Agenda item \#2-Line Item Transfers
County Clerk, Janice McDaniel, made a correction on the line item transfer that was approved during the last regular Court session. The amount approved was $\$ 1,279.77$. It was corrected to $\$ 1,277.00$.

Judge Leath moved to approve the line item transfers for the Treasurer and the County Clerk. Commissioner Clark seconded. All voted for. Motion carried. See attached copies.

Agenda item \#18-Busby Point Subdivision Residents
See attached copies of public participation forms.
Bobby Ener said on June $24^{\text {th }}$ Judge Mitchell ordered the road to be surveyed and the results brought back to him. That was four and one-half months ago. If the County Attorney nor the surveyor is going to get the job done then get another attorney and surveyor. They are asking the Court to get something done.

Paul Drennon said next Monday will be 5 months since Judge Mitchell ordered the survey. If Mr. Neal handles the County business the way he has handled this, the people of the County are not getting much from the money they are paying him.

Agenda item \#10-Discuss Changes with Retirement System for 2006 and agenda item \#11-Discuss \& Take Action on the 900 -hour Rule

Treasurer, Tricia Jacks, said the retirement system has made some changes in the 900 -hour rule. Before, a person could work for the County as a temporary employee and not have to pay into retirement as long as they did not work 900 hours or more. That has changed. Now, a temporary employee can not work specific days and hours on a continuing basis without paying into retirement. They can work and not pay into retirement if they work sporadically.

This was for information only. No action was taken by the Court.
The retirement system now allows for an employee that retires from the County to go back to work for the County with guidelines. They have to be off for 1 calendar month before they can go back to work. The Retirement System recommended that Counties also put the following rules into place:

1. Do not promise an employee that they can retire and come back into the same position.
2. Advertise the position and consider all applicants, not just the retiree.
3. Do not start retiree back at the same rate of pay they were making before retiring.
4. Consider making the length of time longer before the retiree can come back to work for the County.

Judge Leath said we will table agenda item \#11 to the next regular session of Commissioners' Court.

Agenda item \#13-Discuss \& Take Action on SB 6 for District Clerk Tanya Walker, District Clerk, was unable to attend because of having Jurors coming in this morning.

Judge Leath said the \$1,229.00 award money is predetermined. It goes for improvement of radio communications for the Sheriff's office. It is already approved and he just needs the Court to authorize him to sign it.

Commissioner Clark moved to authorize Judge Leath to sign this grant. Commissioner Warner seconded. All voted for. Motion carried.

Agenda item \#12-Discuss \& Take Action on Texas Disaster Relief Fund Grant

Judge Leath said this grant is to aid the unmet needs of hurricane victims in Sabine County. It should operate through an Unmet Needs Committee or an existing Donations Management Committee. There should

be a procedure in place for appeals to a higher authority. The grant amount is $\$ 17,890.00$. It can only be dispersed as follows:
