Monday, October 22, 2001, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item \#1-General Business
Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the October $8^{\text {th }}$ regular session of Court. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item \#7-Consider and Possible Take Action on E.M.S.
Commissioner Nethery thanked the other Ambulance Committee Members, Don Iles, Mr. Booker and Edith McCauley, for being here today. He said we are having major difficulty collecting our money from Medicaid and we have not collected any monies from Medicare. We have called and tried every way, everything we can think of to find out what we are doing wrong or just exactly what the problem is. He passed out an Aging Report Summary to the Court. He walked the Court through the report. (See attached copy)

Mrs. McCauley said that Medicaid would not pay any calls they deem not medically necessary. When a call comes through 911 , the run has to be made even if it is not medically necessary.

Commissioner Nethery said Mr. Iles suggested that a letter be sent to all the ministers in the area explaining the situation with the ambulance service. On the short term, please reconsider buying a membership, and on the long term, that an E M S District be created. An E M S District operates very similar to a Hospital District in that it has taxing authority up to $\$ .10 / \$ 100.00$ evaluation. The option to not have an ambulance service is always there but the Committee feels that is not an acceptable choice.

Judge Leath said he feels that we will get the 15 percent FS funds within the next 30 days but cannot say exactly when.

Commissioner Nethery said 1 option is to reduce the service from $1 \frac{1}{2}$ to 1 ambulances a day. This would reduce our payroll by approximately 25 to 30 percent. We think from an operating stand, outside ambulance service would have to been called in. We will not be able to make any transfers and that is where your money is. All calls would be taken to our local hospital. We will have to contact all members because we told them that we would take them to Jasper, Lufkin or Nacogdoches. The Committee does not think this is a responsible thing to do however on the other hand it is not responsible for us to recommend something that is going to drive the County into bankruptcy.

Commissioner Nethery said Samantha Payne with Congressman Turner's office has sent word that they are going to do a mass billing for us with Medicare. It kind of concerns me when Washington says not to worry that they are going to take care of something for me but maybe they will.

The Committee, for the long term and based on what we know today, recommends that the Commissioners' Court take steps to put in place an Emergency Services District. We have not checked the legalities on this yet with our County Attorney. If we form an Emergency Services District and incorporate the Volunteer Fire Departments in with it and tax the 10 cents per 100 dollar evaluation, 2 cents would go to the Volunteer Fire Departments and 8 cents would go to the Emergency Services District. The 2 cents for the VFD would create approximately 65 thousand dollars. The 8 cents would be approximately 265 thousand dollars a year at the current tax rate. We have a business that looks great on paper but the problem is that we can not collect what is due our Ambulance Service.

Edith McCauley said that most transfers are at night and because we only have 1 ambulance during this time, we have to call in an ambulance from Jasper of San Augustine to do the transfer. These would be medically necessary so there should not be a problem with Medicare paying. We are losing out on this money.

Mr. Booker said we are at a reduced service now and would hate to see us cut back to just 1 ambulance.

Commissioner Nethery said the Committee has been struggling with this and has worked hard at it. This is where we are now.


Judge Leath said according to what it shows as the balance of the EMS account, we will not even be able to make payroll next week without borrowing more money. Within 30 about days, the 100 thousand dollars that we borrowed for operating up to this point has to be zeroed out. The only place it can come is out of the general fund. The general fund can not pay 100 thousand dollars every 90 days. We would be bankrupt in a year. There are only 2 or maybe 3 things that can happen. We have to get income from some other source than the County general fund. We could cut services but it would still operate at a deficit. We can get out of the ambulance service or probably the better solution is the Emergency Services District. If the district is formed and approved by the voters, we can not collect a penny until October of next year.

Commissioner Nethery said they have contacted everyone that they can think of to contact.

No action was taken.
Agenda item \#3-Line Item Transfers
No transfers were submitted.
Agenda item \#4-Transfer Funds to Special \#1
Commissioner Clark moved to transfer $\$ 3,000$ from each of the precincts into Special \#1 for gradall repairs. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. The money was budgeted for this but has not been transferred.

Agenda item \#5-Discuss and Possibly Take Action on H.B. 1362

## "Dangerous Wild Animals"

Judge Leath said this item has come before the Court before and it was agreed to not do anything. Our understanding was that if we did nothing, it would fall on the Sheriff to handle it.

Sheriff Maddox said the Court has 2 options. It is either to prohibit the keeping of wild animals or establish a registration program by no later than December $1^{\text {st }}$. He said he would like to check with the surrounding Counties to see how they are going to handle this new law.

No action was taken.
Agenda item \#6-Consider and Possibly Take action on Naming the Sheriff's Office


Sheriff Maddox said he would like to change the name from "Sabine County Jail" to "Blan Greer Law Enforcement Center." He said that other counties have done this for past Sheriffs that dedicated a large portion of their lives to the office. Blan Greer served as Sheriff of Sabine County for 34 years and he thought it would be fitting to recognize him.

The Court was in agreement with Sheriff Maddox but decided it would need to be advertised of the change to give the public a chance to give their opinion.

Judge Leath moved to advertise the proposed name change on Wednesday, October $24^{\text {th }}$ and give the public 30 days for comment. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. Comments may be given to the County Judge or any of the Commissioners. See attached copy.

Agenda item \#8-Possibly Take Action on Interlocal Agreement for 911 Service Addressing Database Maintenance Coordination

Judge Leath said that basically this agreement says we agree for any state monies we get for maintenance to go to DETCOG rather than coming to us. He said he is not ready right now to make that decision. We need to look at proformance up to this point. It would to his recollection be about $\$ 25,000$ a year.

Commissioner Nethery said hasn't the success we have had been done ourselves?

Judge Leath said this money would begin after all the addressing is complete. It will be used to update the addressing on a periodically. He suggested the Court have Mr. Van Bush come up here and answer our questions.

No action was taken.
Agenda item \#9-Take Action - Reschedule November Commissioners' Court Meeting

November $12^{\text {th }}$ is the scheduled holiday for Veterans' Day. This is a County holiday.

Commissioner Dickerson moved to change the Court date to Friday, November $9^{\text {th }}$. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

To Whom It May Concern:
The Sabine County EMS Volunteer Committee charged with overseeing the operation of our county owned ambulances, needs your help. We operate 2 ambulances at daytime and 1 at night.

We are currently six (6) months into the operation. When we began operations on April 1, 2001, our goal was to sell 3000 memberships, secure donations from various sources, and coupled with our cash flow be able to sustain the operation with a minimal subsidy from the County's General Fund. We made necessary arrangements to borrow $\$ 200,000.00$ to fund the early months until we could achieve a cash flow.

To date we have only sold approximately 700 memberships, have received approximately $\$$ $35,000.00 \mathrm{~m}$ donations from such sources as The Pinolend Service Club, and several doctor groups, totaling about $\$ 75,000.00$ when you include the monies from the sale of memberships.

We have currently expended most of the donated funds and $\$ 175,000.00$ in borrowed funds.
We are experiencing severe difficulty in collecting charges to Medicare, of all the montes owed to us, about 70\% are chargeable to Medicare. Our cost to operate on the current basis is approximately $\$ 40,000.00 /$ month. The County has always accepted the fact that it would be required to contribute up to $\$ 10,000.00$ from the general fund, but no more.

At this time it is the recommendation of the EMS committee, ie. Edith MaCaulay, Don Isles, John Booker and myself that for the long range an EMS District be formed. Of course, before that can happen, you the voters will have to vole It up or down. An EMS District operates very similar to a hospital district in that it has taxing authority up to $\$ .10 \$ 100.00$ valuation. Since a volunteer tax in the form of memberships has proven un-succeasful to date, there remains male choice for us. Of course one option is always available and that is not to have the service. We believe that to be un-acceptable.

On the short term, being for the next 12 months, we are attempting to get help from the state. Both Rep. Christian and Senator Staples are working on our behalf in search of emergency funding. If this effort proves un-succesaful and the membership interest doesn't improve, steps will have to be taken to drastically reduce cost. This action will go into effect within the next 30 days.

Your prayers and continued interest in this community problem is vital. We appeal to you as Christian leaders to help us solve this problem.

H.B. 1362 (Dangerous Wild Animal Bill), which became law on September 1, 2001, requires counties to either:

1) Totally prohibit the keeping of dangerous wild animals (see amended Section 240.002 of the Local Government Code); or
2) establish a registration program to regulate the keeping of these animals (see new Subchapter E, Chapter 822, Texas Health and Safety Code).

If a county chooses option 2) above, it must, no later than December 1, 2001, set the registration fees and approve the form and content of the application for and certificate of registration. The agency responsible for administration and enforcement of the registration program is the county animal control office or, in a county that has no animal control office, the county sheriff. All registrations must be in place by June 1, 2002.

The Texas Humane Legislation Network has developed an Application form and a Certificate of Registration form (copies of which are enclosed) for use in setting up your registration program. These forms have been approved by the Texas Department of Health Zoonosis Division and can be downloaded from their website at www.thl state, tx, us/zonnosis. The forms are also available on our website at www.thln.com or you can order hard copies from us free of charge. We hope this notice and the easy availability of forms will be helpful to you.
