AGREED ORDER DOCKET NO. 1999-1099-PW8-E

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

At its APR 0.5 2000 agends, the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission ("the Commission" or "TNRCC") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding G-M Water Supply Corporation ("G-M WSC") under the authority of TEX. HEALTH & SAFBTY CODE ch. 341 ("the Code"). The Executive Director of the TNRCC, represented by the Field Operations Division, and G-M WSC appear before the Commission and together stipulate that:

- 1. G-M WSC owns and operates a public water system located in Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas ("the Facility") that has 2713 service connections and serves at least 25 people per day for at least 60 days per year.
- 2. The Commission and G-M WSC agree that the Commission has jurisdiction to enter this Agreed Order, and that G-M WSC is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction.
- 3. G-M WSC received notice of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations") on or about March 22, 1999.
- 4. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Agreed Order shall not constitute an admission by G-M WSC of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 5. An administrative penalty in the amount of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500) is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). G-M WSC has paid the Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$10,500) administrative penalty.
- 6. Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.

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The Executive Director of the TNRCC and G-M WSC have agreed on a settlement of the matters
alleged in this enforcement action, subject to the approval of the Commission.

8. The Executive Director recognizes that G-M WSC has implemented the following corrective measures at the Facility in response to this enforcement action:

- Updated the coliform sample site plan to include specific sample location; and
- b. Performed annual inspection of ground storage and pressure tanks.
- 9. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that G-M WSC has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Agreed Order.
- 10. This Agreed Order is not intended to become a part of G-M WSC's compliance history.
- 11. This Agreed Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order, whichever is later.
- 12. The provisions of this Agreed Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Agreed Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.

II. ALLEGATIONS

G-M WSC, as owner and operator of the Facility, is alleged to have violated:

- 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.106(a)(1) by failing to specify the sample location on the coliform sample site plan, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 290.46(p)(1) and 290.46(p)(2) by failing to perform annual inspections
 of ground storage and pressure tanks, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20,
 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 3. 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(j) by failing to perform customer service inspections on all new and modified connections. The WSC has added 56 new connections since the last annual compliance inspection, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 4. 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 290.44(d) and 290.46(u) by failing to maintain a distribution pressure of 35 pounds per square inch (psi) in the far reaches of the distribution system (Thomas Johnson

Community), as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;

- 5. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.46(e)(1) by failing to employ two certified water works operators for system over 1,000 connections, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 6. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45(b)(1)(D)(v) by failing to provide emergency power supply to provide 0.35 gallons per minute per connection, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999:
- 7. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.45(f)(3), 290.45(f)(4) and 290.45(f)(5) by failing to establish a maximum daily and hourly purchase rate in the purchase water contract and to provide a maximum production capacity of 0.6 gallons per minute per connection. Failure to provide a maximum hourly purchase rate plus service pump capacity of 2.0, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 8. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.45(b)(1)(C)(ii) and 290.45(b)(1)(D)(ii) by failing to provide a total storage capacity of 200 gallons per connection at the Tebo, SH 83 East, Bronson and Crossroad plants, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 9. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45(b)(1)(D)(iv) by failing to provide an elevated storage capacity of 100 gallons per connection at the SH 83 East plant, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 10. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§ 290.45(b)(1)(C)(iii) and 290.45(b)(1)(D)(iii) by failing to provide a service pump capacity of 2.0 gallons per minute per connection at the Transfer Pump Station, Mid-Lake, Jim Nethery, Bronson and Crossroads plants, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999;
- 11. 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45(a) by failing to provide a service pump pass-through capacity of 0.6 gallons per minute per connection at the Transfer Pump Station, Mid-Lake, King Cemetery, Jim Nethery and SH 184 plants, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999; and
- 12. 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 290.45(b)(1)(D)(iv) by failing to provide a pressure tank capacity of 29 gallons per connection at the Crossroads and Tebo plants, as documented during an inspection conducted on January 20, 1999 and January 21, 1999.

III. DENIALS

G-M WSC generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

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IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

It is, therefore, ordered by the TNRCC that G-M WSC pay an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 5 above. The imposition of this administrative penalty and G-M WSC's compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreed Order resolve only those matters described here. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Administrative penalty payments shall be made payable to "TNRCC" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: G-M Water Supply Corporation, Docket No. 1999-1099-PWS-E" to:
