Monday, July 8, 1996, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order and Will Smith, Sr. led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes of the June 24th regular Court meeting as written. Commissioner Ellison seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-911

John Yeager, company name of AIMS out of Austin, Texas, met with the Court to ask for an additional ninety days on his contract for the addressing for 911. He stated that most of the foundation work has been done, but because of a delay in getting information and a devastating fire in their office, the job is not completed. Mr. Yeager told the Court that he feels that it will take another company more than the ninety days that he has requested just to get up to where they are now.

Judge Leath, Commissioner Lynn Smith and Commissioner Clark stated that they would place a lot of stock in a recommendation from Bob Russell. He has been working on the 911 committee and is probably the most knowledgeable person in the County on this project.

Bob Russell spoke to the Court briefly about the beginning of the 911 committee and where the project is now. He stated that he did not come prepared to give a recommendation to the Court. He said that he would be prepared and give a recommendation at the next regular Court meeting.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to table this item until the July 22th regular Court meeting. Commissioner Butch Ellison seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #10-Tony Greer -- Presentation of Promotional Proposal by Tourism Commission for Funding

Tony Greer, president of the Tourism Commission, presented a list of request that was made to the Tourism Commission and which the Commission is recommending for approval by the Commissioners' Court. They are as follows: Sabine County Chamber of Commerce, \$705.00; Milam Settlers Day Organization, \$3,271.00; Hemphill Breakfast Lions Club, \$2,500.00: Texas Toledo Bend Association, \$21,000.00. This will be funded out of the hotel/motel tax fund. See attached copy of requests.

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the proposals as presented by Tony Greer. Commissioner Will Smith seconded. All voted for.

Motion carried.

Agenda item #2-FM 2343 Road Donation

Commissioner Lynn Smith informed the Court that there is a forty-eight acre tract that the proposed FM road, #2343, goes across that has undivided heirs. Sabine County is one of those heirs because we already have the right of way in the existing County road. What we are doing is donating our portion to the state, which is 0.5971 of an acre, for a portion of the right of way for the FM road, #2343.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to donate the 0.5971 acre to the Texas Department of Transportation for a right of way for FM 2343. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of donation.

Agenda item #4-County Road Mileage

Judge Leath informed the Court that he has received a letter from the Texas Department of Transportation asking for an update of the County road mileage records for the year, 1996. They currently have the County roads listed at 511 miles. He ask the Court if this figure needs to be readjusted or can it just be confirmed. Our reply has to be back to Austin by August 2nd.

Commissioner Clark stated that he feels that the amount of miles needs to be adjusted. The rest of the Court agreed with Commissioner Clark. This item is to be placed on the next regular Court agenda.

Agenda item #5-Appointment for Board of Trustees "Burke Center"

Mr. Joe Fomby from Shelby County was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mitchell Jeton and now it is time to appoint someone for a full term. The term will start September 1, 1996 and will expire August 31, 1998. The Burke Center is recommending that Mr. Fomby be appointed for the full term. The person selected will represent Sabine, San Augustine and Shelby Counties and has to be voted on by each respective Court.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to appoint Mr. Joe Fomby for the full two year term to the board of trustees for the Burke Center. Commissioner Ellison seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #6-Postage Machine

Pitney Bowes, owner of the postage machine and scale that is currently being used by the County, is recommending that the County purchase a maintenance agreement with them on three different machines, two postage machines and a postage scale for a total of \$394.00.

Judge Leath stated that he has checked with the Treasurer and they could not find where the County has hardly been out any money for maintenance on the machines.

Commissioner Will Smith moved to table this item to the next regular Court meeting. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #7-Court Reporter Insurance

Judge Leath said that he has received a request from the Jasper County Auditor for Sabine County to pay their share of the cost of insurance for District Court Judge Golden's court reporter, Jo Anna Johnson. The total annual cost is \$6,022.32. Sabine County's share is \$927.00. This cost reflects the cost for employee and dependents which Jasper County pays. Sabine County pays for employee coverage, but does not pay for dependent coverage.

The Court feels that we should not have to pay for the dependent coverage since we do not pay it for our employees.

Judge Leath moved to negotiate with the Jasper County Auditor's office to pay the percentage of the Court Reporter's insurance applied to Sabine County's insurance rates and for the County Judge do the negotiating. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-ADAC -- Donation

Jan Hensarling with the Alcohol & Drug Abuse Council of Deep East Texas, met with the Court requesting a \$1,000.00 donation. They cover a twelve county deep East Texas region. Ms. Hensarling told the Court that they are a non-profit organization and that their funding has been cut forty-seven percent. They are asking for a donation of \$1,000.00 in areas that do not have service sites and \$2,000.00 in areas that have service sites. Every effort is being made to continue services. Forty-six presentations were made in the schools in Sabine County last year.

Commissioner Lynn Smith told Ms. Hensarling that the County is continually facing state and federal funds being cut and the cost being passed down to the Counties. He stated that he has no doubt that this is a good program. But, to fund all these programs, taxes would have to be raised and he is not sure that the people would understand that. Also, come first of the year, he is quite sure that the County will have a full time drug awareness program within our Sheriff's department. We will have to fund this program. With all this in mind, he is not willing for our County to pay the \$1,000.00.

