Judge Charles Watson called the meeting to order at 8:30am and Pastor Digmon led the Court in prayer.

Commissioner Jimmy McDaniel is not present in Court today as he was in an accident and is in the hospital.

AGENDA ITEM # 1 – General Business

Commissioner Fayne Warner moved to approve the minutes as written for the June 24, 2013 regular session of Court. Commissioner Doyle Dickerson seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 2 – Approve Reports.

Commissioner Fayne Warner moved to approve the reports submitted by the County Tax Assessor and the County Agri-Life Agent Kent Powell and Agent Thomas. Commissioner Tommy Clark seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 3 – Budget Amendments.

No budget amendments were submitted.

AGENDA ITEM # 4 – Line Item Transfers.

No Line Item Transfers were submitted.

AGENDA ITEM # 5 – Discuss with possible action to abandon a portion of Gandy Road in Pct. #4.

Commissioner Fayne Warner made a motion NOT to abandon or close any portion of Gandy Road. Commissioner Tommy Clark seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 6 – Discuss with possible action on 2012 Audit.

Terre McLemore from Halls, Johnson, McLemore, Redfield & Rodrigues, LLP presented to the Court the 2012 Audit Report and findings. Commissioner Doyle Dickerson made a motion to approve the Audit Report and findings as submitted. Commissioner Fayne Warner seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 7 – Discuss with possible action to advertise for bids on old Gradall at Pct. #1 Barn.

Commissioner Tommy Clark made a motion to advertise for bids for an old Gradall at Pct. #1 Barn. Listing and bids to be conducted through Rene' Bates Auctioneers, Inc. internet website and maintained by the County Auditor's office. Doyle Dickerson seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 8 – Discuss with possible action on County Clerk and District Clerk Records Preservation and Archive Fees.

Commissioner Doyle Dickerson made a motion to increase the County and District Clerk's Records Preservation and Archive Fees from \$5.00 to \$10.00. Commissioner Fayne Warner seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 9 – Discuss with possible action on timely payment of claims known as routine and reoccurring items.

County Treasurer, Tricia Jacks, submitted a letter to the Court naming routine and reoccurring claims to be paid in a timely manner. Commissioner Doyle Dickerson made a motion to approve timely payment to the entities listed in the letter. Commissioner Fayne Warner seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 10 – Discuss with possible action on request from JP Pct. #2 Jamie Brasher on blocked internet sites.

This item was withdrawn. No action was taken.

AGENDA ITEM # 11 – Discuss with possible action on road name change from Begelton to Loretta Lane.

Commissioner Fayne Warner made a motion to change the name on Begelton back to Loretta Lane due to misinformation of landowners previously presented to him. Commissioner Doyle Dickerson seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 12 – Discuss Special Commissioners' Court meeting on July 12th.

County Treasurer, Tricia Jacks, requested a Special Session of the Commissioners Court be held to approve invoices and pay accounts as she had not received very many items by mail due to the July 4th Holiday. Commissioner Fayne Warner made a motion to have a Special Session of the Commissioners Court on July 12, 2013 at 8:30 am. Commissioner Tommy Clark seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 13 – Discuss with possible action on telephone payment.

Commissioner Fayne Warner made a motion to pay the final installment due to Windstream on new phone system. Commissioner Doyle Dickerson seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 14 – Discuss with possible action on request to close Bradshaw Drive West in Pct. #3 by William Pumphrey.

Commissioner Doyle Dickerson made a motion to table this item until the next regular session of Commissioners Court on July 22, 2013. Commissioner Fayne Warner seconded the motion. All voted for and the motion carried.

AGENDA ITEM # 15 – Pay accounts and Salaries.

AGENDA ITEM # 16 – Public Comments.

County Treasurer, Tricia Jacks, stated that she is still trying to obtain updated health insurance rates, and she is working on the Preliminary Budget Report for 2014. She hopes to have all of this information available to the Court in the Special Session on July 12, 2013. She also stated that the mineral funds had been received and would be distributed as presented to the Commissioners.

County Historian, Weldon McDaniel stated that Sabine County had received a Distinguished County Award from the Texas Historical Commission.

County Auditor, JoAnna Johnson, stated that Budget Amendments would be necessary at a later date.

AGENDA ITEM #17 – Pursuant to the authority granted under Government Code, Chap. 551, the Commissioners' Court may convene a closed session to discuss any of the above agenda items. Immediately before any closed session, the specific section or sections of Government Code, Chap. 551 that Provide statutory authority will be announced.

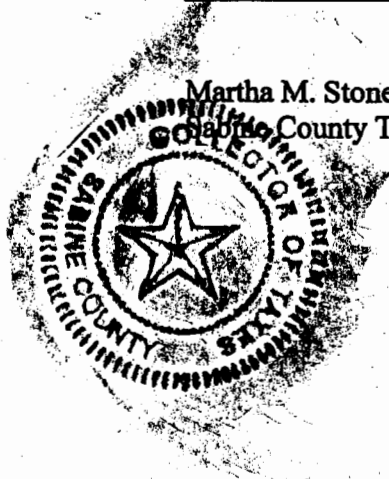

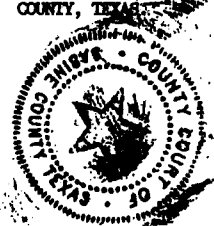
