

Monday, May 12, 1997, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer. Judge Leath told Bro. Howell that the Court appreciates his participation in leading the Court in prayer before the meetings. It seems to make the meetings go easier.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the following Court meetings: April 28 regular session; April 28 special session; May 5 special session; May 5 emergency session. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-Determine Name for Rice/Sibley Creek Pct. #2

Commissioner Lynn Smith said that it has been called to his attention that approximately nine miles south of Hemphill, East of highway 87 on FM 2928, the second creek, the highway department has a sign "Rice Creek." The Rices' did use to live in this area, but deeds dating back as far as 1919 recognize this creek as "Sibley Creek." Even the Rice deeds recognize it as "Sibley Creek."

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to reaffirm this creek as "Sibley Creek" instead of "Rice Creek." Commissioner Will Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Judge Leath said that we would contact the highway department about changing the sign.

Agenda item #6-Public Hearing and Agenda item #7-911 Road Name Adoption

Judge Leath said that the only names being adopted today are the names showing on the map "Roadname Adoption - Final Phase I." These roads are county roads that intersect with state roads, farm to market roads and federal highways.

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the road names as they appear on this map. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. The map is on file in the plat records #234, County Clerk's office, Sabine County, Texas.

Agenda item #3-Temple-Inland, Logging Permit

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to continue this agreement with Temple-Inland. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of agreement.

Agenda item #4-Postage Machine - Pitney Bowes

Judge Leath told the Court that a representative from Pitney Bowes met with him about leasing a new postage machine. The new machine will have a digital meter which everyone will be required to go to soon. The price we are paying now is \$149.44 a month. The new machine will cost \$188.68 a month. We still have to pay for all repairs. These machines cannot be bought.

Commissioner Clark moved to lease the newer model postage machine. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #5-Brookeland Water Supply

Judge Leath told the Court that Brookeland Water Supply is asking for the Court's approval and support of the proposed Wastewater Collection and Treatment Facilities project.

Judge Leath moved to approve and support Brookeland Water Supply Corporation's attempt to get grant money to install water and waste treatments. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of letter.

Agenda item #9-Sell Surplus Equipment Pct. #2

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to advertise for bids to sale the following used equipment:

one (1) 13" motorgrader wheel

one (1) gradall bucket

one (1) copier-pct. #4

Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of bid notice. These bids will be due no later than 8:30 a.m. June 9, and will be opened during the regular Court meeting June 9.

Agenda item #10-Dangerous and Wild Animal Restrictions

Judge Leath said that the County has to either prohibit wild animals or adopt the rules set by the Parks and Wildlife. He said that the Parks and Wildlife recommend that the County adopt their rules. They said that the one facility in Hemphill that has wild animals has a good operation and meets all the rules. This would not effect her in any way.

Commissioner Dickerson moved to adopt the rules of the Parks and Wildlife. Commissioner Will Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #12-Election Results to Dis-incorporate the City of Bronson in 1993 - Ralph McBride

County Clerk, Janice McDaniel, told the Court that she has been ask for a copy of the minutes of Commissioners' Court where the election results to dis-incorporate the City of Bronson are recorded. Mrs. McDaniel said that she could not find where it had been recorded, and is asking the Court to accept the letter signed by Ralph McBride, former Mayor of Bronson confirming the election results of 1993.

Commissioner Dickerson moved to accept the letter from Ralph McBride, former Mayor of the City of Bronson, confirming the election results of 1993 to dis-incorporate the City of Bronson. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of letter.

Agenda item #11-Receive Proposals for Health Insurance

Two envelopes were received. One is from Bill Vrooman and one is from Texas Association of Counties. The envelope from Bill Vrooman contained two proposals: one from Lamar Life and one from Security Life. The envelope from Texas Association of Counties has a proposal from Blue Cross/Blue Shield which is our present carrier.

The Court will review these proposals and a decision will be made at the May 23 Commissioners Court meeting.

Judge Leath read a letter from Bounds Insurance Agency, Inc. and Metlife Insurance Agency. See attached copy of letter.

Agenda item #1 General Business

Judge Leath read over portions of the contract with Ameristat. See attached copy of contract.

Court recessed at 9:50 a.m.

Court reconvened at 10:20 a.m.

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the reports from the County Clerk and JP #2.

Commissioner Lynn Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item 14-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Commissioner Will Smith said that he is taking out the bill for Future Equipment for precinct #4.

