Monday, June 8, 1998, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order and Bro. Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the May 22 regular session of Court. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #2-Receive Proposals on Ambulance Service

Judge Leath said two proposals were received. One is from Memorial Health System and one is from Eastex EMS. He said that a decision would not be made today, but if a representative is in Court, they may speak.

John Lampkin, Dr. Kyle Denlar, William Craig and Donny Martin, representatives for Memorial Health System, gave a brief overview of their proposal.

Mr. Lampkin said Memorial Health System out of Lufkin has developed a joint venture corporation with Good Shepard Regional Medical Center out of Longview and Trinity Mother Francis out of Tyler. It is called Champion EMS. We can provide ambulance service through out East Texas.

Mr. Lampkin said they could be operational by August 6, 1998 and subscriptions in place now would be honored. A new subscription service would be implemented within ninety days. The cost is approximately \$48.00 yearly. They will have two ambulances stationed in the County. Each will have a paramedic on board.

Mr. John Bryan, Eastex EMS, said that they are based out of Jasper, but has 911 EMS contract in San Augustine also. He said they can be operational by August 6, 1998. They have a subscription service and all subscriptions in place now will be honored until their subscription service can be implemented. The cost will be \$49.00 per year.

Mr. Bryan said there will be one unit stationed in Hemphill and one in Pineland with backup units coming from Jasper and San Augustine. All 911 calls will be dispatched through the Sheriff's department and then the central dispatch center will be notified that one unit is on a call and they will start moving resources on a backup unit if they think it may be needed. They will respond to fire calls and will have a unit at school events such as football games.

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Judge Leath said a decision would be announced on June 22 after the Court goes over the proposals presented today. He said the Court reserves the right to call if they have any questions of either ambulance service.

Agenda item #4-Larry Kelly - Toledo Bend: State Alliance Deleted. Same as agenda item #6.

Agenda item #6-Take Action: Bi-State Alliance Resolution

Larry Kelly, chair of the Toledo Bend Bi-State Alliance, told the Court that the Alliance was formed based on what they saw as a need to get the Toledo Bend lake level established at 168 feet minimum to develop the lake as a recreational resource and to promote tourism. They had a petition drive mainly in Louisiana collecting 6000 signatures. There were 827 signatures from Texas and approximately 150 of those were from Sabine County. Mr. Kelly said they decided that they needed more support from the Texas side. He said they would be dealing primarily with the Sabine River Authority and the Parks and Wildlife, Louisiana and Texas. The chair and vice-chairman of the Alliance will alternate between the states so that each state will have equal representation. Mr. Kelly said they are asking the Court to approve a resolution today in support of a 168-feet mean sea level as the minimum routine power generation.

After Mr. Kelly gave his presentation, Judge Leath moved to table this item until the Court has a chance to review the results of a study requested by the Toledo Bend Project Joint Operations Board and to get a copy of all the organizations in Sabine County and surrounding Counties that belong to the Bi-State Alliance organization. Commissioner Will Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #7-Take Action: Forest Service Request for Burn Ban

Kester Denman, Texas District Forester for Sabine and San Augustine Counties, asked that the Court consider a burn ban at its next meeting. Since we just received rain, he is not requesting one today, but if the hot, dry weather continues, we will still be in an extreme fire danger.

D. B. Chance said that even with the rain we received, everything is still very dry.

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to authorize the County Judge to make a decision on the burn ban based on recommendation from the Forest Service. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Court recessed at 10:05 a.m.

Court reconvened at 10:15 a.m.

Agenda item #5-Take Action - COPS Grant

Bruce White, Chief Deputy Sheriff's department, told the Court that Sheriff Philips is gone out of town to pick up an inmate and will not be available for Court today. He wanted to let the Court

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know that the grant has changed. The grant will pay full salaries for four deputies. The County will be responsible for paying the benefits.

The Court asked if anything has been received in writing and Deputy White said no.

Judge Leath recommended that the Court wait until we get something in writing and then look at the budget.

Agenda item #8-County Extension Agent-Present Certificates to Court

This item is cancelled.

Agenda item #9-Telephone Road - Speed Limit and Children Playing Signs

Commissioner Will Smith moved to set a speed limit of 30 mph on Telephone road and to put up signs on the corner of FM276 and Telephone road, Speed Limit 30 mph and Children Playing. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-Advertise for Bids on Tax Property

Commissioner Clark moved to advertise for bids for sale of properties that was obtained through foreclosure for nonpayment of ad valorem taxes. Commissioner Will Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Bids are to be sealed and submitted to Tammy Reeves, Tax Assessor-Collector no later than 3:00 p.m., July 10. Bids will be opened during the regular session of Commissioners' Court on July 13. See attached copy of bid notice.

Agenda item #10-Reports

Luice Mitaniel

Commissioner Will Smith moved to accept the reports from JP #2, County Extension Agents, Veterans Service Officer and County Treasurer. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #11-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Commissioner Lynn Smith moved to pay accounts and salaries except for a bill from the Sheriff's department for boots. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Judge Leath said he is going to investigate a bill for removing a wart on an inmate at the jail and will turn it in at the next Court meeting if necessary.

Commissioner Will Smith moved to adjourn. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. Meeting adjourned.
