David Waxman said that in running the numbers of the competition, their best guess is to take the money the State has offered. G-M has voted to keep the money and not risk losing the \$107,577.00.

Agenda item #9-Public Hearing-Discuss and Possibly Take Action on Accepting Roads in Sandy Creek Estates, Pct. #2 for County Maintenance

This item has been advertised in the local newspaper and posted on the doors on the first floor of the Courthouse.

Judge Leath asked if there was anyone present in opposition of this. No one replied.

Mike Jeansonne reaffirmed to the Court that he is giving the 62 feet that he had previously held back.

Commissioner Smith also reaffirmed with Mr. Jeansonne that the lot owners have agreed to pay for cost of materials for the initial upgrade of the roads not to exceed \$9,000.00.

Commissioner Smith moved to accept the road going into the Sandy Creek Estates as well as the roads inside the Subdivision as public roads with County maintenance. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-Consider Accepting Roads in Timberland Sub., Pct. #2, as County Road with County Maintenance

Commissioner Smith said this is another subdivision in his precinct.

Pete Issacs presented a petition to the Court requesting that their roads inside the subdivision be accepted as public roads with County maintenance. There is approximately 47 property owners and we have petitions signed by 34 of them. He



said to his knowledge, there is 1 person refusing to sign the petition and that is because of the cost of the initial upgrading of the roads.

Commissioner Smith moved to begin the process of accepting the roads and to schedule a public hearing for the April 22nd Commissioners' Court.

We feel like tourism is a County thing and everyone in the County should participate in it. Whoever the Court chooses, we want to work with that person for the betterment of the County.

Court recessed into executive session at 9:30 a.m.







Sabine County

Contractor shall carry out the following activities in the target area identified in its 2000 Community Development Fund application. Contractor shall ensure that the amount of funds expended for each activity described herein does not exceed the amount specified for such activity in Exhibit B, Budget.

Water Facilities

Contractor shall provide assistance to the Beechwood Water Supply Corporation (WSC) in addressing water system deficiencies identified in a Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) enforcement order. Construction shall consist of the installation of one (1) new water well, including fencing and related sitewolk and approximately five thousand two hundred linear feet (5,200 l.f.) of six-inch (6") water line, one (1) gate valve, one (1) master meter, and emergency generator. Construction of the well shall take place on a one-and-one-half (1½) acre site owned by the South Sabine Water Supply Corporation. The installation of the water line shall take place from the South Sabine WSC to the Beechwood WSC along the existing right-of-way.

These activities shall benefit two hundred sixty-two (262) persons, of which one hundred sixty-six (166) or sixty-three percent (63%) are of low to moderate income.

Contractor shall ensure that the amount of Department funds expended for all eligible project-related engineering services, including preliminary and final design plans and specifications, all interim and final inspections, and all special services does not exceed the amount specified for engineering in Exhibit B, Budget.

Administration

Contractor shall ensure that the amount of Department funds expended for all eligible project-related administration activities, including the required annual program compliance and fiscal audit does not exceed the amount specified for administration in Exhibit B, Budget.



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

The Forest Service is proposing to remove the two bridges on FS 117 (Big Sandy Creek), remove the old roadbed located between these bridges, and restore the stream banks and floodplain.

These bridges are primarily located on private land owned by Dean Vance. Part of the east bridge is on Forest Service lands. Access to private lands will not be affected by this proposal. Big Sandy Creek is the property boundary. TxDOT will be constructing a new bridge in the near future. The new bridge will be located south of the existing bridges.

Neither bridge is structurally sound and cannot be used to access the old roadbed. The removal of the old roadbed will require the west bridge to be removed first, and then construct a temporary crossing. The fill material in the old roadbed is good and can be used elsewhere. At the present time, Sabine River Authority and Sabine County Commissioner Lynn Smith have expressed an interest in removing and using this fill material.

The Forest Service will contract and fund the removal of the two bridges and restoration of the stream banks and floodplain.

WHEREAS, the federal off-system bridge program is administered by the Texas Department of Transportation (the State) to replace or rehabilitate structurally deficient and functionally obsolete (collectively referred to as deficient) bridges located on public roads and streets off the designated state highway system; and





INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT REGULATING SUBDIVISIONS IN THE EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF PINELAND BETWEEN THE CITY OF PINELAND AND SABINE COUNTY

Agreement is entered into by and between the City of Pineland, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "City", a Municipal Corporation located in Sabine County, Texas, with the authorization of the governing body; and Sabine County, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "County", a political subdivision of the State of Texas with the authorization of its governing body.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CITY and COUNTY are required to enter into this Interlocal Agreement pursuant to H.B. 1445, no later than April 1, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) of the City is the unincorporated area that is contiguous to the corporate boundaries within one-half mile of those boundaries; and

WHEREAS, CITY and COUNTY may not each regulate subdivisions in the ETI of the City; and

WHEREAS, CITY and COUNTY desires to promote and protect the general health, safety, and welfare of persons residing in the ET]; and

WHEREAS, CITY and COUNTY desires to promote the safe, orderly, and healthful development of the City;

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NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties mutually agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1) Regulation. The City shall have exclusive authority to regulate subdivision plats and approve related permits in the EI].
- 2) <u>Term.</u> The term of this Interlocal Agreement shall be for ten years from the date of approval, which is March 19, 2002.
- 3) Assignment/Amendment. The parties hereto may not assign this Agreement. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this Agreement shall be of no force of effect, except that the parties may modify this Agreement in a writing signed by each party and expressly authorized by the governing body of each party.
- 4) Entirety. This document constitutes the entire Agreement of the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. Any prior arrangements, promises, negotiations, or representatives not expressly contained in this Agreement are of no force and effect.
- 5) Severability. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such as invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provisions had never been contained herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recital and mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- The City and County agree that Commissioner Lynn Smith may assist
 the City in providing labor and services in connection with the City's
 efforts in improving drainage within the City's jurisdictional limits.
- 2) The City and County agree that any assistance provided will be by agreement between Commissioner Lynn Smith and Mayor John Booker.
- 3) The City agrees to indemnify and hold the County harmless from any loss, damage, and expense, caused by the assertion of any claims, demands, or actions arising in connection with the County's actions as referenced herein



4) This agreement may be terminated by the City or County with or without cause by the terminating party providing ten days written notice of termination to the other party
