Monday, August 28, 2000, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members of Court were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the August 14th regular session of Court. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-Line Item Transfers

Commissioner Smith moved to approve the line item transfer for precinct 4. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Court recessed at 9:35 a.m. to go into the public hearing.

Court reconvened into regular session at 9:40 a.m.

Agenda item #5-Discuss & Take Action on County Health Insurance

Judge Leath said the proposed budget contains a proposal to stay with Blue Cross/Blue Shield through TAC. There is a 13.5 percent increase in cost this year. In conversions with groups similar to the size of ours, this is a little lower increase than the general increase of those entities. Our deductible and co-pay will stay the same, but there will be a change with our prescription cards.

Tricia Jacks, County Treasurer, explained that Blue Cross is doing this all across the State of Texas. We will have a 3-tier co-pay for prescriptions instead of the 2-tier we have now. It will be generic (\$10.00), name brand (\$20.00) and a non-preferred (\$35.00). We are paying \$10.00 and \$15.00 now. We will get a list of medications and if your prescription is not for one that is on the list, you will pay the non-preferred price. They have cut out all 90-day supplies for 1 co-pay. Our group does have the mail-in prescription option. If you take a daily



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medication, you can mail it in and get a 90-day supply for a 2-month co-pay. A list will be provided to everyone.

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Judge Leath said he recommends staying with Blue Cross and TAC.

Commissioner Clark moved to stay with Blue Cross/Blue Shied and TAC. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #9-Take Action on Adoption of the Budget

Judge Leath said the proposed budget is for the general fund is \$2,197,354.00. This does include a pay increase for the employees and an increase in almost every department. In March of next year, 2001, the general fund will be completely debt free. We have one payment left on the anticipation note for approximately \$35,000.00 and it will be paid in March of 2001. We are also paying off a lease purchase on some computer systems in the JP's and Sheriff's department in this year's budget. The net increase in the budget is roughly \$39,000.00. In dealing with a budget this large, well over 2 million dollars, which does not even equal the cost that everything has gone up. We have been able to conserve some things and build up a little reserve. This is due to the County Office Officials being conservative and not spent all of their budget every year. The road and bridge budgets continue to be in good shape because of a windstorm. The government allowed a lot of the timber to be salvaged and the County got 12 and ½ percent of the money that was generated from the sale of the timber.

Judge Leath said he recommends that the proposed budget for the fiscal year starting January 1, 2001 and ending December 31, 2001 be adopted.

Commissioner Smith moved to adopt the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2001. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #10-Discuss and Set Tax Rate

Tammy Reeves, Tax Assessor/Collector, is present in Court. She gave the Court the following information:

The effective rate is just a comparison rate for the same property that was taxed last year. The present rate would not increase taxes for anyone unless they had an increase in value. The present rate would generate \$1,193,318.00. The effective rate would generate \$1,180,677.00. Three percent above the effective

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rate would generate \$1,216,089.00. This is at 100 percent collection. Our INS rate is set at .01105.

Don Dickson questioned why the waterfront property is appraised at a higher tax rate than the other property.

Tammy said that according to Jim Nethery, Chief Appraiser for Sabine County, the Appraisal office is audited by the State Comptroller's office. He has to be in compliance with their values. Our water front properties was below the State's and those areas had to be re-appraised. If he doesn't comply, all the jurisdictions are penalized especially our school district. We are still below the State's level.

Judge Leath said the appraisal district sets the value for the County, for the schools and hospital district. They are not part of the County government. A board governs them.

Mr. Dickson said that the County really doesn't have a say in it. He said he appreciates this being cleared up for him.

Judge Leath recommended to set the tax rate at the present rate.

Commissioner Clark moved to set the tax rate at our present rate of .37574. That is a M&O rate of .36469 and a debt service rate .01105. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Judge Leath moved to adopt the resolution for the Sabine County Tax Assessor/Collector for the tax year of 2000. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Agenda item #6-Discuss & Possible Take Action on Litter Control Officer

Judge Leath said he has 15 applications for this position. He said he feels we should interview these applicants.

The Court scheduled a special Court session for Thursday, August 31, 2000 at 8:30 a.m. for the interviews. The interviews are scheduled for 15 minutes each.

