Judge Leath called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the January 10th regular session of Court. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-Take Action on Advertisement to Sell a High Efficiency 2 Grate Wall Mount Natural Gas Heater with Striker

Two bids were received. They are as follows:

1. Carolyn Woods-\$50.00

2. Jimmy McDaniel-\$50.00

The bid from Jimmy McDaniel is withdrawn because the heater is natural gas and can not be changed to propane.

The Court voted to unanimously accept the bid from Carolyn Woods.

Agenda item #5-Discuss & Take Action on the Burn Ban

Judge Leath said he feels we need to extend the burn ban.

Commissioner Smith said he agrees but some people are saying that offenders are getting warned and are not getting ticketed. They think the offenders should be getting fined not just warned.

Judge Leath said the policy is to give a warning the first time and fined if caught again.

Sheriff Philips said most people are saying they do not know a burn ban is on and they are willing to put the fire out when asked. How do you prove otherwise? It has been suggested that signs be placed at all entrances to the County.

Judge Leath moved to continue the burn ban and to seek a more effective way to get the word out. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #6-Discuss TXDOT County Road Inventory Project

Judge Leath said he received a letter from TXDOT stating the 2000 road
mileage certification for Sabine County is 362 miles.

Commissioner Dickerson said he asked to ride along with the person that was coming to ride the roads but he did not see him until after he had driven the roads already.

Judge Leath said he will let them know we will accept their mileage but do not agree with it.

No action taken.

Agenda item #7-Discuss & Possible Take Action on Vehicle for Sheriff's Dept.

Sheriff Philips said section 574 of the Mental Health Code is causing us some problems. This law deals with transporting people to a MHMR facility for evaluation. They are to be transported in an unmarked car with an officer in street clothes. If it is a female person, there has to be a female along unless a relative is available. They are not to be restrained unless deemed necessary. He said they try not to get on the MHMR merry-go-round because you never know just where you may be end up. What he is proposing is to borrow back the Commissioners' car that has the 911 stickers on it.

Commissioner Dickerson said it sounds like a good idea to him.

Commissioner Clark asked the Sheriff if he did not have an extra car.

Sheriff Philips said because of the shortage of deputies right now, he has an extra car. He said he is driving the K-9 unit because he has the dog.

Commissioner Clark said you have 7 deputies and 8 cars. The signs could be taken off the extra car. If you have 7 deputies, then 7 cars is all you need. You are paid an expense allowance of \$4,800.00 a year for your own car and you are driving a deputy car. You are coming out ahead.

Sheriff Philips was asked about using his own vehicle for the transportation and he said he has put 3 transmissions in it in 3 years and it has 130 thousand miles on it. He said he doesn't know how reliable it would be. He said he has not had much luck at buying a vehicle for \$4,800.00 a year.

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Commissioner Nethery moved to allow Sheriff Philips the use of the 911 vehicle. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-Discuss & Possible Take Action Adopting Rules for Onsite Sewage Facilities-Brookeland Water

Commissioner Dickerson moved to table this item. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #9-Accept Kay Keesee Road for County Maintenance Kay Keesee is present in Court today.

Commissioner Smith said he has been working on an agreement with Temple-Inland for the past 2 months.

Judge Leath said the agreement looks okay to him.

Commissioner Smith moved to accept this portion (1/4 mile) as a public road with County maintenance. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy of license agreement with Temple-Inland.

Agenda item #10-Take Action on Proposals to Provide Bull Dozer Services as Needed to Assist in Fighting Fires

There was no response to the advertisement.

Judge Leath asked the Court if they wanted to re-advertise of to appoint someone.

Commissioner Smith said he thinks the County should look into getting a dozer.

Judge Leath said maybe we could pursue another angle.

No action taken.

Agenda item #11-Discuss Mill Creek Park Project (Corp of Engineers)

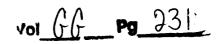
The Court discussed the Resume of Negotiations with Sheriff Philips.

