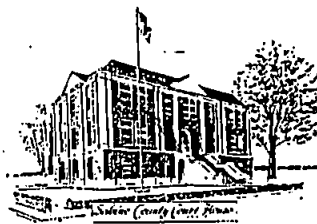

Dear Commissioners:

Since it has been almost nine months since our original quote and since several additions have been made and since we have gathered the radios and have inventoried them, I thought I ought to requote this project. As presently planned your finished radio system will consist of one repeater north of Milam, one base at the barn in Hemphill, 12 mobiles (four with two frequency capability) and one Sheriff's car with your channel installed.

All of the following assumes that the radio equipment is in good working order and that no parts or significant service has to be added to them. If it does we will provide this at our usual labor rate of \$50 per hour plus parts. We will let you know if this is becoming a large amount of additional expense.

The original quoted prices (reference letter dated December 10, 1992) remain the same namely:

You have already paid your fee to the FCC and AASHTO, the frequency coordinating body. We sent a work order to you dated 3/26/93 for our work to obtain a license for you. Would you please sign that work order and send it back so that we may invoice the county for this work. I have attached a copy of the work order. The original estimate of this cost (government fees and our charge) was \$300.

Convert repeater to the new frequency pair.....\$550

Convert eleven (11) GE MASTR II mobiles to the new frequency pair.
At \$185 each the total cost for this line item is \$2,035

Convert one (1) Motorola Mocom 70 to the new frequency pair\$150

Installation in 12 vehicles at your barn in Hemphill will be about \$100 per vehicle. We may have to charge more if the installations are unusual or if we have to perform the installations at various parts of the county. We charge \$50 per hour. Total estimated.....\$1200

If we supply the antennas, the cost is \$26 for a quarter wave unity gain design and \$42 for a 3 dB design. We would suggest the 3 dB design since the geographic area you wish to cover is so large. Please let us know what you wish to do. We will have to order them.

Since our original quote the following changes have been made:

Four (4) MASTR II mobiles will have a second channel, the Sheriff's frequency. Cost to convert a second set of crystals is \$97 per radio.
Total cost for four is.....\$388

A base station will be set up at the barn. We will convert one Motorola Mocom 70 desk-top base station to both the new Commissioner frequency pair and the Sheriff's frequency pair. We will tune it up, check it out, provide a directional antenna and transmission line and install all of the above for.....\$620

Convert a set of crystals to the Commissioner's frequency for one Mocom 70 which is already installed in a Sheriff's car. Install them in the car in Hemphill and check and retune the radio if necessary...\$104

The following items are missing from the radios we have in our possession. If you can locate some of these we will not have to order them. Please let us know as soon as possible. All of the prices are for used equipment and are estimates. We haven't located all of these items yet.

Two control heads for the MASTR II	price each is \$90\$180
Two microphones for the MASTR II	price each is \$33 \$66
Three speakers for the MASTR II	price each is \$22 \$66
Five control cables for the MASTR II	each is \$65\$325
Four speaker/ignition sense cables	each is \$20 \$80
Four CTCSS tone boards	price each is \$58\$232

The control heads which you provided to us are multi-frequency, scan heads. Our experience with this head tells us that it may prove to be unreliable due to its complexity and age. The four heads we will supply will be much more simple but still adequate for your single frequency radios and much more reliable.

Please let us know what you wish to do about the antennas and the items missing from the radios. Call if you have any questions. If there is any misunderstanding let me know. The crystals have already been ordered.

Dear Sir,

We would like to thank you for allowing Neches Communications to survey your communications needs. After looking at your present equipment, we would like to suggest the following:

A. Convert your repeater station to a new frequency pair.

This will require changing the transmit and receive crystals, tuning the transmitter and receiver and tuning the duplexer. We will also have to apply for a new license.

Cost of changing the repeater to the new frequency will be \$550.00 assuming that the repeater station is in operating condition.

Cost for the license application and coordination fees will be approximately \$300.00.

B. Convert the General Electric Master II mobile radio to the new frequency.

This will require changing the transmit and receive frequency elements, alignment of the transmitter and receiver, and installation of a tone encoder.

Cost of the above will be \$185.00 per unit, assuming that the units are in operating condition.

C. Convert the Motorola Mocom-70 mobile radio to the new frequency.

This will require changing the transmit and receive frequency elements, alignment of the transmitter and receiver.

Cost of the above will be \$150.00 per unit, assuming the units are in operating condition.

We would like to further note that when we were in Hemphill, we mentioned the possibility of using the repeater on the existing frequency. However, we later found that the new sheriff system uses one half of the old frequency pair, making it impossible to use the existing frequency without interfering with the new system.

The above quote includes the cost of one trip from our shop to your repeater site. If an additional trip is required, time and mileage would be approximately \$310.00 for one man. The cost of the mobile re-frequency and checkout assumes we would do this in our shop. The radios would be shipped to us and back to you. One of our technicians lives in Jasper so we could transport them from there. Installation of the mobiles would be approximately \$100.00 per radio. Antennas are \$35.00 for a quarter wave model.

As for a time frame, it would take approximately 90 days to get a license for the new system. It would only take a few weeks to receive the crystals for the new frequency and get the system up and running.