Agenda item #7-Discuss and Possible Take Action on Deep East Texas Regional Economic Development Initiative

Judge Leath said that last year DETCOG put together a grant to begin to develop a plan for economic development for the 12 Counties area. A lot of work was done and some brochures were printed up. The man that was in charge attended a couple of conventions in an attempt to attract some industry to our area. That grant has run out and DETCOG is asking that we continue this initiative by

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sharing of the cost by the 12 County area on a pro-rata basis. Sabine County's portion is \$1,491.03 or 2.98 percent of about \$50,000.00.

Commissioner Nethery moved to approve this expenditure. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Agenda item #4-Take Action on County Holidays for FY 2001

Commissioner Nethery moved to add Veterans Day, November 10, 2000 to this years holidays. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

The Court decided to delete Thursday, March 4, 2001, Texas Independence Day as a County holiday and to add Monday, November 12[,] 2001, Veterans Day.

Commissioner Nethery moved to adopt the County holidays for the FY 2001 as amended. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copies.

Agenda item #8-Discuss and Possible Take Action on Resolution & Courthouse Team for the Historic Preservation Program

Judge Leath said this is part of the Historic Courthouse Preservation Program in Texas. The group called "Preservation Texas" has asked that we go on record as supporting this and that we appoint a Courthouse Team to be a part of the program. He said he does feel this is a good program and the money in the State Treasury is adequate. A lot of Counties have already received these funds. We are not asking for any money for restoration right now, but we might in the future.

Judge Leath moved to go on record as supporting this and appoint 3 people to be members of what they call the "Courthouse Team" that will be a part of "Preservation Texas." Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Commissioner Smith moved to appoint Judge Leath as the Chairman and for him to select 2 people to work with him. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Commissioner Nethery moved to give Ellen Meleton a certificate of appreciation or a resolution on her work on the "Forest Trails." Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Mrs. Meleton did this at her own expense. She and the group that she was a part of were able to get a grant on this project. It doesn't just cover Sabine County, but the trail begins in Sabine County and ends in Sabine County.

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

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ORDER ADOPTING RULES OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS FOR ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITIES PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission has established Design Criteria for on-site sewage facilities to provide the citizens of this State with adequate public health protection and a minimum of environmental pollution; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has exacted legislation, codified as Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 366, which authorizes a local government to requises the use of on-site servage disposal facilities in its jurisdiction in order to abuse or prevent pollution, or injury to public health arising out of the use of on-site servage facilities; and

WHEREAS, due notice was given of a meeting and public hearing to determine whether the Commissioner's Court of Sebine County, Texas should exact an order controlling or prohibiting the installation or use of on-site sewage facilities in the County of Sebine, Texas; and

WHEREAS, said mosting and public hearing were held in accordance with the notice thereof, and the evidence and arguments there presented were considered by the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas; and

WHEREAS; the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas find that the use of on-site sewage facilities in Sabine County, Texas is causing or may cause pollution, and is injuring or may injure the public health; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas has considered the matter and deems it appropriate to easet an Order adopting rules regulating on-site sewage facilities to abate or prevent pollution, or injury to public health in Sabine County, Texas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. THAT the matters and facts recited in the preamble hereof are hereby found and determined to be true and correct;

SECTION 2. THAT the use of on-site sewage facilities in Sabine County, Texas is causing or may cause pollution or is injuring or may injure the public health;

SECTION 3. THAT an Order for Sabine County, Texas BE adopted entitled "On-Site Sewage Disposal," which shall read as follows:

AN ORDER ENTITLED ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL

SECTION 4. CONFLICTS.

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All Orders or parts of the Orders of Sabine County, Texas not consistent with or in conflict with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. ADOPTING CHAPTER 366.

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The County of Sabine, Texas clearly understands the technical criteria, legal requirements, and administrative procedures and duties associated with regulating on-site sewage facilities, does adopt and will fully enforce Chapter 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code.

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SECTION 6. AREA OF JURISDICTION.

(a) The Rules shall apply to all the area lying in Sabine County, Texas, except for the area regulated under an emisting Rule and the areas within incorporated cities.
 (b) These Rules shall apply to those incorporated cities or towns that have executed intergovernmental contracts with Sabine County, Texas.

SECTION 7. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES

Any structure discharging servage into an on-site servage facility within the jurisdictional area of Sabine County, Is must comply with the Rules adopted in Section 8 of this Order.

SECTION 8. ON-SITE SEWACE FACILITY RULES ADOPTED.

The Rules ("Design Criteria For On-Site Sevenge Feelficier" and Administrative Rules 30 TAC 235.1 - 235.91 attached haveo, promolymed by the Taxas Natural Russure Conservation Commission for on-site-zeroage systems are hereby adopted, and all officials and employees of Sakine County, Texas having duties under said Rules are authorized to perform such duties as are required of them under said Rules.

SECTION 9. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

The Design Criteria and all fature amendments and revisions thereto are incorporated by reference and are thus do a part of these Rules. A copy of the current Design Criteria is attached to these Rules as Appendix I.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENTS

The County of Sahine, Tenne wishing to stopt more stringent Rules for its On-Site Servage Facility Order understands that the more aringent conflicting local Rule shall take precedence over the corresponding Tenne Natural Resource Conservation Commission requirement. Listed below are the more stringent Rules adopted by Sabine County, Tenne:

- E Ten Acre Examption. Regardless of the acreage a permit will be required for all on-site samage funlities.
- 3 Any Reasons insured by Sakino County will be transferable upon a satisfactory surface impection completed by a Reasond Darigunted Representive for the County. A fire will be paid to Recollabled Press When Supply Comparation prior to the completion of real estate surface importions for all transfer applications. All On-Site Service Publics that require maintenance contracts must have now maintenance contents insurf in the new owner's metric. 2

SECTION 11. DUTIES AND POWERS

The Dariganed Representative of Brocheland Fresh Water Supply Dilation for Solice County, Tennes is berwith declared the dariganed representative for the anticement of times Raise values in jurisdictional area. The appointed individual(s) must be approved and cardidal by the Tenne Natural Resources Conservation Commission before securing the daries and responsibilities of the Dariganied Representative for The Brocheland Fresh Water Supply Dilation (antity).

SECTION 12 COLLECTION OF FRES

All thes collected for permits and/or impection shall be made payable to Brookaland Fresh Water Supply

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District.

SECTION 13. APPEALS

Persons aggrieved by an action or decision of the designated representative may appeal such action or decision to the Board of Directors of The Brooksland Freeh Water Supply District.

SECTION 14. FENALTIES

This order adopts and incorporates all applicable penalty provisions related to on-site sewage facilities, including, but not limited to, those fixed in Chapters 341 and 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 26 of the Texas Water Code and 30 Tax Chapter 285.

SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY

It is increby deciared at be the intendion of the Commissioner's Court of Johine County, Texas that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sentions of this Order are severable, and if any phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph, or sention of this Order should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of component judiciliation, such contences, paragraphs, or sections of this Order, since the same would have been caused by the Commissioners Court without incorporation in this Order of such unconstitutional phrases, clause, sensence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 16. RELINQUEEELENT OF ORDER.

- If the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas decides that it no longer wishes to regulate on-site sewage facilities in its area of jurisdiction, the Commissioners Court shall follow the proceedance outlined below.
 (a) The Commissioners Court shall inform the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission by certified shall at least 30 days below the published date of the public hearing notice that it wishes to relinquish its Co-the Servage Paulity Ordinance.
 (b) The Commissioners Court shall past the sequired public notice in a newspaper regularly published or circulated in the area of jurisdiction at least 30 days prior to the anticipated date of action by the authorized spatt and spatt shall send a copy of the public notice, and a certified copy of the court's minutes to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.
 (c) The Commissioner's Court shall send a copy of the public notice, and a certified copy of the court's minutes to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.
 (d) Upon relinquishment of the order, the local governmental entity shall surrander its area of jurisdiction to the Commission.
 (e) Prior to interact of a ulternishment order the local governmental entity and the surrative director.

 - (c) Prior to insume of a relinquishment order the local governmental entity and the executive director shall determine the exact date the authorized egent would surrouder its authorized egent designation to the executive director.

SECTION 17. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Order shall be in fall force and effect from and after its date of approval as required by law and upon the approval of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.

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



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ORDER ADOPTING RULES OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS FOR ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITIES PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission has established Design Criteria for on-site sewage facilities to provide the citizens of this State with adequate public health protection and a minimum of environmental pollution; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has enacted legislation, codified as Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 366, which authorizes a local government to regulate the use of on-site sewage disposal facilities in its jurisdiction in order to abate or prevent pollution, or injury to public health arising out of the use of on-site sewage facilities; and

WHEREAS, due notice was given of a meeting and public hearing to determine whether the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas should enact an order controlling or prohibiting the installation or use of on-site sewage facilities in the County of Sabine, Texas; and

WHEREAS, said meeting and public hearing were held in accordance with the notice thereof, and the evidence and arguments there presented were considered by the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas; and

WHEREAS; the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas find that the use of on-site sewage facilities in Sabine County, Texas is causing or may cause pollution, and is injuring or may injure the public health; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas has considered the matter and deems it appropriate to enact an Order adopting rules regulating on-site sewage facilities to abate or prevent pollution, or injury to public health in Sabine County, Texas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. THAT the matters and facts recited in the preamble hereof are hereby found and determined to be true and correct;

SECTION 2. THAT the use of on-site sewage facilities in Sabine County, Texas is causing or may cause pollution or is injuring or may injure the public health;

SECTION 3. THAT an Order for Sabine County, Texas BE adopted entitled "On-Site Sewage Disposal," which shall read as follows:

AN ORDER ENTITLED ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL

SECTION 4. CONFLICTS.

All Orders or parts of the Orders of Sabine County, Texas not consistent with or in conflict with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5, ADOPTING CHAPTER 366.

The County of Sabine, Texas clearly understands the technical criteria, legal requirements, and administrative procedures and duties associated with regulating on-site sewage facilities, does adopt and will fully enforce Chapter 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code.

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SECTION 6. AREA OF JURISDICTION.

(a) The Rules shall apply to all the area lying in Sabine County, Texas, except for the area regulated under an existing Rule and the areas within incorporated cities.

(b) These Rules shall apply to those incorporated cities or towns that have executed intergovernmental contracts with Sabine County, Texas.

SECTION 7. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES.

Any structure discharging sewage into an on-site sewage facility within the jurisdictional area of Sabine County, Texas must comply with the Rules adopted in Section 8 of this Order.

SECTION 8. ON-SITE SEWAGE FACILITY RULES ADOPTED.

The Rules ("Design Criteria For On-Site Sewage Facilities" and Administrative Rules 30 TAC 285.1 - 285.91 attached hereto, promulgated by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission for on-site sewage systems are hereby adopted, and all officials and employees of Sabine County, Texas having duties under said Rules are authorized to perform such duties as are required of them under said Rules.

SECTION 9. INCORPORATION BY REFERENCE.

The Design Criteria and all future amendments and revisions thereto are incorporated by reference and are thus made a part of these Rules. A copy of the current Design Criteria is attached to these Rules as Appendix I.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENTS.

The County of Sabine, Texas wishing to adopt more stringent Rules for its On-Site Sewage Facility Order understands that the more stringent conflicting local Rule shall take precedence over the corresponding Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission requirement. Listed below are the more stringent Rules adopted by Sabine County, Texas:

- (a) Ten Acre Exemption. Regardless of the acreage a permit will be required for all on-site sewage facilities.
- (b) Any license issued by Sabine County will be transferable upon a satisfactory surface inspection completed by a licensed Designated Representative for the County. A fee will be paid to Brookeland Fresh Water Supply Corporation prior to the completion of real estate surface inspections for all transfer applications. All On-Site Sewage Facilities that require maintenance contracts must have new maintenance contracts issued in the new owner's name.

SECTION 11. DUTIES AND POWERS

The Designated Representative of Brookeland Fresh Water Supply District for Sabine County, Texas is herewith declared the designated representative for the enforcement of these Rules within its jurisdictional area. The appointed individual(s) must be approved and certified by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission before assuming the duties and responsibilities of the Designated Representative for The Brookeland Fresh Water Supply District (entity).