The bill from the Sabine County Reporter to the Sheriff's office for \$30.00 was taken out. The Court said that this is not a County bill.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to pay salaries and the remaining accounts. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Commissioner Will Smith moved to adjourn. Commissioner Clark seconded. Meeting adjourned.

MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICE
PROVIDER AGREEMENT

This agreement ("Agreement") dated the 14th day of May, 1997 by and between Sabine County ("the County") and Laidlaw Medical Transportation, Inc., d.b.a. AmeriStat East Texas ("AmeriStat").

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

The purpose of this Agreement is to state the terms and conditions under which AmeriStat will provide 911 Emergency Medical coverage for Sabine County with appropriate personnel and equipment for transportation of patients.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. TERM

The term of the Agreement shall be for a period of two (2) years from the date indicated above and shall renew annually, thereafter, without further correspondence.

2. OBLIGATIONS OF AMERISTAT

- A. AmeriStat shall make available to the County two (2) Mobile Intensive Care ambulances to be used and posted in Sabine County as statistical data dictates. AmeriStat shall make available to Sabine County additional Mobile Intensive Care ambulances as needed for the use and benefit of the County's citizens.
- B. AmeriStat shall ensure that all company emergency response vehicles are staffed by a Texas Department of Health (TDH) certified Emergency Medical Technician and a Paramedic. AmeriStat shall ensure that such qualified personnel are available to provide emergency medical services at all times. All AmeriStat personnel must possess a valid Driver's License, and maintain a driving record that meets the standards of AmeriStat's Policies and Procedures (no "at-fault" accidents and two or less traffic violations within the past three years).
- C. AmeriStat agrees to keep record of transportation services provided in the County, including, but not limited to patient name and/or purpose of each trip, trip origination, trip destination and miles traveled.
- D. AmeriStat agrees to make every possible effort to offer employment to existing Life Rescue staff.
- E. AmeriStat is willing to honor and continue the existing subscription service of Life Rescue.
- F. AmeriStat will respond with the Sabine County Fire Department if requested by Fire Department Personnel.
- G. AmeriStat will provide ambulance service to any community events, at no charge, upon request.
- H. AmeriStat shall make available CPR and First Aid training to Sabine County Fire Department and any interested Sabine County citizens, at no charge. Within one year AmeriStat will be in position to provide Hazardous Material Training to Sabine County Fire Department Personnel.

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3. PROVIDER STATUS

The County agrees that as consideration to the terms contained herein, AmeriStat will be the exclusive 911 provider for all medical transportation services for its citizens, with the following exceptions:

- A. In the event that all resources are being utilized, other services may be called upon to respond.
- B. In the event of a natural disaster or other catastrophic event, AmeriStat reserves the right to utilize outside resources.

4. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

AmeriStat and the County agree under the terms of this Agreement that AmeriStat is an Independent contractor, and neither AmeriStat nor its employees are servants, agents, partners or employees of the County, and that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to create any agency, partnership relationship.

5. INDEMNIFICATION PROVISIONS

- A. AmeriStat shall defend, indemnify, and hold the County harmless from all claims, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys fees and costs (collectively "Claims"), arising out of any acts, errors or omissions of AmeriStat in the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, any Claims arising out of AmeriStat's provision of transportation services to the citizens, and AmeriStat's application and use and application and use of the policies, procedures and protocols. This provision shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- B. The County shall defend all suits brought upon such claims and pay all cost and expenses incidental thereto. The County shall have the right, at its own expense, to participate in the defense of any suit, without relieving AmeriStat of any obligation hereunder.
- C. The County will give AmeriStat prompt notice in writing of the institution of any suit or proceeding and permit AmeriStat to defend same, and will give all needed information to do so. AmeriStat will similarly give the County immediate notice of any suit or action filed or prompt notice of any claim arising out of the performance of the Agreement. AmeriStat shall furnish immediately to the County copies of all pertinent papers received by AmeriStat.

6. NAME CHANGE

This Agreement shall continue in force should a change in the name of either party occur.

7. MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT


This agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties and shall be modified only by an instrument in writing signed on behalf of each party hereto.

8. TERMINATION

Termination of the Agreement will only occur with at least ninety (90) days prior written notice given to the other party. Certified mail will be the proper method of notification. Termination of this Agreement shall have no effect upon the rights or obligations of the parties arising from transactions occurring prior to the effective date of such termination.



