Monday, April 22, 2002, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court met in regular session. The following members of Court were present:

Judge Leath called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and Bro. Clarence Howell led the Court in prayer.

Agenda item #11-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Maintenance Agreement with 911 Deep East Texas Council of Government-DETCOG

Judge Leath said that in our 911 addressing we are approaching our maintenance stage. The State will furnish about \$24,000.00 a year for the maintenance phase. We have to designate who the money will go to. He said it is his and Dale's recommendation that the money come to the County. Dale will assume the responsibility of the maintenance and the money will come to the County instead of going to DETCOG and them doing our maintenance. It will be more convenient for the people to go to Dale's office instead of having to go to Jasper.

Commissioner Clark moved for the money to come through the County system with Dale being the coordinator and doing the maintenance. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #1-General Business

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the minutes as written for the April 8<sup>th</sup> Court meeting. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #3-Line Item Transfers

Commissioner Clark moved to approve the line item transfer for precinct 2. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Agenda item #17-Review Reports on Hotel/Motel Tax and Possibly Take
Action

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Judge Leath said the marina owners have been polled by the Court with the 3 following options:

- 1. Discontinue the Hotel/Motel tax.
- 2. Continue the Hotel/Motel tax as it is.
- 3. Cut the Hotel/Motel tax by two thirds.

Commissioner Nethery said he talked to several marina owners and 1 told him that they would like to do away with the tax, they do not see any value in it.

Another said they favored cutting it in half, they can not raise their rates because of the tax and that customers are complaining about the tax. A third marina owner said they think it should continue as it is.

Commissioner Nethery said he would also like to speak on the subject also as President of DETA, Deep East Texas Development Association, this year. He said DETA is a group of volunteers that have come together to try to address the betterment of East Texas in general. High on our list is tourism and retirement and how we can attract more retirees to our area. He said all this goes to say that he feels we should continue to contribute very heavily toward addressing Sabine County as a part of the region of Deep East Texas. From DETA and other Tourist Bureaus, Lisa Owens has done a very good job and would recommend to continue that way.

Commissioner Smith said he has 9 businesses in his precinct that collects the Hotel/Motel tax money. He received 3 answers for each of the questions asked.

Commissioner Clark said he has talked to Don Iles, part owner of Lowe's Creek Marina. Mr. Iles is present in Court today so Commissioner Clark asked him to speak on his feelings on the matter.

Mr. Iles said the biggest complaint as a marina owner is that we do not see a lot of value for the dollars collected. He said it is hard to go up on your rates when you are collecting a 13% tax attached to the room cost. We have a lot of competition with Sam Rayburn and other lakes in the area. We would not mind collecting the tax if we could see any return on the dollar.

Commissioner Smith said he put this item on the agenda to let Lisa give a report on the delinquent taxes and to decide if we wanted to take action.

Judge Leath said since we are on the subject, we have 8 marina owners that want a change and 4 that do not. Making a change is not on the agenda so we will not act on that today.

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Commissioner Smith said Lisa needs to give her report.

Lisa Owens handed out to the Court a report on the Hotel/Motel taxes that have been collected and some that has not been paid. The outstanding balance due for 2000 is \$427.05 and for 2001 it is \$4,136.00. She said the rates for surrounding Hotels are as much or more than we are. She said tourism employs full time 450 people in Sabine County.

Maggie Hauser said that housekeepers make \$7.00 an hour. Maintenance people make \$7.50 an hour. These are part time jobs but they are not employed anywhere else.

Linda Mier said she has not had a customer complain about the tax money collected. She said she was one of the ones that said no at first. Now she is not so sure about it. If Sabine County is going to continue going forward, then she wants the hotel/motel tax to continue.

Maggie Hauser, owner of Fox's Lodge, said that the direction the Court is going is a good one. She said they have never gotten any complaints about the price of their rooms. We need to keep the Director of Tourism separate from all others and only responsible to this Court.

Tricia Jacks, Sabine County Treasurer, told the Court that she believes they should look at the financial records before they make a permanent decision. We have gotten through with the audit and last year we did not collect enough Hotel/Motel tax receipts to cover what was spent. If we keep dipping into the reserve, we will not have enough to cover the extra expense. If it had not been for the interest earned on this account last year, we would have had lacked about \$4,000.00 in funds to make up for the expenditures. She said she has a preliminary copy of the audit.