Judge Leath said the Deep East Texas Self-Insurance Fund would sponsor a safety training class for the County at no charge. He told the Commissioners that if they could let him know what they want to do since it is mostly road and bridge employees.

Agenda item #Take Action on Health Insurance Disease Management
Program

Judge Leath said this is from TAC. They have a new disease management program and it is available for us through our hospitalization insurance. It is for people that suffer from severe asthma, diabetes and congestive heart failure. He said if anyone has an employee that has one of these conditions, he will arrange for these people to come and meet with them.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Judge Leath said this is for information only.

The County will have to pay 50 percent on the funding for the water project. We met the requirements for the unemployment aspect but did not for the per capital income portion and you have to meet both to get the extra 25 percent. He said he met with the Sabine River Authority last Tuesday and asked them for some money to help us with our share of the water district project. The SRA committed nothing. They did say they felt sure they can participate in the in-kind part as well as a strong possibility of some cash support. There is going to be a meeting between the SRA, our Engineers and our Attorneys next week and then there will be a meeting with G-M later that evening. The Judge encouraged all the Commissioners to attend the meeting at the G-M building.

Judge Leath read a thank you note from Chris Lane for giving SAMCO consideration.

Court recessed at 9:35 a.m.

Court reconvened at 9:50 a.m.

Commissioner Clark moved to accept the reports from the Sheriff, Tax Assessor, County Extension Agent and 2 reports from the Treasurer.

Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #15-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Judge Leath said there are some bills that are not on the listing. They are bills for the Tax Assessor to attend a seminar and the annual dues to the Piney Woods R C & D.

Commissioner Dickerson said he has a bill from A to Z Tree Service for \$175.00. They told him it would be \$150.00 and that is what he wants them to be paid.

Commissioner Nethery moved to pay the accounts and salaries with the additions and corrections stated. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Commissioner Nethery moved to adjourn. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. Meeting adjourned.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made January ____, 2000, between TEMPLE-INLAND FOREST PRODUCTS CORPORATION ("Licensor"), and the COUNTY OF SABINE, TEXAS ("Licensee").

BACKGROUND

- A. Licensor is the owner of a private road across Licensor's property in Sabine County, Texas, which road is more particularly identified on the map attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "A"</u> (the "Road").
- B. Licensee has requested a license to use approximately one-fourth mile of the Road as a public road, and Licensor has agreed to grant such license on the terms set forth herein.

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the above recitals and of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION ONE GRANT OF LICENSE

Licensor hereby grants to Licensee a license to occupy and use the Road, subject to all of the terms and conditions hereof.

SECTION TWO LIMITATION TO DESCRIBED PURPOSE

The Road may be occupied and used by Licensee solely as a roadway and for incidental purposes related thereto. More specifically, Licensee may at Licensee's expense improve the Road and maintain it to the standards of a Class C Public Road. Notwithstanding the rights of Licensee to improve and maintain the Road, Licensor retains for itself and its agents and subcontractors the right to use the Road for any purposes deemed necessary or desirable by Licensor during all weather conditions (which use may include transportation of logging equipment and heavy machinery), provided that within a reasonable time following conclusion of Licensor's operations Licensor will at its own expense return the road to the condition it was in prior to commencement of its operations (but in no event greater than the standards of a Class C Public Road). Licensee acknowledges that this License does not permit Licensee to regulate or control Licensor's use of the Road.

Licensee shall indemnify Licensor for any and all liability for personal injuries, property damage, or for loss of life or property resulting from, or in any way connected with, the condition or use of the Road, or any means of ingress thereto or egress therefrom, except for liability for personal injuries, property damages, or loss of life or property caused solely by the negligence of Licensor.

SECTION FIVE TERMINATION

This License shall continue in effect until the Road is no longer being regularly maintained by Licensee as a Class C Public Road, at which time this License will automatically terminate.

SECTION SIX LICENSE ONLY

Licensee agrees that it does not and shall not claim at any time any interest or estate of any kind or extent whatsoever in the Road by virtue of this License or its occupancy or use hereunder. Further, Licensee agrees that this License is personal to Licensee and may not be assigned in whole or in part by Licensee.

