Meeting called to order by Judge Hyden; Brother Clarence Howell led opening prayer.

In regular business, Judge Hyden informed the court no later than first meeting in October court must appoint members to Sabine County Appraisal Board. County is currently represented by Dianne Husband and Tracy Lane. Mrs. Husband does not wish to continue as representative, and our current Tax Assessor/Collector, Tammy Reeves, would like to be appointed. This will be an agenda item in October.

Commissioner Lynn Smith made motion to approve Extension activity report. Commissioner Clark seconded, and motion carried.

#2 - Resolution in Support of Community Block Grant Application: Motion made by Commissioner Lynn Smith, seconded by Commissioner Chester Cox, to approve resolution. Motion carried. This grant is through DECOG, and is approved on Site Sewage Facilities, and is for Thomas Johnson Community.

#3 - No Action

#4 - Toledo Village # II - Earl Winfrey and Raymond Anderson were present thanking court for help received on streets in their Subdivision. See attached letter.

#5 - Line item transfer, Prct. 2: Motion made by Judge Hyden to approve line item transfers as submitted by Commissioner Smith. Commissioner Clark seconded, and motion carried.

#6 - Motion made by Commissioner Keith Clark to accept budget and allow County Judge, County Clerk, and County Treasurer to so certify this is the budget for fiscal year 1993-1994. Commissioner Chester Cox seconded, and all 5 members of court voted for. Motion carried.

#7 - Policy and Procedure Manual: Judge Hyden made motion to amend Section 4 of Payroll Records: Time Sheet to read: "After review all time sheets must be signed by supervisor and submitted to the County Treasurer by the first working day after the end of the pay period." Commissioner Smith seconded, and motion carried.

#8 - Consider Certified signatures on Petition to place Unit Road system on November, 1993 General Election Ballot: We need 315 signatures; 665 names have been verified. Judge Hyden made motion court accept and recognize petition as signed and submitted by registered voters of County and certified by Voter Registrar of County, Mrs. Tammy Reeves in amount of 665 signatures. There being 315 signatures required to place it on the ballot; such petition has been received by this Court as certified by voter registrar, and question be placed on the



Minutes of the last four meetings were approved as read.




Commissioner Clark made motion to pay accounts and salaries. Judge Hyden seconded, and motion carried.



Dear Mr. Hess:

We received the report of investigation of the referenced matter from our District 6 office and have reviewed it in the light of the Texas Water Code and Texas Water Commission (TWC) Rules. The report indicated that the two culverts under the road between yours and the Wallace properties were filled with dirt. You stated that the blockage causes the water of heavy rainfall to flood your hay field. It was determined that water flowing in a drainage ditch of the road was the source of the overflow.

The TWC has certain regulatory authority in regard to water flowing in streams. However, water flowing in ditches is considered to be diffused surface water, which is not subject to regulation. Therefore, we anticipate no further action by the TWC in regard to your request. Since overflow of the road would have the potential to damage the road, you may want to contact the County Commissioner about the matter. Also, if you believe you have suffered damages, you may wish to consider private legal action under Texas Water Code Section 11.086 (copy enclosed).

EXTRACT FROM THE TEXAS WATER CODE

Section 11.086. Overflow Caused by Diversion of Water

11

(a) No person may divert or impound the natural flow of surface waters in this state, or permit a diversion or impounding by him to continue, in a manner that damages the property of another by the overflow of the water diverted or impounded.

(b) A person whose property is injured by an overflow of water caused by an unlawful diversion or impounding has remedies at law and in equity and may recover damages occasioned by the overflow.

(c) The prohibition of Subsection (a) of this section does not in any way affect the construction and maintenance of levees and other improvements to control floods, overflows, and freshets in rivers, creeks, and streams or the construction of canals for conveying water for irrigation or other purposes authorized by this code. However, this subsection does not authorize any person to construct a canal, lateral canal, or ditch that obstructs a river, creek, bayou, gully, slough, ditch, or other well-defined natural drainage.