§ 12.601. Definition

(6) cheetahs;
(7) jaguars;
(8) hyenas;
(9) bears;
(10) lesser pandas;
(11) binturongs;
(12) wolves;
(13) apes;
(14) elephants; and
(15) rhinoceroses.

§ 12.602. Permit Required

(a) No person may possess a wild animal for breeding, exhibition, or personal use unless the person has a permit issued by the department.

(b) The commission by rule shall prescribe requirements under which a person may safely possess a wild animal for breeding, exhibition, or personal use.

(c) This section does not apply to a person licensed under other state or federal law to breed or exhibit a wild animal.

(b) The commission by rule may set collection and issuance fees for a license, stamp, tag, permit, or other similar item issued under any chapter of this code. The commission shall not set any collection or issuance fees for license deputies at amounts less than the amounts in effect on June 1, 1995. If a collection or issuance fee or other similar fee set by another section of this code conflicts with this section, the collection or

issuance fee set under the authority of this section prevails.

§ 12.703. Point-of-Sale System

(b) The department may designate an entity to install the system for the issuance of licenses, stamps, permits, tags, or other similar items. A designated entity may collect revenue for the department from license deputies.

(c) The commission by rule may set the amount of compensation for a point-of-sale entity. The compensation may include an amount to be retained by the entity from the fee collected for each item issued by the entity.

- (B) the serial number of the item sold;
- (C) the date of issuance; and
- (D) any other information required by the department; and

(3) perform any other function required by the license deputy's agreement with the department.

§ 12.705. License, Stamp, Permit, and Tag Sales Reports

RESTRICTED WILD ANIMALS PROCLAMATION

1. Introduction.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission in a regularly scheduled public hearing on January 25, 1990 adopted new rules §55.201-55.211 to 31 TAC, concerning permits to hold certain wild animals and establishing standards for the housing and transportation of certain wild animals without change to the proposed text published in the December 22, 1989 issue of the Texas Register (14 TexReg 6731). New legislation, H.B. 1687 Acts of the 71st Legislature, added certain wild animals to the agency's regulatory authority which necessitates these rules.

2. Justification For the Rules.

The new rules are designed to provide a degree of safety from injury by wild animals listed by statute and held in captivity for breeding, exhibition or personal use.

3. How the Rules Will Function.

The rules will require a permit and cage construction specifications for the holding of restricted wild animals.

4. Summary of Comments.

Two telephone comments were received. One suggested the rules prohibit holding animals in low areas subject to flooding. The other suggested a requirement for double entry in cages and that animals not be permitted closer than 300' - 400' from any residence other than the owner's.

5. Names of Those Making Comments For and Against the Rules.

Five letters were received expressing various concerns about the rules. The Exotic Wildlife Association asked if the rules provided for adequate animal welfare and if out-of-state or U.S.D.A. permits would exempt persons from these rules. The Y. O. Ranch commented on the difficulty of lumping different species into one set of rules. Forest Exotics expressed concerns over holding elephants behind steel bars and masonry construction and suggested that transportation of rhinoceros in crates be authorized. Gladys Porter Zoo in Brownsville suggested requirement for barriers

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48" from cages holding large carnivores and apes and a double entry system for cages holding large carnivores. The Humane Society of the United States expressed concerns that the rules were vague and suggested: (1) prohibition of private ownership of wild and exotic animals as pets; (2) restriction of breeding to certain qualified programs; (3) restriction of exhibition to certain accredited zoological parks and aquaria; (4) placement of animals in captivity only for purpose of professional breeding, educational programs, and rehabilitation with eventual release into the wild; (5) specific guidelines for welfare of animals, and; (6) annual inspections of facilities and condition of animals.

6. Reasons Why Agency Disagrees with Comments.

Comments concerning animal welfare are addressed in the Texas Penal Code (Cruelty to Animals). Comments related to prohibiting private ownership, breeding, exhibition, and holding animals in low lying areas are not in the purview of the agency's authority. The rules as adopted provide for cage barriers to prevent contact with animals by visitors, adequate locking mechanisms on cages for security, and transportation of rhinoceros in crates if they are of equivalent strength to primary facilities.

