Judge Hyden called the meeting to order and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #8- Receive Bids-Fuel Appropriate Action

Two bids were received. One bid for Lovelady Oil Company, Center, Tx. for 87% Octane gasoline and #2 diesel fuel, 12¢ above rack price plus any applicable taxes. Second bid was from Terrill Petroleum Company, Inc., Hemphill, Tx. for 87%, 89% and 92% Octane and #2 diesel, 9¢ above rack price plus 20¢ state excise tax.

Commissioner Clark moved to purchase fuel from Terrill Petroleum. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Bid for Terrill Petroleum is accepted. Bid for Lovelady Oil Company is rejected. See attached copies of bids.

Agenda item #16-Pay Accounts and Salaries

The only accounts and salaries considered at this time is R&B.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to pay accounts and salaries in the R&B departments. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #6- Receive Bids and Select County Depository 1995-1996

Two bids were received. First bid was from First State Bank, Hemphill. Mr. Lee Dutton and Mr. Bob Russell were present to present the bid for the bank. Second bid was from Pineland State Bank. There was not a representative from the bank to present the bid.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to continue with First State Bank of Hemphill as the County Depository for the next two years, 1995-1996/ Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copies of bids.

Judge Hyden stated that in executive session a number of items were discussed with the County's Attorney regarding current and pending litigation, more particularly the litigation that is pending with the Terry Lynn Vaughn suit against the County. No action was taken during executive session and there is no action that is required to be taken at this point.

Agenda item #12-Confirm Appointment of Greg Cohrs to 911 Advisory Board

Judge Hyden moved to confirm Greg Cohrs to the 911 Advisory Board. Commissioner Clark seconded. Judge Moved that this item be tabled at this time. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #13-Hill County Road-35 MPH

Commissioner Will Smith stated that he would like to get this matter resolved today. He and Commissioner Ellison checked the road out and he feels that a speed limit on the road as requested by Mr. Douglas Zentmeyer is appropriate but that some other request and statements by Mr. Zentmeyer are not accurate.

Commissioner Will Smith moved to set a speed limit of 35 MPH on the Hill Country Road. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #9- Discussion: Appropriate Action U. S. Forest Service

Ron Haugen, District Ranger with the U. S, Forest Service, met with the Court to discuss the changes taking place within the Forest Service nationwide which affects the Forest Service here. They have had cutbacks in their budget causing cutbacks in personnel. The offices in San Augustine and Sabine Counties are likely to be consolidated and Sabine County is looking favorable for the location of the consolidated office. They are wanting to be more visible to the public, possibly an information center, to serve the public better in giving information on all points of interest that is available in East Texas. There are a lot of opportunities in this area. This is along the same lines as the County is working.

Also discussed was Pct. 2 barn in Yellowpine. This property is leased from the Forest Service by Commissioner Lynn Smith, Commissioner Pct. #2. Mr. Haugen suggested that the County attempt to transfer ownership of this property. Judge Hyden told the Court that with Commissioner Lynn Smith and Ranger Ron Haugen's permission, he would check into this.

Sheriff Bradberry ask Mr. Haugen about the Co-op agreement between the Sheriff's department, Sabine County and the Forest Service. Mr. haugen said that they had just hired a new law enforcement officer and he does not know the statis of the Co-op agreement.

Commissioner Lynn Smith told Mr. Haugen that there are some really old cementaries in this County surrounded by Forest Service land. He has written letters asking for permission to improve the roads into some of these cementaries and has not had a response. Mr. Haugen said that he would check into this.

Agenda item #12- Judge Hyden moved that this motion be removed from the table and placed back before the Court. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. This is an advisory, non-voting position. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #1- General Business

Minutes of the February 13th regular Court meeting were approved as read with the insertion of anticipation notes under agenda item #12.



ELECTRONIC JURY SELECTION

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 2100a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes and Article 62.011 of the Government Code, the undersigned, being the District Judges of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby recommend that the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, adopt the plan attached hereto as Exhibit "A" for the selection of persons for jury service by mechanical or electronic means

amending and jurors can be selected more efficiently.

It is therefore recommended to the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, by the judges of the District Court of Sabine County, Texas, by the authority of Article 21.00a, Vernon's Texas Civil Status, and Article 62.011 of the Texas Government Code, that the following plan for the selection of person for jury service be adopted:

2) SOURCE OF NAMES

The source from which names shall be taken shall be the current voter registration lists, all citizens with a valid Texas driver's license in Sabine County, Texas and citizens with a valid Identification issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety and entered on the juror selection computer program which has been prepared for such purpose by PRITCHARD & ABBOT, INC., of Fort Worth, Texas.

3) PROGRAM FOR RANDOM SELECTION

In preparing the Computer for juror selection, PRITCHARD & ABBOT, INC., has devised a system which will insure the fair, impartial and objective selection of prospective jurors by use of a random number generating process, which is described as follows:

The procedure implemented for the random selection of a jury panel is based on random number generator which is fully described in Semi-Numerical Algorithms, pages 170-173 by Donald Keuth. The process of selecting jurors is initiated with a "seed" (a unique number used to initiate the random number algorithm) which is computed as the integer sum of DATE AND time, where:

DATE is the date (MMDDYY) on which the selection process is being executed. MM is the month of the year, DD is the day of the month, and YY is the last two digits of the year, e.g., 123177 would be used if the selection were taking place on December 31, 1977.

TIME IS THE TIME OF DAY (HHMMSS) in which the selection process is being executed. HH is the hour of the day (ranging from 00 to 23), MM is the minute of the hour, and SS is the seconds of the minute. For example, 133242 would be used if the selection were taking place at 42 seconds after 1:32 P.M. The seed for the second and subsequent random numbers to be generated is the random number derived from the previous iteration. This process continues until the specified number of jurors have been selected.