(d) Where gullies or sloughs have cut away or intersected the banks of a river or creek to allow floodwaters from the river or creek to overflow the land nearby, the owner of the flooded land may fill the mouth of the gullies or sloughs up to the height of the adjoining banks of the river or creek without liability to other property owners.

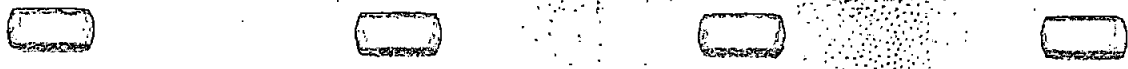

A G R E E M E N T
(FARM-TO-MARKET ROAD PROGRAM)

THIS AGREEMENT, is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State" and The County of Sabine, Texas, acting by and through its duly authorized officers, hereinafter called the "County".

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, the State is empowered under existing law to construct and operate the State Highway System for public use and benefit; and

WHEREAS, the State and the County desire that County Road (CR) 369 be designated Farm-to-Market Road (FM) 2343 and placed on the State Highway System from the limits of the existing FM 2343 to the Newton County Line, as shown in "Exhibit A", to be hereinafter identified as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, the County has offered to participate in the development and construction of the Project by providing the necessary right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, on the 30 day of September, 1993 the Sabine County Commissioners Court passed Resolution No. 9-30, attached hereto and identified as "Exhibit B", authorizing the County's participation in the development of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the State will prepare the construction plans, fund and let the construction contract, provide the construction inspection, and assume the responsibility for the maintenance of the completed facility; and

WHEREAS, the State and the County are statutorily authorized under Article 6673c, V.T.C.S. to enter into this agreement for the purposes defined herein;

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A G R E E M E N T

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

1. CONTRACT PERIOD

This agreement becomes effective upon final execution by the State and shall terminate upon final completion of the Project or unless terminated or modified as hereinafter provided.

2. SCOPE OF PROJECT

A. The State and the County agree that the scope of the Project shall be limited to the scope authorized by the Texas Transportation Commission.

B. The Project will be designated a part of the State Highway System as a FARM-TO-MARKET ROAD; however any existing county road within the limits of the Project will not be designated or incorporated therein prior to the State's award of the construction contract.

C. The County will continue to provide maintenance for all county roads within the limits of the Project until the State's award of the construction contract.

3. ACQUISITION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY

The County shall assume all costs and perform all necessary requirements to provide to the State title to the desired right-of-way required for the construction of the Project, which title shall be acceptable to the State. The County must comply with the requirements of Title III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, Title 42 U.S.C.A. Section 4601, et seq., except those portions relating to incidental expenses incurred by the property owners in conveying the right-of-way to the State.

Documentation to support such compliance must be maintained and must be made available to the State and its representatives for review and inspection. The County shall secure and provide the State easements over any other land in addition to normal right-of-way as may be indicated on the approved right-of-way map. The State will provide the County standard conveyance forms used by the

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State in acquiring highway right-of-way and such forms will be used by the County in conveying title to the State. Title to the acquired right-of-way shall be secured in the name of the State or should be conveyed to the State by the County if previously acquired in the name of the County. Any deletions, additions or modifications of the forms must be approved in writing by the State. The County will be responsible for any additional right-of-way required by the State for the completion of the Project.

4. RIGHT-OF-WAY DESCRIPTION

The State shall assume all costs in preparing right-of-way maps, property descriptions and other data as needed to properly describe the right-of-way which the County is to acquire and provide to the State. The right-of-way maps and property descriptions shall be submitted to the County for use in acquiring the necessary right-of-way. Tracings of the right-of-way maps shall be retained by the State for its permanent records.

5. RELOCATION ASSISTANCE

The State shall assume all costs of providing relocation assistance as may be determined to be eligible under the Relocation Assistance Program. The State will comply with Title II of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, Title 42 U.S.C.A. Section 4601, et seq.