Mrs. Mier said we have Marinas that are delinquent in their taxes and she would like to see the collection of these taxes pursued. It would be more than enough to cover the amount that the expenditures was over.

Ms. Owens said \$4,136.00 was outstanding from the 2001 taxes.

Commissioner Smith moved to pursue collecting the delinquent taxes through our County Attorney. Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #4-Take Action on Appointment of Tourism Director



Commissioner Smith said several years ago the Court said it was time to hire a full time Tourism Director. We found that we could not hire someone qualified at the rate of pay we were offering. He said he believes we are at the point now that we have a good Director and does not see that we can do better than what we have for the amount of money we are paying. The process of the interviewing we just recently did showed us that. He said he thinks it is time that we quit holding Lisa in limbo. He said he thinks Lisa is doing a good job and he doesn't know of anyone that could do better.

Commissioner Nethery agreed with Commissioner Smith.

Judge Leath said he as far as he can remember, we have never spent a penny of Hotel/Motel tax money that has not been squabbled over and he is tired of hearing about it. One group would have spent it one way and another wanted it spent another way. He said he can't honestly say that since he has been here he can see where we have done any good. We have paid thousands of dollars to have people distribute brochures and as far as we know they could be in a canyon in Arizona. He asked the Court if they knew.

Commissioner Smith said that the Judge is right but one thing he can see is that a building that has been vacant for years is now rented and one family in the County that is being fed because of this.

Judge Leath said he thinks we do need to look at the survey. If there are 8 Marina owners that are wanting a change, we need to at least consider that.

Commissioner Clark moved to table this item until the next regular Court meeting. Commissioner Dickerson seconded.

Commissioners Clark and Dickerson voted for the motion. Commissioners Smith and Nethery voted against. Judge Leath broke the tie vote with a vote for the motion. Motion carried.

Agenda item #5-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Sabinetown Cemetery

Judge Leath said this has been turned over to the District Attorney because it has to go through him to get it closed. He said Mrs. Phillips has indicated that she has donated some land to enlarge the cemetery and is in the process of having it surveyed.

Nina Gooch with the Daughters of the Republic of Texas told the Court that they have met and voted to not sell any more plots in the cemetery and to return

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any money received. She said the District Attorney recommended that they close the cemetery for 6 months. They will decide what to do after the 6 months.

Judge Leath said that no action will be taken today.

Agenda item #16-Note: Public Hearing-Timberlane Subdivision/Possibly Take Action

No one was present to speak against this agenda item.

Commissioner Smith moved to accept the roads in Timberlane Subdivision as public roads with County maintenance with the understanding that the property owners will pay for the culverts needed for the roads. This also includes a drainage from one of the streets down to the lake. We have already gotten permission from the property owner. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #6-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Trust Bids One bid was received. It is as follows:

Fred D. Dawson, III and Alice A. Dawson-

lots 42 and 43 Mill Creek Estates-\$1000.00 each Lot

Commissioner Dickerson moved to accept the bid from the Dawsons.

Commissioner Nethery seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Agenda item #7-Discuss Sabine Tourist Commission, Possibly Take Action on Appointment

Commissioner Nethery moved to table this agenda item. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #8-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Renewal Policy on all Insurance Excluding Health Insurance

The Judge has not received a quote from TAC as of this morning.

Commissioner Nethery moved to stay with TAC. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #10-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Parks and Wildlife Grant Requested by the City of Hemphill

Don Iles said the City is applying for a 50/50 matching fund grant for \$100,000.00. There are 2 phases. First, the Dixie League has about 80 to 100 kids up to 12 years old playing. There is not a field for the 13/14 year-old group to practice on. The high school field is too large and they will not them play or practice on it until after baseball season. They are traveling to Pineland, Newton



and San Augustine to play baseball. The first project is to construct a 300-foot baseball field for this age group to play on. That is going to cost in materials alone about \$28,000.00. Probably looking at about \$40,000.00 total to build it. The labor is going to be in-kind match. The second phase is to build a concrete basketball-court, renovate the bathrooms, lighted volleyball court, 2 new ADA accessible drinking fountains, 6 new picnic tables, 2 large new playground equipment, large group grill, and some landscaping, etc. This is another \$70,000.00 to the project. He said they already have some donations. Commissioner's Court has already donated \$4,500.00 of in-kind services and you have a Resolution that we are requesting you approve. Also, he said they are asking that the County contribute some cash. He said if they don't get the grant, he wants to have enough funds and in-kind service to at least build the field.

