Monday, July 26, 1999, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members of the Court were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and Bro. Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #9-Bob Erhardt to Give Update on Radio Tower

Mr. Erhardt told the Court that we have full radio coverage now. He is working with the Sheriff on possibly training some of his people and them getting their license so we can put a radio in the dispatch office. He made an offer to the Court that he would he train any County employee for the cost of the books and test only.

This was a report only. No action taken.

Agenda item #5-Discuss & Take Action on Welcome Center Proposal & Resolution

Commissioner Nethery said there is a lot of work to be done if we are to present an application for this project by August 9. He said the question of why not let the State build this center has been asked. The answer is that the State does not build these anymore except on interstate roads. It is the responsibility of the host Counties. Highway 21 has been reclassified and is now on the national highway system. It is believed that when the East/West corridor comes through, it would generally follow highway 21. Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi are moving forward with their portion of that highway. Louisana and Texas have yet to do much with theirs.

Commissioner Nethery said Mr. Potts with the U.S. Forest Service discovered there is an opportunity with TXDOT and brought the opportunity to the Economic Development Committee of the Chamber of Commerce. He said he is a member of that Committee and that is how he became involved. He volunteered to review the documents that Mr. Potts had given the Committee as a member of the



Chamber and not as a Commissioner. With help from some other people it was determined that we could respond to this opportunity. He said that in his opinion, this is a once in a decade opportunity to move Sabine County forward. A welcome center is not a rest stop. A welcome center is operated at specific hours. There would not be an open entrance to the restrooms after hours. It is recommended that the facility be secured so that no one could stay in the parking lot after hours. There is a concern about it not being built on Sabine County owned land. There is land available to purchase if we decide to go that way. At the public meeting July 15, the majority of the people attending were in favor of the Center. We have to have a decision. If we are not going to do this, Commissioner Nethery said we don't need for people to do the work on the proposal.

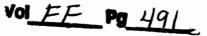
Majorie Williams asked if there is enough to give the tourist after we get them here. If we can no longer collect the hotel/motel tax after the year 2000, there will have to be a big tax increase to pay for this. Anyone can build on air castles, but you need to know where the money is going to come from. She also asked Commissioner Nethery if he would abstain from voting on the Court on this matter since he is a member of the Chamber of Commerce.

Ronny Sheeon said he couldn't imagine anyone putting money into a building that is not going to be on your own land and may not be given access after 20 years. Is there any other way to pay the cost if we cannot collect the hotel/motel tax any longer? Will the taxpayers have to pay for this?

Jack Lunny said he has a business in Brookeland and is getting ready to open another shop on the square. He said the sales tax comes back to the County. So the more people you get in here, the more money will be spent here. He said he firmly believes we need this.

Richard Copeland said he has a business on the square. He said we are seeing people that have been in business for a long time on the square going out of business. The square is drying up and if we don't do something, it is going to die. He said he hopes the Court will see fit to vote for this.

Maggie Hauser said she was very concerned when she got a letter from the Chamber of Commerce saying the estimated cost of this project was going to be 1 million dollars. A point blank statement saying the operational cost, an estimated \$55,000.00, would be funded from the hotel/motel tax. In 1993 an explanation was given as to how the hotel/motel tax money would be spent. Seventy percent would be used to promote outside of this County, ten percent would be used for administrative mailings, ten percent for promotion of historic items such as



Milam's Settlers Day and the other ten percent is an untouchable fund set aside every quarter for a future Civic Convention Visitor's Center. The Center is to be centrally located. Now this letter says that is not the way it will be.

Loretta Sterle said she wrote the letter that Mrs. Hauser spoke about. At this point we really don't know what the cost will be. These are estimates we got from TXDOT. Most everyone she has spoken to, including marina owners, are for this. She said she doesn't believe this opportunity will come back ago for maybe a decade.

Robert Howard voiced his support of a tourist facility but he doesn't think it fair to ask Sabine County to pay all the cost. The State should do it. The Counties that will benefit from this is the Cities along the El Camino Real. He said he doesn't like the idea of building something on someone else's property.

Mark Hanlon said it seems everyone has good intentions but we cannot afford this. If we want to make the County grow, we could advertise the fact that we have low taxes and intend to keep them low. Get people to move here. If you want more bang for your buck, advertise in Fishing Texas or Fishing Louisiana. This is just more than we can afford.

Robert Howard said if we do get into this, get some good legal talent to have an escape clause.

Bob Brothers asked how the Commissioners' Court feels about this.

Judge Leath said the Court wants to hear what the people present have to say and then will make their comments.