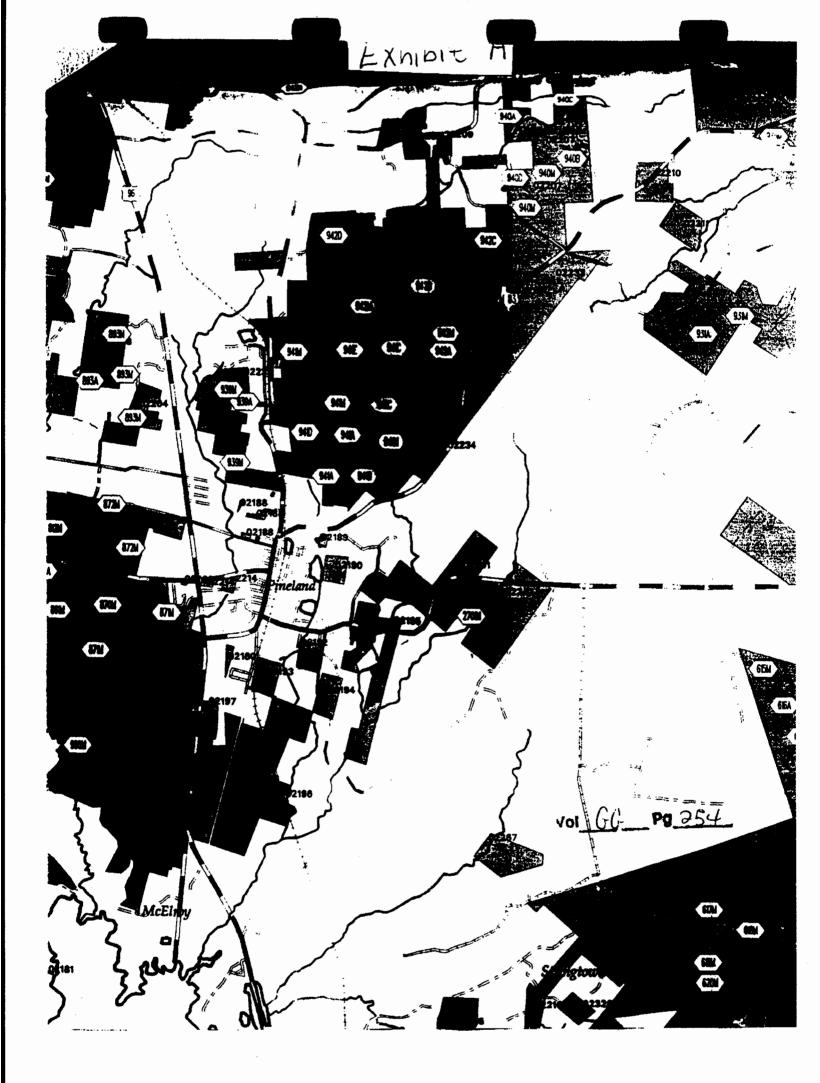

RESUME OF NEGOTIATIONS

Sebine County

A meeting was held on 18 January 2000, between Mr. Mark Shaw, Lake Manager, representing the Corps of Engineers, and Mr. Tom Philips, Sebine County Sheriff, concerning negotiations for a cooperative agreement for law enforcement services on Sam Rayburn Project.

The Cooperator agrees to provide law enforcement services on Sam Rayburn Project. Corps of Engineers Park lying within Sabine County on Sam Rayburn Project is Mill Creek Park. The North and South Ends of Old Highway 96 as they extend into the Sam Rayburn Reservoir are also included in the patrols.

The Cooperator agrees to provide continuous vehicular patrols using one deputy at Sam Rayburn Project 8 hours per day between 1800 and 0200 hours on Fridays and Saturdays. Petrols on Sundays and Federal Holidays will be between 1400 hours and 2200 hours for 8 hours. Effective start date is 10 March 2000 and completion date is 13 August 2000.

The deputy labor rate is \$19.43 per hour.