7. Statutory Authority; Interpretation of How Provisions Authorize or Require the Rules.

The new rules are adopted under the Parks and Wildlife Code, Chapter 12, Subchapter G, which provides the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission with the authority to prescribe requirements under which a person may safely possess the named wild animals, and Texas Civil Statute, Article 6252- 13a.

§55.201. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this subchapter, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Breeding - Includes the possession of a wild animal for purpose of propagation.

Department - The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department as established by §11.011 of the Parks and Wildlife Code or a specifically authorized employee of the Department.

Exhibition - Includes any display of a wild animal to members of the general public for whatever reason.

Personal use - Includes the possession of a wild animal for any purpose other than for breeding or exhibit.

Restricted Wild Animal Permit - Means a permit issued by the Department by authority of §12.601-12.607 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

Restricted wild animal - Includes all individual species and subspecies of the following animals: lions, tigers, ocelots, cougars, leopards, cheetahs, jaguars, hyenas, bears, lesser pandas, binturongs, wolves, apes, elephants and rhinoceroses.

§55.202. Permit Requirement.

It shall be unlawful for any person to possess a restricted wild animal in this state for the purpose of breeding, exhibition, or for personal use unless the person has first obtained a Restricted Wild Animal Permit from the Department.

§55.203. Permit Exemption.

A Restricted Wild Animal Permit is not required for the possession of a restricted wild animal if the person holds a valid state or federal permit expressly authorizing the breeding or exhibiting of the restricted wild animal currently in possession.

§55.204. Permit Application.

(a) Any person required to obtain a Restricted Wild Animal Permit shall apply for the permit on an application form provided by the Department.

(b) The application shall contain the following information before it will be considered by the Department:

- (1) Name, address and telephone number(s) of the applicant;
- (2) A complete identification of each wild animal in possession including species, sex, and age, if known, and any distinguishing marks or coloration which would aid in the identification of the animal;
- (3) A statement of ownership including written documentation to evidence ownership of each animal;
- (4) A statement that the applicant has read these rules and that all facilities used by the applicant to hold the restricted wild animals in possession comply with the facilities standards specified by these rules and that the facilities may be inspected by the Department at reasonable times, to determine compliance with these rules;
- (5) A statement indicating that the wild animals will be held for breeding, exhibition, personal use, or a combination of these purposes;
- (6) A copy of any license or permit issued by a city or county, when required, to authorize the possession of the wild animal or allowing an

exemption to the applicant for the possession of the wild animal or a statement by the applicant that no local rules exist that regulate the possession of restricted wild animals;

(7) A statement by a licensed doctor of veterinary medicine that the facilities proposed to house the restricted wild animals are adequate to maintain the animals safely.

(c) The Department may return any application that is found to be incomplete and require additional information, when necessary, to insure compliance with these rules before an application may be considered.

(d) The applicant will forward the fee specified by §12.604 with the application.

(e) No Restricted Wild Animal Permit may be issued until all requirements of Chapter 12, Subchapter G, of the Parks and Wildlife Code and these rules are met.

§55.205. Cage Specifications.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to possess any restricted wild animal(s) unless the animal(s) are confined in cages which meet the construction specifications contained in these rules.

(b) Materials:

(1) Lions, tigers, jaguars, bears, and lesser pandas:

Facilities--Cage construction materials shall consist of not less than nine-gauge chain link or equivalent.

(2) Leopards, pumas (cougars), ocelots, cheetahs, hyenas, wolves, and binturongs:

Facilities--Construction materials shall consist of not less than 11 - 1/2 -gauge chain link or equivalent.

(3) Apes:

(A) Gibbons:

Facilities--Cage construction materials shall consist of not less than nine-gauge chain link or equivalent.

(B) Chimpanzees, orangutans, and gorillas:

Facilities--Cage construction materials shall consist of steel bars, two-inch galvanized pipe, masonry block or their strength equivalent.

(4) Rhinoceros or elephants:

Facilities--Construction materials shall consist of steel bars, masonry block or equivalent.

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(c) All cages constructed of chain link shall be well braced and securely anchored at ground level and shall utilize metal corners, clamps, ties and braces of equivalent strength to other materials prescribed for cage construction for that species.

(d) Frames for cages, including corners, braces, top and bottom rails, shall be securely bolted or welded to provide maximum strength.

(e) Cages of wild animals shall be sufficiently strong to prevent escape. If the animal is held for exhibition, cages shall be equipped with safety barriers which adequately prevent any physical contact with the caged animal by visitors.