Commissioner Smith said he is in favor of this project but he said he thinks we would be setting a bad precedence if we contributed cash.

Judge Leath said he is not against the cash but doesn't know if we have the cash.

Commissioner Nethery moved to approve the Resolution and to make a commitment of \$7,500.00 of in-kind contributions. This includes the \$4,500.00 already donated. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #9-Consider and Possibly Take Action on Application Request for Exemption from Ad Valorem Tax From Pineland Lodge #1166

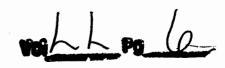
Commissioner Dickerson moved to approve the request and Resolution.

Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copy.

Agenda item #12-Discuss and Possibly Take Action on County Jail Repairs Sheriff Maddox told the Court that there is a lot of settling of the foundation of the jail. This is causing cracks in the walls. He said they have filled the cracks and next they are going to spray a silicone coating over the walls. The material cost is going to be between 16 and 17 hundred dollars (\$1,600-\$1,700). The labor is being done by inmates. We will probably still have to eventually jack it up and fill in the foundation. He said he has this money in his budget but he wants the Court to know that if something else major happens, his budget will not cover it.

Commissioner Nethery moved to acknowledge what the Sheriff has said .

Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.



The Court commended the Sheriff for recognizing the problem and for keeping the cost as low as possible.

Agenda item #13-Take Action on Naming County Judge as Program Director for the Texas Task Force on Indigent Defense

Commissioner Smith moved to appoint Judge Leath. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #14-Discuss and Possibly Take Action on Letter of Support for a State Veterans Cemetery Located in Tyler County

Commissioner Nethery moved to write a letter of support to Tyler County. Commissioner Smith seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #15-Discuss and Take Action on Nominations to the Regional Aging Advisory Council

Commissioner Nethery moved to appoint Commissioner Clark and Mrs. Mildred Travis. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #2-Reports

Commissioner Nethery moved to accept the reports from the Extension Agents, Treasurer and the Tax Assessor. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item #18-Pay Accounts and Salaries

Commissioner Nethery moved to pay the accounts and salaries.

Commissioner Dickerson seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Commissioner Nethery moved to adjourn. Commissioner Dickerson seconded. Meeting adjourned.

## 9-1-1 Addressing Maintenance Resolution

WHEREAS, in an effort to implement Enhanced Automatic Location identification services, the Deep East Texas Council of Governments (DETCOG) and Sabine County have participated in the development and implementation of rural addressing efforts; and

WHEREAS, maintenance of rural addressing system following address conversion is necessary for continuous operations of an Enhanced 9-1-1 emergency communications system which relies on the automatic display of a caller's telephone number and address location when they dial 9-1-1; and

WHEREAS, at present, Sabine County should designate who will maintain the county level 9-1-1 address database and digital map for road file updates, address corrections and future address assignments:

Sabine County designates the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Coordinator to take responsibility for maintenance functions on behalf of Sabine County.

The Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Coordinator will be responsible for resolving addressing discrepancies received from telephone companies by processing error reports and will provide digital mapping services for road updates, new address assignments, emergency service provider boundary changes, and will be the point of contact for resident inquiries as outlined in the Sabine County Addressing Maintenance Plan and will be responsible for providing the trained workforce necessary to fulfill these tasks.

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Commissioners' Court of Sabine County designates the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Coordinator to maintain its Enhanced 9-1-1 emergency communications addressing database.

## Sabine County Address Maintenance Database Plan

Purpose:

The purpose is to ensure 9-1-1 maintenance procedures within Sabine County are compliant with Texas Commission on State Emergency Communications Rules and support local, regional, and statewide objectives of the 9-1-1 Emergency Number System.

Objective:

The objective of this plan is to document procedures that have been developed and maintain data (maps and other records) associated with the Sabine County 9-1-1 ENS. This plan also documents projected costs associated with maintenance of the system.