Blain Owens said it seems the biggest problem is with the operating budget. We have talked about hiring a tourism director here in the County. He said he imagines the salary would have to be in the neighborhood of \$25,000.00 to get someone halfway qualified. By the time you add benefits, you are looking at about half of what operating this Center would be. If other entities occupy the offices, such as the Chamber of Commerce, we could charge rent. He said he has spoken to Wayne Christian about the population restriction on the hotel/motel tax. Wayne Christian told him statutes could be amended. He said we need to authorize Commissioner Nethery to proceed with the application process. There will be no cost to proceed. It may be a long time before we get this opportunity again.

Ronny Sheeon asked if the grant would be available if rent is charged to other entities.

Blain Owens told him yes.

Commissioner Clark said he agrees with what most everyone said but he cannot commit to funds we may not get. He is not in favor of raising taxes to fund this.

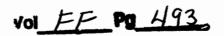
Commissioner Smith said the major problem is in the maintenance cost. He said he is in favor of a Visitor's Information Center but is opposed to obligating present and future property owners to pay for this. He opposes this project at this time.

Commissioner Dickerson said he agrees with Mr. Howard. He is not in favor of raising taxes to support this.

Judge Leath said Commissioner Nethery is right. The East-West corridor is going to happen one day. Comment about what is taking place across the river, it is private capitol that has built over there. The Visitor's Center he believes is owned by the SRA. Tourism is the second biggest industry in the County. You take Toledo Bend Lake away and tourism in this County will not produce \$30,000.00 a year. He said his concern is that we need to attract economic development. We need to get the facilities that will increase tourism. Right now you cannot even hook on to a water system unless you live in the corporate limits. All the treatment facilities are over capacity. This would take a bunch of money. He said he is not saying the County should fund this, but the County is going to have to ex-spend some funds to create some funds that will improve the distribution systems and the treatment systems. Then we will have a lot better chance of attracting some development along the lake that will greatly increase our tourist potential. We received letters from surrounding Cities and Counties in favor of this Tourist Information Center, but we have not received any commitments of money or material to help. Judge Leath asked Commissioner Nethery if he would have to sign the proposal stating that Sabine County is committing to 20 percent of these funds and to the operating expense.

Commissioner Nethery said yes but you don't have to spend any at that time.

Judge Leath said this is a tough one. If we use the hotel/motel tax money to fund the operation as the letter said we would do, then it would take every penny of it and then some. Our average funds brought in are probably \$15,000.00 a year less than the projected operation cost. No one else would receive any funds from this account. The people that will visit our Visitor's Center are here. Do we have enough to offer to keep them here? He said he feels it would not be fiscally responsible for us to continue this project at this time if we have to commit to the



20 percent. There is a good chance that the hotel/motel tax will be extended. That would still not be enough money to operate the facility.

Commissioner Nethery said he wanted to address 2 or 3 things that Mr. Howard brought up. Our surrounding east Texas Counties probably will gain just as much or more with this facility. Economic development in today's market place is done on a regional basis. If it is good for the big area, it is generally accepted that it will be good for us. The other problem we have is that some things the State has done for us in the past; they are not going to do anymore. This is one of them unless it is on the interstate. I agree with Mr. Howard's comment, "Let the State do it", but that is just not going to happen.

Commissioner Nethery moved to proceed forward. Motion dies for lack of a second.

Commissioner Nethery said he wants the record to reflect that in his opinion he believes sincerely that we have just taken an action that will defer progress in this County for another decade and he is sorry to have to do that. That is his position on the Tourist Information Center.

Court recessed at 9:50 a.m.

Court reconvened at 10:00 a.m.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Nethery moved to approve the minutes for the July 12 regular session of Court and the July 15, 8:30 a.m., special session of Court.

Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-Ext. Agent to Present Certificates

Judge Leath said Mr. Toner is not here to present the certificates. The following officials received certificates for continuing education. Tanya Walker, District Clerk; Janice McDaniel, County Clerk; Jack Leath, County Judge; Keith Clark, Commissioner Pct. #1; Doyle Dickerson, Commissioner Pct. #3; Gene Nethery, Commissioner Pct. #4 and former Pct. #4 Commissioner, Will Smith, Sr. See attached copies.

Agenda item #4-Line Item Transfers

Commissioner Dickerson moved to approve the line item transfers for the County Clerk, Treasurer, Sheriff's dept., and precinct #2 and JP #2. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copies.

Agenda item #6-Consider & Take Action on Vehicle Registration Fees

Commissioner Smith moved to leave the fee at \$10.00. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.



Agenda item #7-Discuss & Possible Take Action on County Health Insurance Policy

Judge Leath said that since we are in an insurance pool with TAC we do not have to go out for proposals every year. We have received notice from TAC that there will be a 5 percent increase and from what he has heard from others, this is not a big increase.

Commissioner Smith moved to stay with TAC and not advertise for proposals. Judge Leath seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-Discuss & Possible Take Action on Accepting Westside Drive for County Maintenance

Judge Leath said we have a petition from the 4 families that live on this road requesting that this road be accepted.

Commissioner Dickerson moved to accept this road for County maintenance. Commissioner Nethery seconded.