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4) OFFICIAL IN CHARGE

The Clerk of the District Court of Sabine County, Texas and the Clerk of the County Court of Sabine County, Texas herein called the "Clerks", is designated as the officials to be in charge of the selection process, and shall have the duties and authority as set forth herein.

5) ACCESS TO VOTER REGISTRATION LIST

The Tax Assessor-Collector of Sabine County, Texas as part of her present, regular duties, shall update the voter registration list to be used in this plan, to assure as current a list as possible. Other than at such times as a random list of prospective jurors is obtained from the voter registration list, the Tax Assessor-Collector, or her designate, shall be for updating purposes only. The Tax Assessor-Collector gains access to the particular security code issued to the Tax Assessor-Collector for this purpose. Such security code is in the sole possession of the Tax Assessor-Collector of Sabine County, Texas.

6) PRESIDING JUDGE

The District Judges of the 1ST and 273RD Judicial District Courts shall have such duties and authority as herein provided, and also such authority as approved in Articles 2094 and 2103 inclusive, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, except as modified by his order under authority of 2100a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes.

7) PROCESSING THE PROSPECTIVE JUROR LIST

From time to time, as needed during the year, the District Judge or the County Judge, and the Clerk (or his/her designee), shall assemble for the purpose of activating the computer juror selection program, thereby producing a List of Prospective Jurors. A unique security code shall be issued to each of the above named officers and protected by him/her to insure the integrity of the juror selection process. The program cannot be activated on the computer unless three security codes are properly entered, as herein set forth.

The process for activation the...

3) The date and time to appear on the summons.

Once this information has been provided, the computer program, using random selection process described in Section 4 above, will select the list of prospective jurors, print the summons for each juror and a list of the prospective jurors, at which time the jury selection process is complete.

8) SELECTION OF JURORS FOR PARTICULAR WEEKS

Once the Prospective Juror List has been printed by the above described process, the computer company will deliver such Prospective Jury List to the District Clerk of the County Clerk as soon as possible. The District Clerk or the County Clerk will cause to be addressed a questionnaire card for each person on the Prospective Juror List.

At the direction of the District Judge, the Sheriff will mail out by First Class Mail such number of the Jury Questionnaire Cards as is necessary to insure a sufficient number of jurors to meet the demands of the various courts using this service. At least seven days prior to the date such persons are to begin such jury service, a true and complete written list showing the names and addresses of the persons summoned to begin jury service on a particular date shall be filed of record with the District Clerk and County Clerk.

9) POSTPONED JURORS

The names of persons previously called for jury service whose service has been postponed to a later date, shall be added by the Jury Clerk and/or Jury Bailiff, to the list of persons to be called at such later date, and such completed list shall be filed with the District Clerk or County Clerk seven days before such date.

10) ADDITIONAL JURORS

Whenever the District Judge or County Judge determines that the number of jurors previously selected for any designated date is insufficient, he shall direct the Clerk to prepare a supplemental list containing a specified number of persons to be called for jury service in addition to those previously selected.

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11) SUPERVISION BY DISTRICT JUDGE

The District Judge shall have supervision and control over the general panel of persons called for jury service. He shall cause all persons selected, summoned and appearing for jury service as above provided to be sworn and interrogated concerning their qualifications as provided by law, shall pass on their excuses, shall give them such instructions as may be required or appropriate before they are assigned to any particular court for duty, and shall cause them to be sworn to make true answers to all questions put to them on voir dire concerning their qualifications to serve as jurors in any particular case.

12) SUPERVISION BY COUNTY JUDGE

The County Judge shall have supervision and control over the general panel of persons called for jury service. He shall cause all persons selected, summoned and appearing for jury service as above provided to be sworn and interrogated concerning their qualifications and excuses, shall give them such instructions as may be required or appropriate before they are assigned to any particular court for duty, and shall cause them to be sworn to make true answers to all questions put to them on voir dire concerning their qualifications to serve as jurors in any particular case.

13) JURORS USED INTERCHANGEABLY

The jurors so selected, qualified, instructed and sworn shall constitute a general panel for the week for service as jurors in all District, County and Justice Courts in Sabine County, Texas, and shall be used interchangeably in all of said Courts. The Jury Bailiff, acting under instructions of the Presiding Judge, shall assign such jurors out in panels to the different courts as requested by judges of said courts.

14) RECONSTITUTION OF JURY WHEELS

The District Clerk shall reconstitute the jury wheel on January 15th and on this date each year thereafter.

POLICY ON
DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE

Purpose: To provide a drug-free workplace.

Policy Statement: The unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispersing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in any and all facilities/workplaces of Sabine County including but not limited to all buildings, vehicles, yards and grounds.

Policy Distribution: All employees must sign a statement that they have read and understand the policy and actions which will be taken if a violation occurs and that they have been provided a copy of the policy.

Action For the violation: Any employee found to be in violation of this policy shall be terminated immediately and may not be re-employed by Sabine County for at least 3 years and only then if proof is shown they have satisfactorily participated in and completed a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, Local Health, Law Enforcement, or other appropriate agency.

Drug-Free Awareness Program:

Sabine County shall maintain an on going drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:

- . The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace
- . Sabine County's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace
- . Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs
- . The penalty that will be imposed upon employees for drug

conviction; and

- Sabine County shall notify the granting Agency in writing within 10 calendar days after receiving notice as set out in the immediate previous paragraph, from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction
- Immediate termination of an employee found to be in violation of this policy