(f) Cages shall be equipped with locks and locking mechanism to prevent opening by unauthorized persons.

(g) All cages shall be covered at the top to prevent escape. In lieu of this requirement, facilities provided for wolves, hyenas, rhinoceros, elephants, and cheetahs may be constructed at sufficient height and in such a manner to prevent escape.

(h) Any condition which results in the escape of a wild animal from its cage or enclosure or which results in injury to any person shall be considered housing the wild animal in an unsafe manner and shall be considered a violation of this section.

(i) The Department may inspect the facilities of the applicant before the issuance of the permit and at any reasonable time following the issuance of the permit to insure compliance with these rules and the permit issued by authority of these rules.

§55.206. Transportation of Wild Animals.

It shall be unlawful for any person to transport or possess restricted wild animals unless transported or possessed in cages which meet minimum construction and strength requirements for primary holding facilities as required in these rules.

§55.207. Permit Fees.

The fee for a Restricted Wild Animal Permit is \$ \$100 for each wild animal in possession, except that the maximum fee for a permit is \$500.

§55.208. General Provisions.

(a) Before a permit holder acquires additional restricted wild animal(s), another permit must be obtained or the current permit amended to authorize the possession of the additional restricted wild animal(s).

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or possess any species of wild animal if the animal is listed by the Department as an endangered or

threatened species by authority of Chapter 67 or Chapter 68 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, except under a permit issued pursuant to the appropriate chapter.

(c) A permit issued by the Department will not prevent a local governmental authority from regulating the possession of species of wild animals within their jurisdiction.

(d) Restricted wild animals shall be maintained in a manner consistent with their health and safety. A violation of Penal Code Sec. 42.11 (Cruelty to Animals) shall be prima facie evidence that this section has been violated.

§55.209. Change of Address or Relocation of Facilities.

(a) It shall be unlawful for the holder of a Restricted Wild Animal Permit to fail to notify the Department within 10 days of any change of address, whether the change of address will require the relocation of the wild animals in possession or not.

(b) If the change of address requires the relocation of the wild animals, the permit holder shall construct the facilities required by these rules at the new address, prior to the relocation of the animals from the old location. If the permit holder is not able to comply with this requirement, the animals may be transferred for a period of not to exceed 30 days to another restricted wild animal permit holder who has vacant facilities that comply with these rules provided the animals can be safely transported in compliance with these rules to the temporary facilities by the permit holder or his designated agent. The Department shall be notified in writing of any proposed temporary transfer authorized by this section and of the provisions made for the safe transport of the animals.

(c) The Department may inspect the facilities of the permit holder at the new address or location to determine compliance with these rules relating to facilities. No animals may be relocated to the new address or facilities location until the inspection requirement has been satisfied.

(d) If the permit holder has not constructed facilities at the new address or location within 30 days in compliance with these rules, the Department may revoke the permit and dispose of the animals.

§55.210. Permit Revocation.

(a) The Department may revoke a Restricted Wild Animal Permit if the Department determines that a permit holder is not in compliance with §12.605 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code or with these rules.

(b) The revocation of a Restricted Wild Animal Permit will be accomplished in accord with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act,

Article 6252-13a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes and Department Rules (relating to administrative procedures) or a court order.

(c) Following the revocation of a permit, the Department shall remove the wild animal(s) and shall dispose of the animal(s) in a manner determined by the Department to be in the best interest of the wild animal.

§55.211. Penalty.

The penalty for the violation of these rules is set out in §12.607 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

This agency hereby certifies that the new rules as adopted have been reviewed by legal counsel and found to be a valid exercise of the agency's legal authority.

This letter of agreement shall become effective as of the date agreed below and shall remain in effect until superseded by a new agreement or until it is canceled in writing by either party.