6. UTILITY ADJUSTMENTS/RELOCATIONS

If the required right-of-way encroaches upon existing utilities located on the utility companies right-of-way and the proposed highway construction requires the adjustment, removal or relocation of such utility facilities, the State will establish the necessary utility work and notify the County of this necessity. The County will be responsible for all costs associated with the adjustment, removal or relocation of such utility facilities, and such adjustment, removal or relocation shall be in accordance with applicable State law, regulations, policies and procedures. In the event additional utilities are required to be adjusted, removed or relocated during the construction of the Project, the County will be responsible for all costs associated with the additional utility work.



7. ENVIRONMENTAL MITIGATION

A. The County will be responsible for the remediation of any underground storage tanks or hazardous materials sites that are identified on the property to be acquired as right-of-way for the proposed FM project. The County will assume all costs associated with the environmental remediation.

B. The State will be responsible for mitigation of project impacts that result from any agreements, permits and/or coordination that are necessary to complete the environmental and public involvement phases of the Project. The State will assume all costs associated with these requirements.

8. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STATE

A. The State shall assume all costs in preparing or causing to be prepared any necessary environmental documentation and conducting the appropriate public involvement, if necessary, as well as, preparing or causing to be prepared the Project's preliminary engineering necessary for the development of the plans, specifications and estimates (P.S. & E.). The P.S. & E. shall be developed in accordance with the State's Standard Specifications For Construction Of Highways, Streets And Bridges or its currently approved revisions.

B. The State shall advertise for construction bids, issue bid proposals, receive and tabulate the bids and award a contract for construction of the Project in accordance with existing procedures and applicable laws. Any field changes, supplemental agreements or additional work orders which may become necessary subsequent to the award of the construction contract shall be subject to the approval of the State.

C. The State will supervise and inspect all work performed by the construction contractor and will provide such engineering, inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the construction of the Project is accomplished in accordance with the approved P.S. & E.

D. Upon completion of the Project, the State will issue to the County a "Notification of Completion", acknowledging that the Project has been completed.

E. Upon completion of the Project, the State will assume responsibility for maintenance of the completed highway facilities.

9. CONTROL AND OWNERSHIP OF THE PROJECT

The development, construction and maintenance of the Project will be an integral part of the State Highway System and thus under the ownership, control and jurisdiction of the State. The State assumes full and complete control as to the construction and operation of the Project. The State does not purport to convey or assign any interest or right of ownership of the completed highway facility to the County, its successors or assigns. The Project may be modified, relocated, closed and/or removed at the State's sole discretion. The State will not be held responsible to the County for any reimbursement of funds in the event the Project is modified, relocated, closed and/or removed.

10. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Upon completion or termination of this agreement, all documents prepared by the County or furnished to the County by the State shall be delivered to and become the property of the State. All data prepared under this agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use.

11. TERMINATION

A. This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:

- (1) By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties.
- (2) By the State upon determination that construction of the Project is not feasible or is not in the best interest of the State and the traveling public.
- (3) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligation as set forth herein.

B. The termination of this agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations and liabilities of the State and County under this agreement. If the potential termination of this agreement is due to the failure of the County to fulfill its contractual obligations as set forth herein, the State will notify the County that possible breach of contract has occurred. The County should make every effort to remedy the breach as outlined by the State within a period mutually agreed upon by both parties.

12. INDEMNIFICATION

To the extent permitted by law, the County shall indemnify and save harmless the State, its officers, employees, agents and contractors from all claims and liabilities due to the activities of the County, its officers, employees, agents and contractors performed under this agreement and which result from an error, omission or negligent acts of the County, its officers, employees, agents or contractors. Additionally, to the extent permitted by law, the County shall save harmless the State, its officers, employees, agents and contractors from any and all expenses, including attorneys fees and court costs which may be incurred by the State in litigation or otherwise resisting said claim or liabilities which might be imposed on the State as the result of such activities by the County, its officers, employees, agents or contractors.

13. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character, agreement provisions or obligations of the parties hereto shall be enacted by written amendment executed by both the County and the State.

14. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

15. NOTICES

All notices to either party by the other required under this agreement shall be delivered personally or sent by certified or U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such party at the following respective addresses:

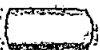