SECTION 12. COLLECTION OF FEES.

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All fees collected for permits and/or inspections shall be made payable to Brookeland Fresh Water Supply

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District.

SECTION 13. APPEALS

Persons aggrieved by an action or decision of the designated representative may appeal such action or decision to the Board of Directors of The Brookeland Fresh Water Supply District.

SECTION 14. PENALTIES

This order adopts and incorporates all applicable penalty provisions related to on-site sewage facilities, including, but not limited to, those found in Chapters 341 and 366 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 26 of the Texas Water Code and 30 Tac Chapter 285.

SECTION 15. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Order are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Order ahould be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Order, since the same would have been enacted by the Commissioners Court without incorporation in this Order of such unconstitutional phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 16. RELINQUISHMENT OF ORDER

If the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas decides that it no longer wishes to regulate on-site sewage facilities in its area of jurisdiction, the Commissioners Court shall follow the procedures outlined below.

- (a) The Commissioners Court shall inform the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission by certified mail at least 30 days before the published date of the public hearing notice that it wishes to relinquish its On-Site Sewage Facility Ordinance.
- (b) The Commissioners Court shall post the required public notice in a newspaper regularly published or circulated in the area of jurisdiction at least 30 days prior to the anticipated date of action by the authorized agent and must solicit written comments for that 30 day period.
- (c) The Commissioner's Court shall send a copy of the public notice, a publisher's affidavit of public notice, and a certified copy of the court's minutes to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.
- (d) Upon relinquishment of the order, the local governmental entity shall surrender its area of jurisdiction to the Commission.
- (e) Prior to issuance of a relinquishment order the local governmental entity and the executive director shall determine the exact date the authorized agent would surrender its authorized agent designation to the executive director.

SECTION 17. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of approval as required by law and upon the approval of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.

SUBCHAPTER B : LOCAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE OSSF PROGRAM §285.19-§285.11

§285.10. Delegation to Authorized Agents.

(a) Requirements/Procedures.

(1) Local governmental entities which desire to become authorized agents of the commission shall request such in writing to the executive director.

(2) Upon request, the executive director shall forward to the entity a description of the process of delegation and a copy of the model order/ordinance. Any changes to the model order/ ordinance by the local entity based on local conditions must be consistent with this chapter. The executive director shall be the sole and final authority in determining the acceptability of proposed changes from the model order/ordinance. A local government entity which wants to be designated an authorized agent for the OSSF program shall follow the following procedures:

(A) Upon request, the executive director shall provide model orders or ordinances to local entities.

(B) The executive director consults with local authorities as to specific procedures and requirements to obtain authorized agent status.

(C) The local government entity shall draft an order or resolution regulating OSSFs within its jurisdiction which meets the requirements of §366.032 of the Texas Health and Safety Code. In the event that the local government entity drafts a proposed order which is different from the model order/ordinance, the local government entity shall submit the proposed order/ordinance to the executive director for review and comment prior to notice being published. Within 30 days of receipt of the proposed order/ordinance, the executive director shall review the proposal and provide comment to the local government entity on whether the proposed order/ordinance meets the agency's minimum requirements. (D) The local government entity shall cause notice to be published, in a newspaper regularly published and of general circulation in the area of jurisdiction, of a public hearing to be held to discuss the adoption of the proposed order or resolution;

(E) The local government entity shall hold a public meeting to discuss the proposed order or resolution;

(F) The local government entity shall adopt that order or resolution;

(G) The local government entity shall send a certified copy of the minutes of the meeting which adopted the order or resolution;

(H) The local government entity shall send a certified copy of the order or

(I) Upon receipt of the complete package requesting delegation, the executive director will review to see that it complies with the requirements of this chapter and Chapter 366 of the Health and Safety Code. If found to be compliant, the executive director will notify the local entity by mail of their authorized agent status and the date the authorized agent shall assume jurisdiction of the OSSF program. The authorized agent shall administer its OSSF program in accordance with its approved OSSF waste disposal order/ordinance. All authorized agents shall maintain their orders/ordinances in accordance with the minimum requirements of this chapter.