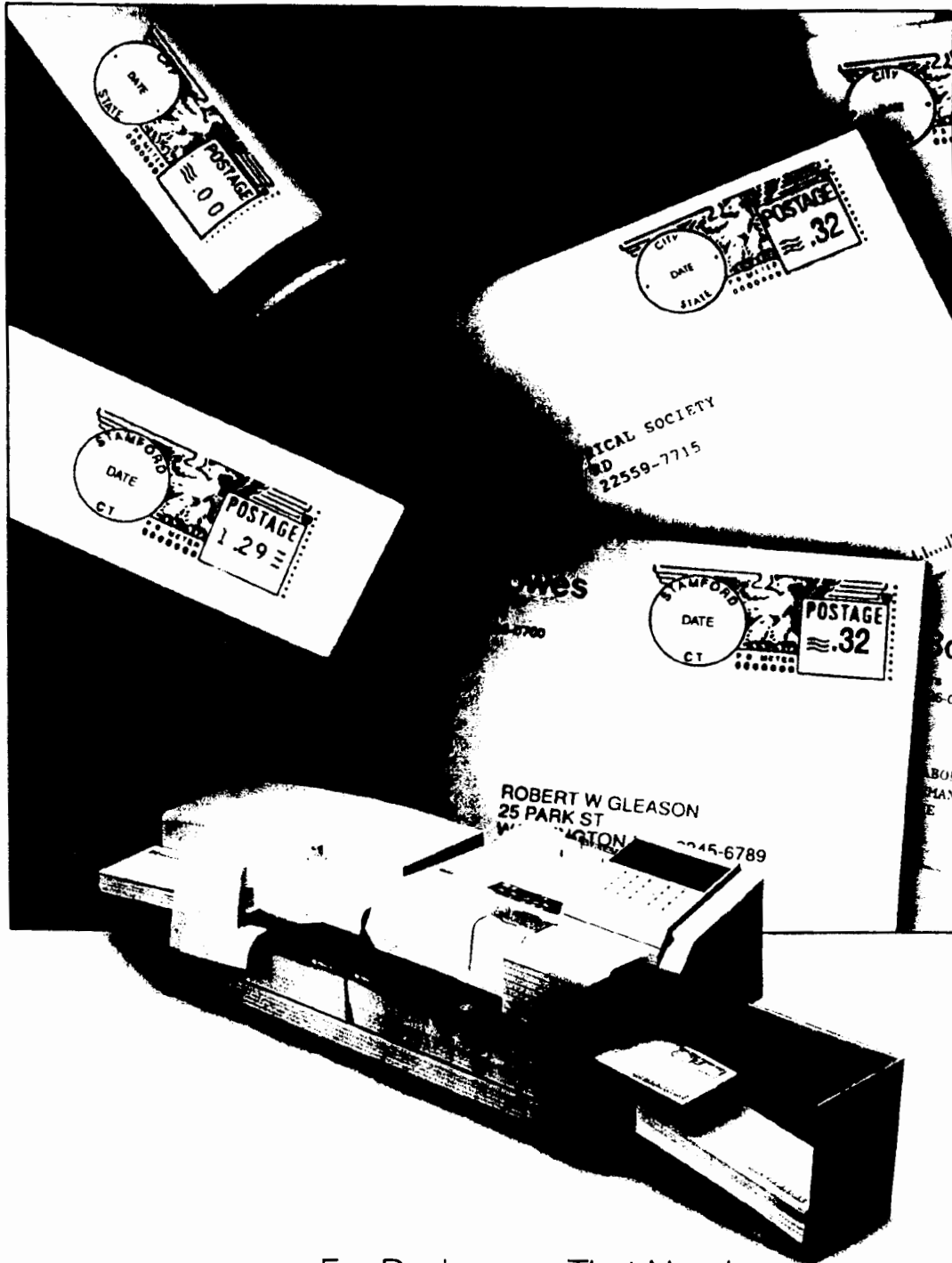

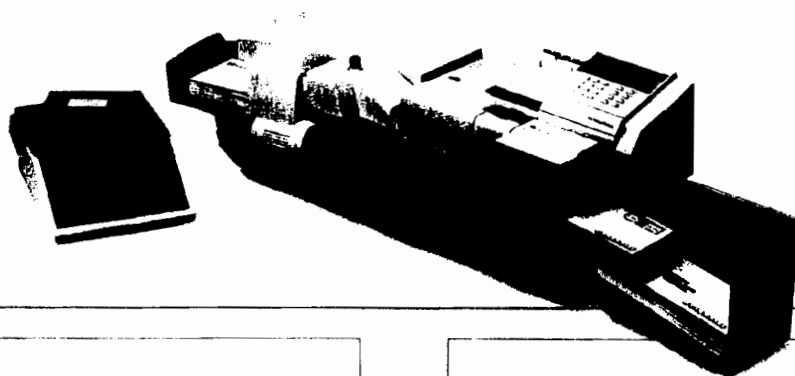