The road has a 40-foot right-of-way. The road begins off highway 96 South of Bronson and extends approximately one-tenth of a mile.

All voted for the motion. Motion carries.

Agenda item #10-Discuss & Possible Take Action on County Policy on Sexual Harassment

This item is deleted.

Agenda item #2-Reports

Commissioner Nethery moved to accept the reports from the Treasurer and Charlotte Gorman, County Agent. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #11-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Commissioner Clark moved to pay accounts and salaries except for the bill for \$459.20 to Ford, Lincoln, Mercury on the Constables car and the bill to Bane's for \$44.66. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Judge Leath will check on the dentist bills for inmates.

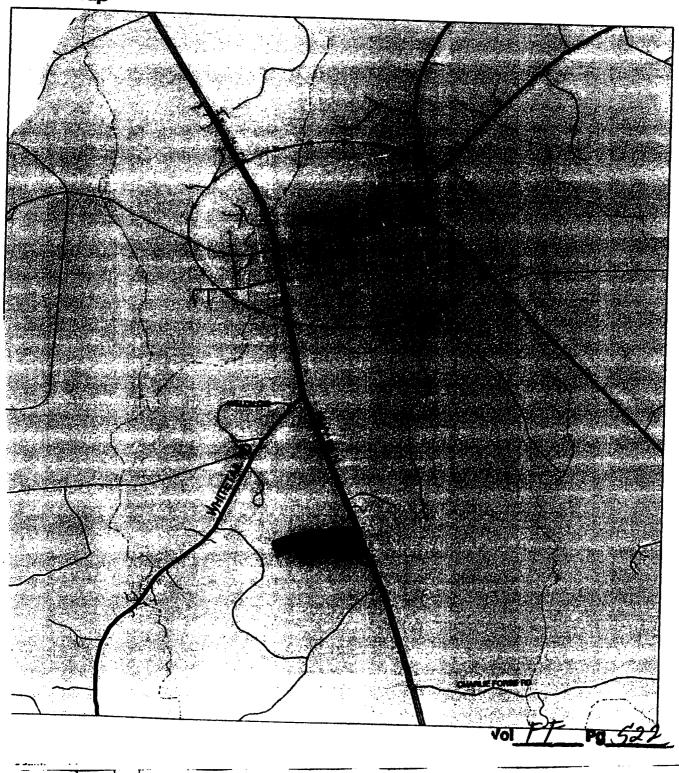

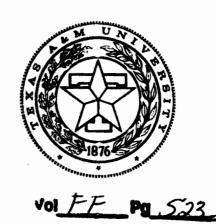

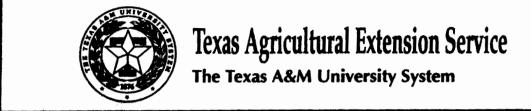

SUBJECT: IMPOSITION OF EXTRA FEES

Chapter 502 of the transportation Code, relating to the registration of vehicles, provides counties the option of imposing, in addition to the registration fee, two extra fees.

The provisions of Section 502.172 provide for a county road and bridge fee in an amount that does not exceed \$10.00 for each vehicle registered in the county. An extra fee in the amount not to exceed \$1.50 for each vehicle registered in the county is available under the provisions of Section 502.173 to fund a school crossing guard program. However, vehicles registered with Machinery and farm trailer License Plates are exempt from both provisions.

The amounts of both optional fees are set by a Commissioners Court. Counties are statutorily required to notify the department of their intent by Commissioners Court Order if you change your fees. The notification deadline for the road and bridge fee is **September 1**<sup>st</sup> of each year. The deadline for notification of the school crossing guard fee is **September 10**<sup>th</sup> of each year.

Please complete the attachment on the imposition of extra fees for registration year 2000. If your response requires a County Commissioners Court Order, we request that the original order be mailed to us no later than the date indicated. We have also included a fee chart, which indicates what extra fee(s) your county currently collects.

SUBJECT: OPTIONAL \$5 COUNTY ROAD AND BRIDGE FEE

TO: ALL COUNTY TAX ASSESSOR-COLLECTORS

Ladies and Gentlemen:

We recently obtained a copy of Attorney General's Opinion No. JM-281 (copy attached) relating to when a county may charge the optional \$5.00 County Road and Bridge Fee.

This Opinion concludes that counties are not authorized to collect the additional \$5.00 fee on January renewals until after January 31, 1985. Otherwise, on and after January 1, 1985, the \$5.00 fee is due in all other situations, including February renewals, new and out-of-state vehicles, etc. Prior to January 1, 1985, the \$5 fee should not have been collected.

Between now and the end of January, when you process a January renewal, remove and destroy the \$5.00 stub and charge the State fee only.

If, as a result of this Opinion, it is your decision to issue refunds, you may take credit for the entire \$5.00 fee on the report, Form 158-C.