Ms. Hensarling stated that they really do understand and as long as it is possible, they will continue to have a site in Jasper and Center where individuals from this area can go.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to not pay the \$1,000.00 requested from the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Council. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #9-Election Judges and Alternates for November General Election

County Clerk, Janice McDaniel, presented a list of names for recommendation to the Court for appointment of election judges and alternates for the upcoming November General Election. Also, a list of names was presented by Clarence Noring, chairman of the

Sabine County Republican party for workers.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to approve the list recommended by the County Clerk, in the order that the Clerk has listed, with Gayle Ferguson as early voting judge and Jesse Huffman as alternate. Also, with the understanding that these judges be encouraged to use individuals from Mr. Noring's list in the event that workers are needed. Commissioner Ellison seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copies of both list.

Court recessed 10:00 a.m.

Court reconvened 10:18.a.m.

Agenda item #12-Rock Pit

Commissioner Clark stated that he still feels that the cost is getting higher and we are getting deeper in debt.

Commissioner Clark moved that the County get out of the rock pit operation effective September 30, 1996. Commissioner Ellison seconded.

Commissioner Will Smith ask Commissioner Clark what kind of plan do we have.

Commissioner Clark replied "go out for bids from other vendors for the purchase of rock with a year contract".

Judge Leath stated that he basically agrees with the motion. But, there are many factors that have to be considered. Some of those are, the amount of appropriation of money to continue the lease purchase agreement and what it may cost to get out of that contract, personnel that works at the rock pit, contract with Mr. John Dent as per power of attorney for Ms. Ollie Dent. He stated that he is willing to work out a plan to present to the Court at the next regular Court meeting, but he would require some help from the Court.

Judge Leath amended the motion as follows: to proceed with plans for the closure of the rock pit after two weeks of investing and planning for actual withdrawal from the operation and that these plans specifically include the possibilities of expense connected with the disposal of the equipment as the contract requires. Notification has to be done by August 1st. He just wants to get out orderly and not be detrimental to the County.

Commissioner Will Smith stated that if this is a workable plan, Sabine County will not be stuck with a big debt, he will support it.

Commissioner Ellison seconded the amendment. All voted for the amendment except for Commissioner Lynn Smith and he abstained. Amendment carried.

Commissioner Lynn Smith stated that he still believes in the rock pit. That he had planned on a five year plan, but that there has not been harmony from the beginning although there was a unanimous vote to start the rock pit. He is opposed to closing the rock pit, but if that is what the Court wants, then close we will. His main concern is the employees working at the pit.

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Judge Leath stated that he feels that the rock pit was started in good faith by honorable men and continued to be operated in good faith. That there has not been any intentional coverup of cost.

Judge Leath called for a vote on the motion as amended.

All voted for the motion as amended except for Commissioner Lynn Smith who opposed the amended motion. Motion carried.

Back to agenda item #2-FM 2343 Road Donation

Commissioner Lynn Smith informed the Court that there is a water well that has to be replaced in obtaining the right of way for this road. He has been trying to get a well driller for several weeks and has finally, a few days ago, been able to get an estimate from one, but it was to late to get on the agenda for today. The well is going to cost approximately \$3,000.00 to \$3,500.00. The man that gave an estimate is a licensed water well driller and is going to cap the existing well also. Commissioner Lynn Smith just wants to know if there is any opposition from the Court for him to proceed with this.

The reply from the Court was no.

Agenda item 13-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Commissioner Clark moved to pay accounts and salaries. Commissioner Ellison seconded. All voted for. Motion carries.

Commissioner Clark moved to adjourn. Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. Meeting adjourned.





SHORT FORM EVALUATION REPORT

NEIGHBORHOOD AND AREA ANALYSIS:

The subject property is located in a rural area in southern Sabine County about ten miles south of Hemphill and two miles north of the Newton County line. The predominant land use in the area is timberland, much of it within the Sabine National Forest. There are a few rural homesites in the area.

SONING, EIGHEST AND BEST USE AND SITE OF SUBJECT PROPERTY (EXPLAIN IF DIFFERENT FOR WHOLE PROPERTY AND PART TAKEN):

There is no zoning in the rural areas of Sabine County. The highest and best use of the whole property would be for timber production. A tract similar in size to the part taken would usually have a highest and best use as a rural homesite. However, given the remote location, lack of utilities, and large proportion of low lying land the part taken probably is most valuable as a part of the whole property.

GENERAL LEGAL AND PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF WHOLE PROPERTY:

The whole property is two tracts with a total area of 97.5 acres in the H.E. & W.T.R.R. Survey Abstract 326, Sabine County, Texas. The property is level to rolling timberland. Brushy Creek flows across the property and a county road crosses the property in a north-south direction.

GENERAL LEGAL AND PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF PART TAKEN:

See attached survey. A 5.5391 acre strip across the whole property including the existing county road. The part taken included the existing bridge across Brushy Creek which is located within a previously acquired easement. Most of the part taken appears to be low lying land within the Brushy Creek floodplain. No public utilities were noted extending to the part taken. The areas not cleared for the existing roadway are wooded, but there appears to be no significant amount of merchantable timber on the part taken.

EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS WITH RECONCILIATION

The whole property has an area of 97.5 acres. The part taken has an area of 5.5391 acres. Sale 3 is a tract similar in size to the part taken. Sales 1 and 2 are larger tracts.

The subject is in a somewhat remote location on a county road. No public utilities were noted in the vicinity of the part taken. Sales 1 and 3 have state highway frontage as well as county or FM road access. Sale 2 is on an FM road. All three sales have electricity and community water. Sales 1 and 3 were given a negative 35% adjustment for location and access. Sale 2 was given a negative 20% location/access adjustment.







VIEW ALONG EXISTING COUNTY ROAD LOOKING SOUTH FROM NORTH END OF PART TAKEN