(b) Amendments to existing orders/ordinances. The amendment procedure may be initiated by the authorized agent in accordance with subsection (a) of this section. The executive director may require periodic revisions or renewals of OSSF orders/ordinances for compliance with new rules or regulations.

(c) Resolution of nuisance complaints by an authorized agent. A major activity of any authorized agent is the satisfactory resolution of nuisance complaints involving OSSFs. An authorized agent may require a property owner to repair a malfunctioning OSSFs on the owner's property not later than the 30th day after the date which the owner is notified by the authorized agent of the malfunctioning system.

(d) Authorized agent's reporting requirements. Each authorized agent shall provide to the executive director a detailed monthly report of OSSF activities as prescribed by the executive director. Categories in this report shall include, but not be limited to the following:

(1) subdivision reviews;

(2) complaint and enforcement activities;

(3) information on the numbers and types of OSSFs permitted; and

(4) administrative activities performed by the authorized agent.

(e) Relinquishment of authorized agent delegation. If an authorized agent decides to relinquish its delegation to regulate OSSFs under the regulatory authority granted by Chapter 366 of the Health and Safety Code and this chapter, the authorized agent shall adhere to the following procedures:

(1) The authorized agent shall inform the executive director by certified mail at least 30 days prior to publishing the notice that it wishes to relinquish its OSSF order.

(2) The authorized agent shall publish notice, indicating its intent to relinquish, in a newspaper regularly published or circulated in the area of jurisdiction prior to taking further action to relinquish.

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(3) The authorized agent shall send the executive director copies of the following: the public notice, a publisher's affidavit of public notice, and a certified copy of the entity's minutes of the meeting in which it formally considered relinquishment of its delegation.

(4) The executive director shall process the request for relinquishment and may issue an order relinquishing the authority to regulate OSSFs within an authorized agent's jurisdiction or may refer the request to relinquish to the commission.

(5) Prior to issuance of a relinquishment order the local governmental entity and the executive director shall determine the exact date the authorized agent would surrender its authorized agent designation to the executive director.

(f) Revocation of authorized agent delegation.

(1) An authorized agent must consistently enforce this chapter and Chapter 366 of Health and Safety Code.

(2) An authorized agent's OSSF order may be revoked at any time by order of the commission for good cause after opportunity for public hearing is given in accordance with Subchapter C of the Texas Administrative Procedures Act.

(3) Failure by an authorized agent to consistently enforce this chapter, or Chapter 366 of the Health and Safety Code is good cause for revocation.

(4) When the executive director determines that revocation is warranted a petition seeking revocation may be filed by the executive director with the commission requesting that a public hearing be held.

(5) If the executive director files a petition for revocation with the commission, notice shall be given to the authorized agent of the time and place for the hearing not less than ten days prior to the hearing by certified mail, return receipt requested.

(6) If an authorized agent wants to consent to revocation, a written request or a written consent and wavier may be filed with the executive director not later than ten days after the receipt of notice of the petition to revoke. If the authorized agent requests or consents to revocation, the executive director may revoke without the necessity of a public hearing or commission action. The executive director shall notify the commission of each revocation of an authorized agent's authority.

(7) Upon completion of a public hearing the commission may do any of the following:

(A) Issue an order revoking the authorized agent's delegation;

(B) Issue an order placing the authorized agent on probation for a specified

period of time; or

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(C) Take no action on the request.

(8) Upon issuance of a revocation order by the commission, the executive director shall assume responsibility for the OSSF program in the former agent's jurisdiction.

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§285.11. Review of Locally Administered Programs.

The executive director shall review not more than once per year an authorized agent's locally administered program for adequate performance and compliance with requirements established by Chapter 366, Texas Health and Safety Code, this chapter, and the order/ordinance adopted by the authorized agent. If the executive director's review determines that an authorized agent does not enforce the commission's minimum requirements for OSSFs, the commission may hold a hearing to determine whether the entity shall lose its designation as an authorized agent in accordance with §285.10(f) of this title (relating to Delegation to Authorized Agents).