Responsibilities:

Sabine County Commissioners' Court

It is the responsibility of the Sabine County Commissioners' Court to ensure the system is operated and maintained to facilitate the delivery of an emergency call to the appropriate emergency response agency. The Sabine County Commissioners' Court may delegate certain responsibilities to another entity, and will be responsible for overseeing that entity's work.

Sabine County Commissioners' Court will be responsible for approving new roads and road number changes. The Sabine County Commissioners' Court will be responsible for the installation and upkeep of new or existing signage for County Roads and/or Private Roads. The Sabine County Commissioners' Court will have to determine when a Private Road sign is warranted. (As a general rule, a Private Road sign will be provided when three or more structures are addressed to such Private Road or when public safety warrants installation of such Private Road sign)

Based on the approved addressing maintenance budget for sign replacement costs, Sabine County Commissioners' Court will utilize these State funds in the approved Addressing Maintenance budget at a rate of 50% reimbursement basis.

In addition, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court will:

- 1. provide a phone number answered during regular business hours for resident seeking address information
- 2. provide hardware, software, and other equipment needed to operate address maintenance database

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- ensure a properly equipped, trained and competent 9-1-1 addressing technician which will be available to perform functions and responsibilities of county level address maintenance
- Sabine County Commissioners' Court shall be responsible for overseeing the work of the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Coordinator.

Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Coordinator (Scope of Work)
It is the responsibility of the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing
Coordinator to provide the following maintenance services:

- 1. report to Commissioners' Court and/or County's on monthly basis of address maintenance activities
- 2. assign addresses to new structures
- 3. number new subdivisions and developments
- reviewing requests for new street name assignments and changes (subject to approval of Sabine County Commissioners' Court)
- 5. maintain an accurate geobase (i.e., digital maps, maps, database)
- 6. Updating and synchronize the county level database with the DETCOG regional database and State database.
- 7. solve address discrepancies and numbering problems
- 8. provide addressing/street delineation maps and database information to other agencies for emergency service provision
- 9. re-address streets or areas where inconsistencies in numbering cause problems for emergency number providers
- maintain the integrity of the 9-1-1 database through verification and updates to the telephone company's Master Street Address Guide (MSAG)
- 11. develop and maintain accurate maps and map books for distribution to emergency number providers
- 12. work with telephone companies to reach any residents missed in initial address notification
- 13. work with U.S. Postal Service to complete postal conversion
- 14. provide public education for address maintenance needs
- provide data to the Deep East Texas Council of Governments and the Commission of State Emergency Communications as requested

**Maintenance Procedures** 

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## Old Addresses:

The 9-1-1 physical address will remain with the structure, even though the residents or nature of the commercial business may change. Inquiries will still be received to ascertain or confirm a 9-1-1 address. In most cases, this can be accomplished by locating the structure on a map "browser" digital file in MapInfo. If the address cannot be located, a new address will be assigned within 3 working days.

### New Addresses:

Each new structure (house, manufactured home, commercial building) located within the unincorporated areas of Sabine County will require a new address. These addresses will be assigned in accordance with the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Standards as adopted by the Sabine County Commissioners' Court. In most cases this is accomplished by starting at the beginning of the road and measuring from a known point (a 9-1-1 address) immediately preceding the structure being addressed. If no structure exists prior to the one being assigned, then measurement will be from the beginning of the road. The assignment of a new address on a current road will be within 3 working days of the request. In the event that the residence requires the Commissioners' Court to assign a new road, the assignment of the new address will be within 3 working days of the designation.

## New Roads and Road Number Changes:

The designation or change of a County Road or Private Road must be approved by the Commissioners' Court. DETCOG will assist the County in determining the appropriate road number and name to be designated. The addition of structures on a private drive will be the most frequent requirement for the designation of a new road. Under certain conditions the County may agree to assume maintenance for a previously designated private road. In either case the road will be numbered in accordance with the Sabine County 9-1-1 Addressing Standards and the information will be used to update the maps, MSAGs, and the databases.

Installation of New Signs and Replacement of Previously Installed Signs

White MEO

Installation of new signs or replacement signs will be the responsibility of the Commissioners or their designee. Requests should generally be made to the Commissioner representing the precinct where the sign is to be located.

Maps:

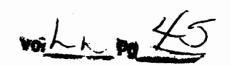

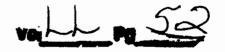

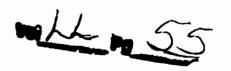
